# Cavite Set to Gain as Bataan Bridge Takes Shape



Cavite is poised to benefit from one of the country's biggest infrastructure projects as the Bataan Cavite Interlink Bridge slowly but steadily moves forward, offering a future link across Manila Bay that could reshape travel and trade in the province.

Once completed, the 32 kilometer four lane bridge will connect Naic, Cavite to Mariveles, Bataan, cutting travel time between Central and Southern Luzon from several hours to less

## Pag-IBIG keeps 3 percent loan rate as housing price caps rise

The government has approved higher price ceilings for socialized housing projects while the Pag-IBIG Fund continues to offer low interest housing loans under the Expanded Pambansang Pabahay para sa Pilipino or 4PH program.

In a statement released Tuesday, Pag-IBIG Fund said the updated price caps aim to reflect rising construction costs and help developers deliver safer and better quality homes without moving beyond the reach of Filipino workers.

The revised ceilings were issued through the implementing rules of a joint circular by the Department of

# Asian track tourney set March 25-30 at Tagaytay velodrome

Twelve nations have confirmed their participation in the 45th Asian Cycling Confederation (ACC) Track Championships scheduled from March 25 to 31 at the Tagaytay CT Velodrome in Cavite.

"It's been three decades since the country hosted the Asian track championships —1995 to be exact— at the then-Amoranto Velodrome in Quezon City," Philippine Olympic Committee (POC) president Abraham "Bambol" Tolentino said in a statement Thursday.

"With at least 12 nations confirming their attendance and more than 200 athletes competing as of today at the brand-new and International Cycling Union

(UCI)-standard velodrome, the POC, PhilCycling and Tagaytay City will be rolling out the red carpet as we aim for an excellent hosting of the event," he added.

Tolentino also serves as PhilCycling head.

Tagaytay City Mayor Aizack Brent Tolentino has assured the city's full support to the tournament, which features men and women sprint, keirin, one-kilometer time trial, team sprint, individual and team pursuit, points race, scratch, omnium, Madison and elimination race.

To be held simultaneously with the 45th Asian Cycling Confederation (ACC) Track Championships is the 14th

Asian Para Track Cycling Championships, which has competitions in the one-kilometer time trial, individual pursuit, sprint, elimination and scratch races in six events both for men and women.

Besides host Philippines, also competing are powerhouse Japan, South Korea, China, Malaysia, Thailand, Indonesia, Hong Kong, Chinese-Taipei, Kazahksan, Uzbekistan and Iran.

Japan won 16 of the 22 gold medals at stake last year. Host Malaysia got two golds while South Korea, China, Hong Kong and Uzbekistan had one each.

Tolentino is expecting more countries to send their



teams to the championships, which already surpassed the 10 nations that took part in last year's edition in Nilai, Malaysia. The registration deadline is set on Jan. 15.

Tolentino and Asian Cycling Confederation head

Dato' Amarjit Singh Gill led the inauguration of the velodrome in June last year.

Only 12 countries in Asia have velodromes, with Tagaytay City being recognized as the newest indoor and wood facility

that vies as a track cycling epicenter for the Southeast Asian region. The Amoranto track along Tomas Morato Avenue in Quezon City was demolished last year to give way to a football pitch. (PNA)

covered members settle long standing contribution obligations and regain good standing with the National Health Insurance Program.

In a statement, PhilHealth said the waiver applies only to accumulated interest and does not include unpaid premium contributions.

The policy is intended to ease the financial burden on those whose arrears grew largely because of compounded interest, while ensuring the continued delivery of health benefits

to members and employees. Under the program, PhilHealth will provide a one year settlement period starting from the effectivity of the circular. During this time, covered entities may pay their outstanding premium contributions. Employers who settle earlier within the given period may receive higher interest reductions, which may include partial or full waiver depending on the payment arrangement.

PhilHealth also clarified that detailed

guidelines for the employed sector will be released soon. Meanwhile, the implementing mechanics for the self employed sector are still being finalized and will be issued separately to ensure clear and orderly implementation.

As part of the safeguards, employers who will avail of the waiver are required to register their workers under the Yaman ng Kalusugan Program or YAKAP and ensure completion of the First Patient Encounter.

According to PhilHealth, this requirement supports the program's goal of not only recovering contributions but also linking workers and their families to accessible primary healthcare services.

PhilHealth encouraged all eligible employers and members to take advantage of this limited and one time opportunity.

The agency also advised the public to rely only on official PhilHealth communication channels for accurate updates on timelines and payment options, particularly for the self employed sector. Source PhilHealth Public Relations Office, PR No. 2026 01

Human Settlements and Urban Development and the Department of Economy Planning and Development.

DHSUD Secretary Jose Ramon Aliling said the move supports President Ferdinand R Marcos Jr.'s housing agenda of providing decent and affordable homes for working Filipinos.

"Our goal is to ensure that homes built under the program are safe durable and still affordable despite higher construction costs," Aliling said.

