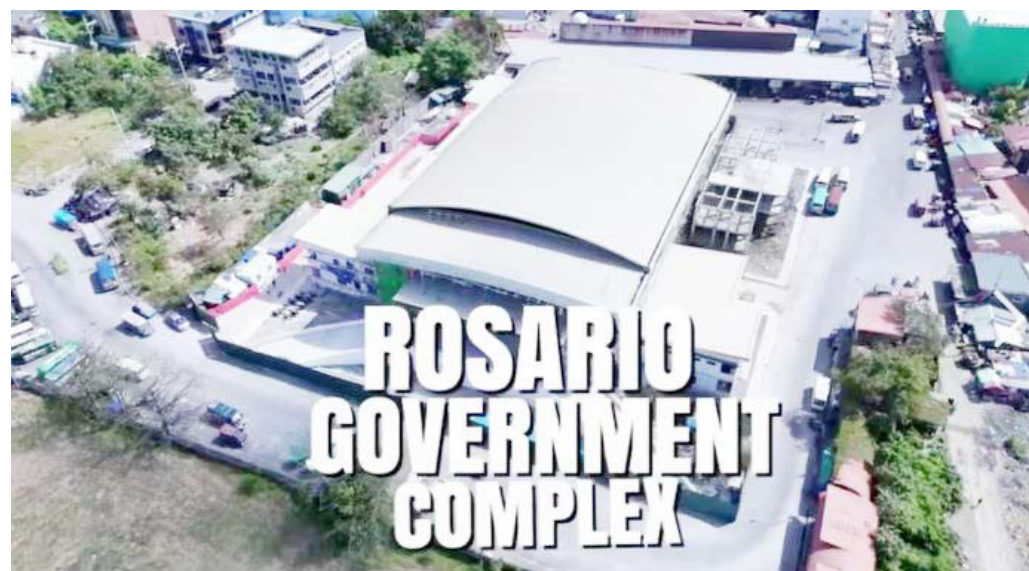

noodles, Thai soda, Mexican bites, American burgers, Hong Kong-style dishes, biryani, shawarma, and

chaofan. Beverage stalls serve milk tea, fruit shakes, buko juice, coffee, and slushy drinks, while dessert and snack options range from bao and siomai to fries and buko pizza. Among the popular stalls are Tako

Cloud, Muhan Roasted Chicken, Kuya Bojo's Ilocos Empanada and Unli Samgyup, Lazy Box PH, Silong More, Caphe Diem Coffee Shop, Joy Biryani, Shan Shan Lechon Horno, and Mang Sabaw Bacolod Authentic Cansi, among others. The park also features a photobooth, inflatable play

areas, a thrift and ukay-ukay section, and booths by local NGOs supporting women, solo parents, and persons with disabilities. Occasional live music adds to the park's relaxed, community-friendly atmosphere. City Avenue Food Park welcomes visitors seven nights a week from 4 p.m. to midnight.

Evaristo, along with Liga ng mga Barangay Vice President Randy Francisco, joined city officials and partners from PhilHealth, social welfare, health, and agricultural sectors to oversee the event.

The 20 Rice Program, the first of its kind in CALABARZON, allows eligible residents—including senior citizens, PWDs, public school

teachers, solo parents, fisherfolk, tricycle drivers, kasambahay, and job order workers—to buy rice at only 20 per kilo, with a monthly limit of 10 kilos per beneficiary. This aims to ease the cost of essential food for vulnerable groups.

Meanwhile, the YAKAP Program offers residents comprehensive healthcare, including consultations, prescriptions, 21 types of

medicines, 13 lab tests, and cancer screenings for breast, liver, lung, and colon cancers for those aged 49 and above.

Through partnerships with PhilHealth and 54 accredited medicine providers, the city now offers 242 types of medicines free of charge, strengthening community-based healthcare.

The city also

distributed free eyeglasses to over 500 residents and extended financial and medical assistance to 879 individuals, highlighting Bacoor's commitment to the welfare of its people.

Mayor Revilla thanked partner agencies and stakeholders for supporting the initiatives and reiterated his dedication to programs that improve residents' quality of life.

With these programs, Bacoor continues to set an example in responsive and compassionate public

Pilipino (4PH) Program, the Department of Human Settlements and Urban Development (DHSUD) said Thursday.

In a news release, DHSUD reported that Secretary Jose Ramon Aliling and Pag-IBIG Fund Chief Executive Officer Marilene Acosta joined Edgar Saavedra, chief executive officer of Megawide Construction Corporation, during the groundbreaking rites for the projects being developed by PH1 World Developers.

The two developments, located in Barangays Salitran and Paliparan, will consist of 26 multi-storey

condominium towers that can generate more than 7,000 housing units under the Expanded 4PH Program.

Earlier, Saavedra committed to deliver 100,000 socialized housing units under the Marcos administration, signaling the private sector's strengthened participation in the government's flagship housing initiative.

Aliling described Megawide's involvement as a strong vote of confidence in the Expanded 4PH and the reforms being implemented by the DHSUD.

He noted that Megawide, a Quadruple A-rated construction firm,

is among reputable private developers supporting the program aimed at addressing the country's housing backlog.

Once completed, the Cavite projects are expected to provide decent, safe and affordable homes to thousands of working-class

families. The Pag-IBIG Fund is supporting both developments, which will feature amenities such as open parks, playgrounds, entrance and exit gates, parking areas and a clubhouse.

Also present during the ceremony were DHSUD Senior Undersecretary Eduardo Robles Jr. and other key officials from DHSUD and Pag-IBIG Fund. (PNA)

PEA Tollway Corporation (PEATC), officials said Thursday.

PEATC President and Chief Executive Officer Delfin Torrecampo Jr. said the tollway operator may reduce toll rates once government ownership reaches 100 percent. "PEATC is the sole or the only government corporation operating a tollway in the Philippines.

So 'yung tanong po natin kanina, PEATC, through the national government, can subsidize the toll revenues because as of now, hindi muna naming pwedeng ipababa ang toll revenue because it is not yet a hundred percent owned by the government, meron pang joint venture partner (So to answer the question earlier, PEATC, through the national government, can subsidize toll revenues, but for now we cannot lower toll rates because the tollway is not yet 100 percent owned by the government as there is still a joint venture partner)," Torrecampo said.

"But once 100 percent owned na ito ng gobyerno, ng PEATC, for sure one of the target po ng aming chairman of the Philippine Reclamation Authority (PRA) is to lower the rate of the CAVITEX compared to other tollways para 'yung 100 pesos and toll rate per TRB, it can be lowered to let's say 80 pesos kung tayo na, ang gobyerno na ang may-ari nitong tollway (But once the government fully owns the tollway through PEATC, one of the targets of our chairman is to lower CAVITEX toll rates compared with other tollways—for example, a PHP100 toll rate approved by the Toll Regulatory Board could be reduced to around PHP80 if the government fully owns the tollway)," he added. Torrecampo said PEATC is earning around PHP3.6 billion annually from its existing tollway operations, equivalent to roughly PHP10 million in daily revenue from about 200,000 vehicles using the tollway daily. He added that the opening of the CAVITEX C5 Link Expressway Segment 3B is projected to generate about PHP300 million in additional annual revenue from an estimated 11,500 vehicles daily, raising the tollway's total projected yearly revenue to around PHP4 billion. Of the projected revenue, about PHP1 billion is expected to be remitted to the national government through value-added tax and corporate income tax.

CAVITEX is operated under a public-private partnership arrangement involving the PRA, through its subsidiary PEATC, representing the government's interest in the tollway, while Metro Pacific Tollways Corporation (MPTC), through Cavite Infrastructure Corp. (CIC), serves as the private concessionaire responsible for financing, construction, and development of the expressway.

