Quezon City, which declared a dengue outbreak on Saturday, is one of the nine affected areas.

The Commission on Elections (Comelec) on Monday denied that its website and social media pages were hacked.

Comelec Chairman George Erwin Garcia made the comment after a hacker group known as the "Philippine Cyber Mafia" claimed that it leaked several data from the poll body. It might be a worrying sign of a serious

DOH Offers Free Cancer Screening for Cavite Teachers

The Department of Health (DOH) on Friday provided free cervical and breast cancer screening to public school teachers of Angelo Loyola School Carmona in Cavite, in celebration of Valentine's Day.

A total of 150 female teachers have undergone visual inspection with acetic acid test, pap smear (which costs PHP2,000 to PHP4,000), and human papillomavirus (HPV) deoxyribonucleic acid testing (which costs PHP8,000 to PHP10,000). "Sa maagang screening, mas mapapababa

personality disorder if an individual keeps on mentioning death and killing at any given chance, said Senate Minority Leader Aquilino “Koko” Pimentel on Monday.

While he did not specifically pertain to anyone, Pimentel brought this matter up when he was asked to comment on former president Rodrigo Duterte’s joke about killing 15 senators to make way for his Senate candidates.

The Senate Impeachment Court has the

power to bar Vice President Sara Duterte from holding public office even if she eventually steps down from her post before or during the trial, according to a lawmaker. 1-Rider party-list Rep. Ramon Rodrigo Gutierrez pointed out that the impeachment has two purposes — to remove from office and to impose a penalty of “perpetual disqualification of holding a public office.”

“Camouflaging” or matching the attire of campaign rally participants has been a normal practice

among police personnel tasked to ensure public safety during such events, according to the Philippine National Police (PNP).

PNP Public Information Office chief Col. Randolph Tuaño’s statement came after the Davao City police clarified issues on the “unauthorized” circulation of a memorandum tasking its personnel to ensure the safety of President Ferdinand Marcos Jr. during a campaign rally in the region.

but our fisherfolk are among the most marginalized, and they deserve the government’s full support,” said Tolentino, as he led the turnover of fiberglass boats each in Naic, Tanza, Rosario, and Cavite City.

In partnership with the Bureau of Fisheries and Aquatic Resources (BFAR) under the Department of Agriculture (DA), the distribution of fiberglass boats seeks to help uplift the economic conditions of Cavite’s fishing communities. “Last year, when the massive oil spill from Bataan spread out to neighboring provinces, especially Cavite, their source of income was wiped out because of the ban on fishing and selling of fish and other marine products,” the senator recalled, in reference to the massive oil spill from the ill-fated MT Terranova, which sank in the waters off Limay, Bataan on July 25 due to bad weather.

“Today we are back to fulfill our pledge to assist

our fishing communities, and to help improve their livelihood,” he added.

To recall, it was Tolentino who filed Senate Resolution No. 1084, which prompted the Senate to investigate the oil spill’s impact on fishing communities and the coastal ecosystem. In August, Tolentino joined President Ferdinand “Bongbong” Marcos Jr. in providing financial assistance to thousands of Cavite fisherfolk. The senator himself led relief operations for the affected communities. Aside from the boats provided in the four local government units, Tolentino also facilitated the awarding of Sustainable Livelihood Program (SLP) assistance to fisherfolk organizations in Talisay, Batangas last February 5, in partnership with the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DWSD). A similar program initiated by the senator will benefit fisherfolk groups in Balayan, Batangas on Monday, February 10.

This year’s celebration also marks Carmona’s 168th founding anniversary and 2nd cityhood anniversary.

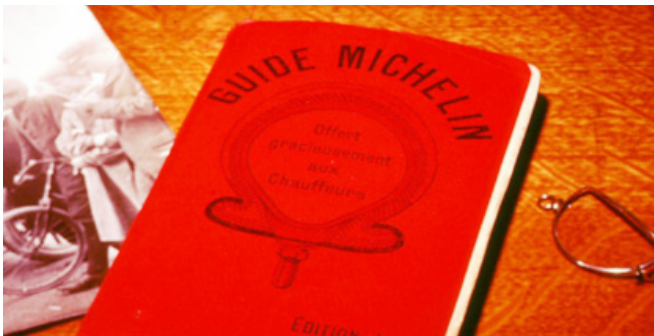

Cavite has the highest number of registered voters in Region 4A (Cavite, Laguna, Batangas, Rizal, and Quezon) with 2,460,981.

Calabarzon is the country’s top vote-rich region with 9,761,170 million voters. Former vice president

Leni Robredo and Sen. Risa Hontiveros will attend the event. Showbiz personalities led by Pangilinan’s wife, actress Sharon Cuneta, and online influencers are also expected to grace the rally.

ang panganib ng cancer dahil mas magiging maaga ang gamutan habang hindi pa ito malala (With early screening, the risk of cancer will be lower as early treatment starts),” Health Secretary Teodoro Herbosa said in a news release.

“Ang isang komunidad ay magiging malakas lang kung malakas ang mga kababaihan (A community will be strong if women in it are strong). The Philippines is a matriarchal society. We have to take care of women,” he added.

Cervical cancer ranks third among most common cancer types in the country.

Nonetheless, less than

1 percent seek medical consultation for its early detection and treatment and prevent death.

The DOH also provided clinical breast examination and breast ultrasound, HPV vaccination, human immunodeficiency virus screening and counseling, mental health services, and

family planning services such as distribution of oral contraceptive pills, depot medroxyprogesterone acetate, and contraceptive implants.

The DOH aims to reach and provide these services to 320,000 women aged 30 to 65 years in Calabarzon. (PNA)