Under the new rules,

the maximum selling price for socialized house and lot units has been raised to PHP 844,440 for units measuring 24 to 26 square meters and PHP 950,000 for units with at least 27 square meters.

For socialized condominium projects, the ceiling now reaches up to PHP 1.8 million for buildings with more than five floors and unit sizes of 27 square meters and above. In Metro Manila and other highly urbanized cities, additional charges based on zonal value may apply, allowing some units to reach up to PHP 2

million. Pag IBIG Fund Chief Executive Officer Marilene Acosta assured members that affordable loan terms will remain in place despite the higher price caps.

"Our strong financial position allows us to keep subsidized loan rates under the Expanded 4PH program so more members can achieve homeownership," Acosta said.

Qualified borrowers may avail of housing loans at a subsidized interest rate of three percent for the first five years, which may be extended for another five

years for eligible members. This results in monthly payments of about PHP 4,005 for house and lot units priced up to PHP 950,000 and around PHP 8,432 for condominium units priced up to PHP 2 million.

Pag IBIG also said that through its Early Bird promotion, the first 30,000 qualified borrowers can enjoy the three percent interest rate for the first ten years of their loan.

The Fund added that it will continue working with housing developers and other stakeholders to speed up housing construction and loan processing under the Expanded 4PH program.

than one hour. For Cavite residents, officials say the project could mean easier access to new business hubs, tourism destinations, and regional markets.

As of early 2026, construction activities in Cavite are focused on land based components such as approach roads and ramps. Major marine works are still

awaiting contract awards, with bidding ongoing for several phases of the project. Funding for the bridge comes from international partners, including the Asian Development Bank and the Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank.

To help prevent delays, the government enacted the Accelerated Right of Way Act,

aimed at fast tracking land acquisition, particularly in host communities such as Naic. While progress has been slower than initially expected, authorities remain firm in pushing the project forward, with phased construction planned throughout 2026 and the coming years. Officials note that while motorists will

not feel immediate changes, the long term impact for Cavite could be significant. The bridge is expected to ease congestion in Metro Manila, open new economic opportunities, and position Cavite as a key gateway between Luzon regions.

Completion is still eyed between the late 2020s and early 2030s, but for Cavite, the bridge remains a major project to watch as development continues along its shores.

sustaining metropolitan region, creating new centers for commerce and employment beyond Metro Manila. Five emerging districts — Evo City, Maple Grove, Riverpark, Vermosa, and Villar City — are leading Cavite's urban evolution, combining business offices, residential towers,

and lifestyle facilities in high-density, mixed-use environments.

These primary centers are being reinforced by secondary developments including Arden Botanical Estate, Southmont, and Anyana, with future expansion planned at SM Carmona City, Sangley

Aerocity, and the POGO Island redevelopment site.

The coordinated growth strategy distributes development across the province, promoting balanced expansion and improved livability while attracting corporate investment and specialized industries. Urban planners

say the interconnected network will create a cohesive metropolitan system, with major business districts driving economic activity while smaller hubs provide resilience and accommodate residential growth. The transformation positions Cavite as an integrated urban region capable of functioning independently while maintaining ties to the capital.

Authority (PSA) reported that Asian countries remain the top destination, hosting 74.5 percent of OFWs. In particular, Saudi Arabia and the United Arab Emirates (UAE) are leading the region, accounting for 21.9 percent and 12.4 percent of the workforce, respectively.

The PSA also noted that the CALABARZON region contributes the largest share of workers at 20.5 percent, followed by Central Luzon (11.3 percent), and Western Visayas (9.5 percent).

Meanwhile, the Department of Migrant Workers (DMW) attributed this growth to improved enhanced programs

for OFWs ranging from employment to welfare services. Lawyer April Casabuena, Regional Director for DMW CALABARZON, underscored that the comprehensive support for OFWs and their families—including skills training, welfare, legal assistance, onsite and post-arrival support, and emergency response services for distressed OFWs—kept Filipinos highly competitive and in-demand to foreign employers. "The strong presence of CALABARZON Overseas Filipino Workers (OFWs) in key destination countries further highlights

the region's role in supplying a skilled, adaptable, and competitive workforce that effectively responds to evolving international labor market demands, thereby reinforcing the Philippines's position in the global labor landscape."

Noting the migrant workers' significant contributions to the country's economy, the DMW ensured that its services go beyond skills training and assistance to distressed OFWs.

"The Department's proactive coordination with foreign posts, host-country institutions, and local government

units has ensured timely intervention and effective case resolution, reinforcing trust in government-led migration governance," Casabuena said. More than employment opportunities, Casabuena underscored that the DMW's programs include reintegration initiatives for OFWs looking to permanently settle in the Philippines after years of working abroad.

## Bacoor wraps up ISO review, sets 2026 plans



BACOOR CITY — The City Government of Bacoor on January 13 completed the second day of its ISO Management Review at Revilla Hall, marking another step in strengthening efficient and quality public service.

