New school buildings end classroom shifting in Silang, Cavite

SILANG, Cavite (PIA) — Students in the Municipality of Silang, Cavite will no longer have to adopt class shifting schemes following the inauguration of new buildings in key local schools.

Last June 23, the Municipal Government led the simultaneous inauguration of school buildings across the municipality as part of its ongoing efforts to address classroom shortage.

Milano Garzon, school head of BLISS Elementary School noted that the newly opened classroom building will help end class shifting, a practice that has been adopted by several public schools in an effort to address the lack of teaching facilities. "Sa bagong school building, natuldukan na ang shifting classes." With its

right-of-way (ROW) issues, a lawmaker revealed on Sunday. Las Piñas Rep. Mark Anthony Santos said the delay stems from the failure to finalize a Right-of-Way Usage Agreement (Rowua) with

the Villar Group, which remains unsigned despite repeated directives from the President

for the Department of Transportation (DOTr) to address project bottlenecks.

Santos noted that despite Marcos’ directive to the Department of Transportation (DOTr)

to immediately resolve the bottlenecks affecting the project, the proposed Right-of-Way Usage Agreement (Rowua) with the Villar Group remains unsigned, continuing to delay implementation.

The LRTA disclosed that multiple technical meetings involving the DOTr, LRTA, Light Rail Manila Corporation (LRMC), and representatives of the Villar Group from September 2021 to June 2025 have failed to produce a signed agreement.

The LRMC, the project’s private c o n c e s s i o n a i r e , maintained that construction of Phase 2 cannot proceed until the government secures 100 percent of the required ROW. It assured that once the full right-of-way is turned over, construction can begin immediately and be completed within three to four years, with full project completion targeted by 2031. Earlier, Santos wrote

to the President urging immediate intervention to address the decades-long delay of the railway project.

The lawmaker stressed that accountability should be pursued if evidence shows that any party’s actions or inaction contributed to the prolonged delay.

The delay has affected Phase 2 of the P64.915-billion project, which includes the Las Piñas and Zapote stations.

The LRTA said that if the agreement is not finalized, the government may have to revert to the previously approved 2022 alignment, requiring another round of redesigns, feasibility studies, and technical assessments that would result in additional costs and further delays.

Malacañang, for its part, maintained that the government is not responsible for the delays in the implementation of the LRT-1 Cavite Extension Project.

additional classrooms, Garzon noted that classes can now end by one o’clock in the afternoon for Grades 1 and 2, while Grade 3 pupils will end their classes two o’clock in the afternoon. Older students, including Grades 4 through 6 will end their classes by three o’clock in the afternoon.

BLISS Elementary School currently serves 525 pupils from Kindergarten through Grade 6.

Teachers at Gen. Vito Belarmino Integrated National High School, Pulong Bunga Elementary

School, Brgy. Munting Ilog Elementary School, and Brgy. Balite II Elementary School, who also inaugurated their own six-classroom buildings also welcomed the additional infrastructure.

of Cavite on June 17. The outreach activity benefited a total of 658 patients through various medical and dental services aimed at improving access to basic healthcare in the community.

Records showed that 550 residents underwent medical consultations, while 47 availed of dental procedures. The mission also provided 59 fasting

blood sugar (FBS) tests and two electrocardiogram (ECG) procedures.

Medical consultations and ECG services were carried out by healthcare personnel from the General Emilio Aguinaldo Memorial Hospital (GEAMH), while dental consultations and tooth extractions were handled by the Rural Health Unit (RHU) of General Trias

City. Personnel from the Office of the Provincial Governor (OPG) assisted in conducting fasting blood sugar tests and facilitated the distribution of prescribed medicines to qualified beneficiaries.

The activity was attended by Fifth District Board Member Morit Sison along with barangay officials, highlighting the

continued collaboration between provincial and local officials in bringing essential healthcare services closer to communities.
