### **Gospel Reading**

#### Matthew 6: 28-34 And Why do you Worry....

And why do you worry about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they neither toil nor spin, yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not clothed like one of these. But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which is alive today and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will God not much more clothe you—you of little faith? Therefore do not worry, saying, 'What will we eat?' or 'What will we drink?' or 'What will we wear?' For it is the Gentiles who strive for all these things; and indeed your heavenly Creator knows that you need all these things. But strive first for the kingdom of God and for God's righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well.

So do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will bring worries of its own. Today's trouble is enough for today. Let us pray:

(All) In darkness and in light In trouble and in joy help us Holy Spirit to trust in your love to serve your purpose to shine with your light to forgive with your grace to love with your kindness through Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen
