Beaver Stump Grinding, Landscaping and Tree Cutting Now owned and operated by Clayton

Pulver By Lisa Dudley

After 16 years in business, Bob Hilbrandt has sold his Beaver Stump Grinding business to his grandson, Red Hook resident, Clayton Pulver.

In addition to stump grinding, Clayton Pulver, better known as CJ Pulver, has added landscaping and tree cutting to his business. "Landscaping is a natural extension to stump grinding because property needs to be repaired after removing stumps," he explains. "Sometimes, leveling land after stump removal requires excavator machinery." Fortunately, CJ is being mentored by Bob Hilbrandt's son, Glenn Hilbrandt, a well-known local excavator. CJ owns a Bandit 2550 grinder. "It's one of the best stump grinders

out there. It's got a window

that swings out before you start

grinding. It has a 3 foot plow on the front and is equipped with 6 wheels total -- 2 in the front and 2 on each side in the rear where I control the stump grinder." According to their website,

"the Bandit 2550 boasts the power necessary for heavy duty right-of-way clearing jobs, but remains versatile, lightweight and compact enough to tackle those hard-to-reach stumps hidden in the backyard." It runs on diesel and it can easily handle an 8' wide stump. Another feature of this powerful grinder is the size -- it will generally pass through any garden gates and loads easily onto CJ's trailer.

Spencertown Academy Arts Center, in collaboration with Freedom Quilting Bee Legacy, announces "Gee's Bend: The Next Generation" an exhibition of more than 30 quilts, along with talks, workshops, and demonstrations by the celebrated makers, from July 11 through August 3. This is the first time this generation of Gee's Bend quilters have traveled outside of their community in Alabama to present their works in such a major exhibition.

The exhibition will be held in the Spencertown Academy Galleries and the nearby Historical Austerlitz Church. There will be six participating quilters: Loretta Pettway Bennett, Stella Mae Pettway, Emma Mooney Pettway, Mooney Middleton. Polly Sharon Ann Williams, Andrea Pettway Williams. They are third and fourth generation Gee's Bend women who learned the art and techniques from their mothers, grandmothers, and great grandmothers. There will also be a special appearance by Willie Joe Pettway, son of legacy quilter Lola Pettway, who will exhibit and discuss his late mother's quilts.

"We are so honored to bring this exceptional exhibition to the Hudson Valley," says curator Lisa Bouchard Hoe. "The quilts are beautiful, and the women who make them are a joy to be around, exuding love and strength."

Gee's Bend, Alabama, is a small isolated community tucked into a bend of the Alabama River. Once a plantation, the slaves of Gee's Bend were given the last name of the owner Pettway, and many of the quilters carry that name today.



Beaver Stump Grinding is highly recommended by local arborists because CJ cleans up after himself (he can also take the material away if you want, or bury it in the stump hole) and many builders use Beaver Stump Grinding to clear the land of stumps in order to build new houses.

But, "after this tough winter, many trees didn't make it." Once a damaged tree is removed there remains the stump to deal with. Why should you remove a tree stump from your property? Because an old tree stump can be a bigger issue than just being in the way when you mow the lawn. A tree stump can begin to decay (much like a bad tooth) causing problems for the rest of your yard as it crumbles.

Many insects, such as termites, ants, and beetles, will invade and nest in an old tree stump. Once established, they can quickly spread to other trees and buildings, including the



wood framing in your home.

As everyone knows, termites can be very expensive -- so that's another good reason to remove your tree stumps as soon as possible. Other insects that live in tree stumps, like bees and wasps, can be harmful to you and your family if they swarm and sting. Roaches are also known to live in tree stumps and they are hard to get rid of if they move in.

And then there is the matter of mushroom-like fungus which grows on damp rotting tree stumps. If left to spread, fungus will attract gnats and flies. Fungus can also spread to other plants, causing damage to trees, vegetable gardens, and flowers.

Finally, a tree stump can be dangerous for the elderly, small children and clumsy people. Even if the tree is gone, the extensive root system still exists, not to mention a big hole. These roots can cause people to fall as well as causing problems for

your expensive lawn mower.

CJ acknowledges there are many ways to extract tree stumps including burning the stump, using chemicals, digging, drilling and dragging the stump with chains and a strong truck. But stump grinding is usually the safest and the fastest -- especially if there is road frontage involved, pipes, gas lines, and other possible hazards. CJ is happy to evaluate the situation and help you decide the best course of action for the care and protection of your home and family, while providing free estimates.

Also, to maintain maximum safety, CJ insists no children, pets, or homeowners be nearby when this powerful machine is working, due to the speed of the blades and the worry of flying wood chips.

He himself wears a special helmet and hard hat to protect his head and a hard mesh visor that protects his face and eyes as well as protecting him from any stinging insects that may have nested in a rotting tree stump. The helmet also contains earmuffs for sound protection which is another reason to keep pets and children inside while he works. His steel-toed boots are another feature of his safety uniform.

Originally, they made quilts from any available fabric, and used them to keep their families warm as their homes lacked electricity, water, and running heat. Somehow, despite the poverty and hard living conditions, an art form was born.

The quilts are characterized by bold improvisational designs that are highly expressive and very personal to the maker. Discovered by the art world

and made globally famous in the early 2000s, Gee's Bend quilts are today in the permanent collection of over 30 leading art museums around the world. The New York Times hailed Gee's Bend quilts as "some of the most miraculous works of Modern Art America has produced."