Led by Mayor Strike B. Revilla, the review was organized by the Human Resources Development and Management Department under the leadership of Natividad Ludwig Ople. All city departments retained their ISO Certification, underscoring Bacoor's continued compliance with international management standards.

During the activity, department, unit, and assistant

heads presented their respective plans and priority programs for 2026. The presentations outlined clear goals and directions aimed at improving city operations and delivering better services to residents.

The review was guided by ISO consultants Engineer Maria Luisa Jalandoni and Mike Dave Bucher, with Mayor Revilla taking part in the discussions and assessments.

City officials said the ISO Management Review remains an important tool in evaluating systems and processes to ensure organized, efficient, and de kalidad public service for every Bacooreño.

## Calabarzon lines up key projects for inclusive growth

Government agencies in the Calabarzon region have lined up high-impact infrastructure and development projects aimed at driving economic growth and promoting inclusive development across the region.

According to the Department of Economy, Planning, and Development (DEPDev) Region IV-A, these priority initiatives will be discussed during the Regional Development Council's 3rd Regional-National Investment Programming (RNIP) Dialogue this year.

The RNIP Dialogue serves as an annual platform that integrates regional development priorities into national and sectoral investment decisions, ensuring that critical projects receive timely funding and institutional support. Among the high-impact projects identified are major road and diversion road developments intended to enhance regional mobility and connectivity. These include the Taal Lake Circumferential Road, Majayjay Diversion Road, Sto. Tomas-San Pablo City Diversion Road, and the Tagkawayan-Del Gallego Diversion Road.

Also in the pipeline are projects supporting trade, tourism, and logistics, particularly the development and improvement of key ports such as Panukulan Port, Atimonan Port, San Narciso



Port, Talisay Port, Alabat Port, and Jomalig Port.

In the health sector, the Department of Health (DOH) has proposed infrastructure enhancements, including the establishment of Bagong Urgent Care and Ambulatory Service (BUCAS) facilities, a Regional Blood Center, a Sub-National Reference Laboratory, Dialysis Centers, and Cancer Access Sites across Calabarzon.

Meanwhile, the Department of Agriculture (DA) Calabarzon is advancing climate-resilient initiatives, such as the installation of Solar-Powered Irrigation Systems, the construction of an Animal and Livestock Quarantine Facility, and the establishment of the Cavite Agricultural Trading Center. The Department of Information and Communications Technology

(DICT) is also pushing for digital transformation and environmental monitoring projects. These include the establishment of Digital Transformation Centers in Bacoor City, the expansion of the Government Network in Antipolo City, and the installation of Air and Water Quality Monitoring Stations.

Other proposed initiatives include infrastructure and capacity-building projects, such as lookout towers within protected areas and a two-storey Agricultural Training Center.

Highlighting the importance of national government support in realizing these initiatives, RDC Vice Chairperson and DEPDev Regional Office IV-A Director Carmel P. Matabang emphasized the need for

sustained collaboration with national agencies to ensure timely and adequate investments in the region's priority programs and projects.

She expressed optimism that Calabarzon will secure the necessary resources to advance its strategic initiatives and keep pace with the region's rapid growth.

"The confirmation of RNIP priority projects underscores RDC Calabarzon's commitment to advancing high-impact, inclusive, and future-ready development. Through sustained coordination and strategic planning, the Council is confident that Calabarzon will further strengthen its connectivity, improve community resilience, and achieve long-term economic growth," Matabang said. ## CALABARZON teachers clinch top spots in LEPT 2025

Aspiring teachers from the CALABARZON region swept the top rankings in the September 2025 Licensure Examination for Professional Teachers (LEPT).

Last December, the Professional Regulatory Commission (PRC) released the list of topnotchers and passers during the recent LEPT.

Meanwhile, the Commission of Higher Education (CHED) CALABARZON released a scaled-down list of topnotchers, highlighting takers who graduated from the region's Higher Education Institutions (HEIs).

Stephanie Alyssa M. Llandonez of the Philippine Normal University South Luzon ranked fifth among this year's takers with a score of 93.20 percent, while Sarrah Lynn N. Cedeño of the University of Perpetual Help System Laguna ranked eighth with a score of 92.60 percent among the takers of the LEPT Elementary Level.

Also included in the top examinees for the LEPT Secondary Level were Joseph Matthew Delmiguez of the University of the Philippines Los Baños (UPLB) and Exequiel Bagtidon of the Batangas State University (BatStateU) – Lipa Campus. Delmiguez and Bagtidon both ranked tenth in the country with a score of 93.00 percent.

Among the top performing schools was Batangas State University – Batangas City campus, which had 100 or more examinees and with at least 87 percent passing average.

The LEPT is a mandatory examination administered by the Professional Regulation Commission (PRC) for individuals aspiring to become professional teachers in the Philippines.

In a social media post, CHED CALABARZON congratulated the newly-licensed teachers.

"We celebrate this exceptional milestone with you and look forward to the impactful contributions you will make in the field of [Professional Teaching]."

The Licensure Examination for Professional Teachers is a nationwide test to qualify teachers aspiring to teach in the country.
