- Operationalize Restorative Practices within an MTSS framework









# Reimagining "Data" to Measure Restorative Practices for Impact



#### **CASEL Adult Social Emotional Learning Assessment**

This tool was designed for self-reflection. It should not be used to evaluate performance. Principals, administrators, SEL team members, and staff members can use it to assess their personal strengths and think about how they can model those strengths when interacting with others. (Approximately 15 minutes)

#### <u>Alignment of Initiatives - Interconnected Systems</u> Framework

Purpose of this tool is to (a) provide an overall picture of existing social emotional behavioral related initiatives or programs available to the larger community, (b) determine the effectiveness, relevance, and fidelity for each, (c) determine funding and resource allocation, and (d) determine areas of redundancy. Ideally, this process is led by the District Community Leadership Team with representation from both education and community stakeholders.
