Now there's a book: A Hudson Valley Reckoning: Discovering the Forgotten History of Slaveholding in My Dutch American Family is a combination of memoir, history, and many unanswered and unanswerable questions. New York Times bestselling author Jonathan Eig called it "an enthralling story and important work of history, impressively researched and beautifully told." Historian Myra Young Armstead said it will "read like a cannon blast for those unfamiliar with this difficult past."

important questions: what is the responsibility of White descendants of enslavers? How would Bruno define reparations? What do we need to know about American history? How did she never learn anything about slavery in New York when she was growing up? Why do these stories matter now more than ever? Staatsburgh State Historic Site is open for guided mansion tours Thursdays through Sundays, through October 27, and re-opens for self-guided holiday touring on November 29. To attend a mansion tour, please make advance reservations on www. Bookeo.com/StaatsburghSHS; admission is charged upon arrival. Visitors may also enjoy a picnic or stroll by the Hudson River, or a hike along the woodland trails in adjacent Mills Memorial State Park.

Staatsburgh State Historic Site and the Ogden Mills & Ruth Livingston Mills Memorial State Park are located on Old Post Road in Staatsburg, off Route 9 between Rhinebeck and Hyde Park. The historic site is one of 6 sites and 15 parks administered by the Taconic Region of New York State Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation. Learn How to Have Continual Blooms Throughout the Year in Your Garden

The Germantown Garden Club will hold its next meeting on Tuesday, October 15, 2024, at the Hover Room at the Germantown Library, 31 Palatine Park Rd., Germantown. The meeting begins at noon. 

designed to provide meaningful engagement through nature. It project began in 2023, when Debbie Martin, Activity Director for the Ghent Assisted Living Facility reached out to the community for donations to spruce up the facility's indoor gardens. 



Pets get Glaucoma, too

By: Julianne Porter, DVM Dogs and cats have more rods but less cones in their eyes compared to humans. As a result, they are better able to see in the dark and better at noticing even subtle movements, but they do not see colors as well as humans. Despite these differences, they are still at risk for similar diseases, such as glaucoma and cataracts. Glaucoma is when the pressure in the eye is elevated. This can cause pain and blindness. Glaucoma is typically separated into two categories: primary and secondary. Primary glaucoma is when an inherited or congenital anatomical problem affects how fluid drains from the eye, leading to a buildup of fluid, and therefore pressure. This often affects one eye at a time, but typically both eyes do become affected at some point. Secondary glaucoma is the consequence of another disease process. Some examples include damage to the eye, infections, tumors, and diseases that cause inflammation and bleeding in the body. Glaucoma occurs more frequently in dogs than in cats, but overall is not a common condition, affecting less than 1% of both species. Primary glaucoma occurs more often in dogs, whereas cats are more likely to have secondary glaucoma. Certain breeds of dogs and cats can be predisposed to primary glaucoma. Glaucoma in pets is typically very painful as the pressures in the eye can rapidly increase to values higher than in people.

As the pressure rises, the eye can physically stretch, causing extreme pain and blindness. This can happen rapidly or sometimes overtime. The eye can look relatively normal in mild and/ or early causes of glaucoma. If blindness does occur in just one eye, the pet can still act normally, making the diagnosis delayed. Some signs that can be noticed at home include squinting, bloodshot eye, cloudy bluish eye, dilated pupil, and bulging eye. Sometimes pets can rub their eyes or flinch when being petted. They can also display lethargy and inappetence because of the pain.

If glaucoma is suspected, the pressure in the eyes can be measured and compared to each other as well as the normal range for the species. Medications, similar to those used in human glaucoma, can be considered, and require consistent continuous treatment. It is important to note that humans should not take it upon themselves to use their own medications in their pets as it depends on the type/cause of glaucoma - some medications can actually be dangerous if used. Also, some medications are riskier depending on the species (dog vs. cat). Medications used are topical - applying directly to the eyes, but sometimes oral pain medications are also used to help provide some comfort.

Other diagnostics may be considered, and a referral to a veterinary ophthalmologist may be discussed, to determine any underlying conditions causing glaucoma. Ophthalmologists can also perform surgeries to alleviate glaucoma. Sometimes the eye does not respond to medications or surgeries, or these options are not feasible for some pets and their owners for various reasons. In these cases, removing the eye is considered often the eye is permanently nonvisual and extremely painful and removing the eye relieves the pet.

The prognosis typically depends on the type of glaucoma, but glaucoma often requires constant long term treatment to keep it under control.


On October 10, at the next ODVGC meeting, Amelia Legare, the owner of The O Zone & Flower Power at 148 Pitcher

Adolfas Mekas was a man for all seasons. By Frances Sandiford and Max Klahr


Born in Lithuania in 1925, Mekas had a passion for life and the imaginary that few people share. He was a film "poet", between Europe and America,





unique, introspective romance, written and directed by Adolfas Mekas. Adolfas is known for his visually striking and contrasting directing style, as well as his excellent use of subtle subliminal messaging. The film has two suitors pitted against each other for they are competing for the love of a beautiful girl. A classic scenario but told in an unusual way. The two suitors, Jack and Leo, have both known Vera, the love interest, for some time and both are eager to impress her and her family. Interestingly, the film follows a non-linear story and leaves it up to the viewer to piece together the plot. A lot of the story is told visually so the complete storyline might not be



fully understood and multiple viewings might be necessary.

