

## Education execs urge students to explore GenAl potential

Executives from Coursera and iPeople Inc. invited students to explore the potential of generative artificial intelligence (GenAI) or the type of AI that could generate content in response to the user's request, saying this has a high impact on various industries.

"In the Philippines, GenAI could potentially drive USD79 billion of productivity gain by 2030 if we start training and upskilling now," Karine Allouche, online course provider Coursera's global head of Enterprise, said during a small group discussion in Makati on Wednesday.

Globally, the areas mostly impacted by AI, she said, are sales, marketing, research and development, software engineering, as well as customer opera-

Allouche said that while the International

Monetary Fund (IMF) sees that 36 percent of jobs in the Philippines could either be displaced or eased by AI, people at Coursera believe that there is more opportunity than disruption in AI.

She also cited that based on a study, GenAI could add USD50 billion to Philippine businesses by

At Coursera, there is one enrollment in GenAI in every 20 minutes, Allouche said. In the same discussion, iPeople Inc. president Alfredo Ayala acknowledged that AI is both a threat and an opportunity.

iPeople Inc. is the Yuchengco-Ayala education partnership, whose schools include Mapua University, Mapua Malayan Colleges Laguna, Mapua Malayan Colleges Mindanao, Mapua Malayan Digital College, National Teachers College and University of Nueva Caceres.

"GenAI is impacting every human endeavor and career pathways," Ayala said.

In their schools, Ayala said students could have a personal AI career guidance counselor and an AI coach, guiding them on degrees or levels they should take.

There is an AI-enabled experience for all of their schools, he added.

Coursera is Ayala's partner in these new capabilities since 2019. (PNA)

respond to and manage suspected dengue patients.

"In Calabarzon, we have reactivated dengue fast lanes to promptly attend to patients showing symptoms of dengue. As of now, we have 33 dengue fast lanes across Calabarzon," Guadalupe said.

The Department of Health-Calabarzon also directed hospitals to set up hydration stations for dengue patients, citing the risk of dehydration due to dengue.

He added that the has recorded region 10,300 dengue cases from January to February 2025. Guadalupe said that

fast lanes to immediately the increase in cases elimination. When asked may be attributed to climate change, making the population of Aedes aegypti mosquitoes unpredictable compared to previous years.

"Dengue is no longer seasonal. There is no longer a single month without dengue cases, unlike in past years. Climate change has altered temperature and humidity patterns, making populations mosquito unpredictable," he said.

He also emphasized that local health offices actively have been reporting cases to ensure proper monitoring and decision-making dengue prevention and about the declaration of outbreaks, Guadalupe stated that while the Department of Health provides guidance, the final decision to declare a dengue outbreak rests with local officials, based on their assessment of public health risks at the local level.

Guadalupe urged the public to seek early consultation experiencing symptoms of dengue.

"If you experience symptoms, dengue immediately visit the nearest health facility for consultation. Do not wait for severe symptoms to develop."

Aside from its ongoing information campaign, the Department of Health-Calabarzon (DOH-4A) has also launched the "Alas Kwatro Kontra Mosquito" campaign. This whole-of-nation approach involves searching for and eliminating mosquito breeding sites every Monday at 4 p.m. to help reduce dengue cases.

Since last year, DOH-4A has been assisting local government units by providing interventions prepositioning supplies to ensure dengue prevention, control and management. (FC, PIA4A)