Under this joint venture framework, the government and its private partner coordinate on tollway operations, expansion projects, and toll rate policies subject to the approval of the Toll Regulatory Board (TRB).

Meanwhile, officials said discussions are also ongoing with tollway partners and regulators on possible interventions and considerations that could benefit motorists, especially with fuel prices being expected to rise amid Middle East tensions.

Anthony Peter Crisologo, chairperson of PEATC and director of the PRA, said the possibility of a toll holiday similar to the one implemented when Segment 2 opened in July 2024 is under study.

"Because this is a joint venture, we have to discuss with our joint venture partners... So we're not sure yet but I think it's being discussed by TRB, PEA Tollway, and MPTC as well," Crisologo said.

PRA Assistant General Manager Joselito Gonzales said the government continues to work with regulators and private partners to ensure toll policies remain responsive to economic conditions.

"Kami po sa gobyerno ay kaisa ng Pangulo sa paghanap ng mga magiging solusyon para ma-address po itong mga pupuwedeng mangyari as a result nitong nangyayaring kaguluhan sa ibang bansa (The government is working with the President in finding solutions to address possible impacts arising from conflicts abroad)," Gonzales said.

He said the PRA, PEATC and private concessionaire Metro Pacific Tollways Corp. regularly hold project committee meetings with the TRB to discuss toll rate petitions and ensure decisions remain sensitive to prevailing economic conditions.

Gonzales added that the presence of a government entity in tollway operations helps temper possible toll rate increases and ensure that the interests of motorists are considered. (PNA)

Chiz Urges DOE to Prepare for Oil Price Surges

Senator Francis “Chiz” Escudero today called on the Department of Energy (DOE) to put in place a comprehensive contingency plan against potential surge in prices of petroleum products amid the escalating tension in the Middle East to protect consumers, drivers, and local industries heavily dependent on oil. Escudero warned that any further instability in the region could trigger significant disruptions in global supply that will have serious impact on the Philippine economy, which imports 99 percent of its oil requirements. “Hindi na bago sa atin ang ganitong krisis kaya dapat handa ang bansa bago pa man lumala ang sitwasyon,” Escudero said, as he urged the Department of Energy (DOE) to lay out clear, actionable measures that would ensure adequate supply, stabilize local markets, and protect consumers from sudden price spikes.

According to the senator, proactive planning is essential given the volatility of the global energy landscape. “Mahalaga na ito ay ating mapaghandaan nang maayos upang matiyak na ang ating mga kababayan ay may maasahang proteksyon kapag lumala ang kaguluhan sa Gitnang Silangan.” Last week, even before tensions erupted in the Middle East, local oil companies announced a fresh round of price hikes starting March 3, with diesel increasing by as much as PHP1.20 per liter. With renewed conflict in the region, many fear that pump prices will be adjusted significantly in the coming days. Escudero, however, appealed to local industry players and the broader private sector to cooperate with government efforts by exercising prudence, transparency, and social responsibility, as he noted that while businesses operate within market realities, extraordinary global conditions require a heightened sense of public duty to prevent undue burden on Filipino households and industries.

The senator further called on the Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) to be ready with calibrated price monitoring mechanisms and, if necessary, temporary price caps on essential goods should fuel driven inflation accelerate. “The government must be prepared to cushion the impact on consumers, especially low income families who are most affected by rising costs,” he stressed. At the same time, Escudero urged the national government to maintain close coordination with international partners and continuously assess risks to ensure timely interventions because any escalation could have immediate repercussions on shipping routes, supply chains, and global commodity prices.

He added that transparency and regular communication from government agencies such as the DOE and DTI will be crucial in maintaining public confidence. Clear advisories, updated assessments, and early warnings will help citizens and businesses plan accordingly and avoid panic driven behavior in the market. “We cannot control global events but we can control how ready we are to face them,” Escudero said.