Filmed in 1963 the movie was not shot in color. This may be discouraging to some, however, Mekas made sure to use this limitation to his advantage. Using his unique visual directing style, characters are dressed in intentionally visually contrasting outfits, so as to make them stand out from the background and from other characters. This style of directing is what originally helped Adolfas make his claim to fame in his early career. Although not a silent film, there is not much dialogue and much of the story is told visually, harkening back to old silent era films. The use of sound plays an important role in the story. Music specifically helps create atmosphere, mood, and feeling. Mekas' use of contrast delivers bold imagery that ads to the overall visual style.

Many scenes are stories within themselves and Adolfas uses flashbacks that serve as memories between the two suitors and their time with Vera. These flashbacks interrupt the main story in order to help develop Jack and Leo as characters and to give more context behind each of their individual relationship with Vera. These memories create individual perspectives for Jack and Leo. Imagination is also a large factor in the film as their memories are filed by their own individual imaginations which shows how the characters feel about each other and effectively creates story. Along with imagination comes dreams, which add an extra layer of insight, into each character's perspective. A romance with a psychological

A romance with a psychological twist, Hallelujah the Hills is

a perfect example of how not to judge books, or people, by their covers. Overall, I believe that this film has many thoughtprovoking ideas that will leave viewers fascinated and awestruck at the complex nuances interwoven within such a simple romantic story structure. I feel this movie will give viewers a new found sense of wonder and questioning the nature of their own unique perspectives on life.

God's Corner

In Search of One By Naomi Fata

One morning in late summer, as I jogged through the country roads, a woman called to me from the woods, asking if I had seen a little white dog. The dog had gone running the evening before and the owner was frantic with worry.

In Luke 15, the religious people were complaining about Jesus because He was spending time with sinners. Jesus responded by telling a story about a man who lost a sheep from his flock. Even though it had 99 more sheep, he was worried about the one which was lost. He left the flock in search of the one that was lost, and when he returned, his friends rejoiced.

This is a picture of the Father's heart. He is concerned about every single person who is lost. Despite having many followers and believers, He always searches for the lost.

When a pet or a child goes missing, we go out searching, calling and screaming their name. We are worried and concerned that they may be injured or in trouble. Did you know that God also knows your name? He calls you by name. When lost and afraid, sometimes we can get so busy trying to find our own way that we forget He is looking for us. Maybe you must stop long enough to hear Him calling your name.

Perhaps there is also fear of being found because you think that punishment will follow. But He is not that kind of Father. He is not angry that you have wondered, waiting to punish you as soon as He finds you.

When that dog owner found her dog, do you think there was punishment or tears of joy, a face full of slobbery kisses, and a furry embrace? How much greater is God's love for you! His love is perfect, far behind what we can even imagine. Perhaps you feel unworthy of being loved in such a way, but He doesn't expect us to earn this love. Instead, He reminds us in Romans 5:8 that even while we were still sinners; He showed His love by sending Christ to die for us.

If you have lost your way, if you have wandered, He is calling you!

faith: as it is written, the just shall live by faith" Romans 1:17). We are to live our Christian lives by faith. Faith in God's Word and faith in what the Lord Jesus Christ did for us. It is a gift of God's grace bestowed on the repentant sinner by faith. When a person is saved (a genuine Christian) then good works will follow. "For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus unto good works, which God hath before ordained that we should walk in them" (Ephesians 2:10). When there is genuine salvation in one's life then work will be evident in their life. "For as the body without the spirit is dead, so faith without works is dead also" (James 2:26). The Biblical phrase, "The just shall live by faith" is found in four places in the Bible (Habakkuk 2:4, Romans 1:17, Galatians 3:11, and Hebrews 10:38). The Believer is to

live their life by faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, and by relying on the presence and power of the Holy Spirit. We can't live the Christian life in our own strength or by our own efforts. We need to depend on the Lord. He will enable us to live victorious lives in Christ for the glory of God. "For we walk by faith, not by sight" (2 Corinthians 5:7).



3 cups cubed peeled butternut squash (1-inch pieces) 1 large potato, peeled and cut into 1-inch cubes (about 2 cups) 2 medium carrots, thinly sliced 2 cups vegetable broth /2 teaspoon plus 3/4 teaspoon salt, divided 3/4 teaspoon pepper, divided 2 pounds ground turkey 1 large onion, chopped 1 tablespoon olive oil 3/4 pound sliced fresh mushrooms 3 garlic cloves, minced 1/2 cup white wine 1 teaspoon dried thyme 1/4 cup all-purpose flour 2 cups frozen peas (about 8 ounces)

Directions

Preheat oven to 350°. Place first 4 ingredients in a large saucepan; bring to a boil. Reduce heat; simmer, covered, until vegetables are tender, 10-15 minutes. Drain vegetables, reserving broth. Mash vegetables until smooth, stirring in 1/2 teaspoon salt and 1/4 teaspoon pepper.

In 2 batches, cook turkey and onion in a Dutch oven over medium-high heat until turkey is no longer pink, 5-7 minutes, breaking turkey into crumbles. Remove from pan.

In same pan, heat oil over medium-high heat; saute mushrooms until tender, 7-9 minutes. Add garlic; cook and stir 1 minute. Add wine, thyme and the remaining salt and pepper; bring to a boil, stirring to remove browned bits from pan. Cook until liquid is evaporated. Stir in flour until blended; gradually stir in reserved broth. Bring to a boil; cook and stir until thickened. Stir in peas and turkey mixture; heat through.

Transfer to a greased 2-1/2-quart baking dish. Spread with mashed vegetables. Bake, uncovered, until filling is bubbly, 30-35 minutes. Let stand 10 minutes before serving.