Plans for "Gee's Bend: The Next Generation" have been in the works for the past year and a half. Bouchard Hoe, a quilt collector, was astounded by the 2002 exhibition of Gee's





Rabbit Care

It is estimated that 1% of the U.S. population owns pet rabbits. While this is significantly less than households with dogs and cats (approximately 45% and 32%, respectively), it still accounts for millions of rabbits. Rabbits have different care requirements compared to dogs and cats, so it is important to be educated on their needs to properly care for them.

Housing - Rabbits can be housed in a wire caged enclosure or pen with good ventilation. This means no fish tanks or glass aquariums. The floor should be solid as wire flooring will cause wounds on their feet. The bedding should be soft but should not stick to their fur. CareFresh bedding or other recycled paper bedding is recommended. Do not use cedar or pine shavings as they have volatile oils. The minimum size of the enclosure is four times the length of the rabbit, and they should be able to stand upright on their hind legs. Rabbits should have supervised time outside of the cage for enrichment and exercise. If this is not possible, then a larger cage should be provided. Rabbits should have a hiding box as they are prey species and like to feel secure. They also should have a litter pan as they tend to urinate and defecate in the same place. Shredded newspaper or pellets should be used as litter – do not use kitty litter or shavings in the pan. Improper housing and bedding can lead to respiratory problems.

Feeding – The digestive system of a rabbit is different and more complex than cats and dogs. They need to eat far more frequently and therefore should have unlimited access to hay, preferably timothy hay. This is the most important part of a rabbit's diet. They can survive solely on hay, and it promotes

proper health of their teeth and digestive tract. Rabbits can also eat fresh leafy greens such as alfalfa sprouts, basil, beet greens, and romaine lettuce. Avoid highcalcium greens such as parsley and kale as these foods can lead to bladder stones. Start off with a small amount of vegetables to see how they do as some rabbits can develop soft stool with too many vegetables at once. Fruits and other treats should be limited to a very small amount, if at all. Avoid sugary fruit (i.e. bananas and grapes), seeds/nuts, bread, and cereal. Commercial rabbit pellets do exist but should not exceed 1/4 cup per day and should be timothy based (18% or more fiber). Avoid cereals or other mixes as these can lead to obesity and problems with their digestive tract.

Health – There are a few unique illnesses that a rabbit owner should be aware of. If they are not going to be bred, spaying is essential. The majority of female rabbits will develop reproductive cancer by the time they are four years old if they are not spayed. Oral care is also extremely important. Rabbits' teeth, unlike dogs and cats, continue to grow throughout their life. These teeth need to be checked regularly to make sure they are growing properly. If they are not, they will require a veterinarian to trim them to avoid pain and infection. Eating timothy hay is the best way to keep their teeth healthy, but some rabbits may still require occasional trims. Another area to monitor is their feet. A rabbit's foot has thick fur as opposed to a pad like a dog or cat, so they are more vulnerable to wounds. They also need their nails trimmed like most dogs and cats. Rabbits are also sensitive to digestive upset, which can be fatal if not detected and treated. Anything that stops a rabbit from eating for more than 12 hours is an emergency. Rabbits can also be prone to fleas and mites; talk to your veterinarian about preventative medication.

Owning a pet rabbit requires unique care, but it is often a very rewarding experience.

Hillsdale Town Board Approves Gift to **Maintain Loose-Gravel Road**

The Hillsdale Town Board on Tuesday approved a gift to cover the town's cost of maintaining a loose-gravel town road instead of having the road upgraded with the chip-sealing technique, as the town had planned.

The gift, of \$20,000 per year, comes from Honey Dog Farm LLC and applies to Appletree Lane, a rural road about a half mile in length. Honey Dog Farm describes itself as a "certified organic, eco-friendly farm dedicated to sustainable, local agriculture" that grows fruit and vegetables.

The gift will pay for the annual cost of grading, replacing gravel and other labor and materials connected maintaining a loose-gravel road.

"I'm glad that we were able to find a way for those who are passionate about loose-gravel roads to keep them without burdening Hillsdale taxpayers for years to come," Town Supervisor D. Michael Dvochak said.

Richard Briggs, a 30-year veteran of the Hillsdale Highway Department and Hillsdale's elected highway superintendent for the last two decades, added: "I've worked steadily over my terms to use CHIP (Consolidated Local Street and Highway Improvement Program) funding from New York State to eliminate the need for continual purchase of gravel and calcium. Without the funds from the state which provide long-term savings, there would be no way I could maintain our roads and keep our residents safe with our current tax base."

The Town Board voted to

create a Gift Committee in March to make recommendations to the Board about accepting such gifts. Criteria include public safety, approval from all residents on the road, and the amount offered in relation to the mileage of the road in question.

The Gift Committee, consisting of Dvorchak, Briggs and Town Clerk Robina Ward, voted unanimously to recommend the acceptance of the Honey Dog Farm gift after evaluating the proposal. The Town Board voted to formally accept the gift at its June meeting Tuesday.

The Gift Committee was created after residents of several loose-gravel roads opposed the town's plan to chip-seal them. They said chip-sealing would degrade the rural atmosphere of their roads.

Town officials say chip-sealed roads not only require much less taxpayer money to maintain but also are safer for emergency vehicles and residents. Moreover, the state CHIP program pays 100 percent of the town's cost of initial chip-sealing.


