Cavite town mayor, 2 others face raps over Covid-19 fake news

MANILA - A town mayor in Cavite and two others are facing charges for allegedly spreading false information about the coronavirus disease 2019 (Covid-19), the Philippine National Police (PNP) said on Saturday.

In a press statement, PNP spokesperson Brig. Gen. Banac said the PNP Regional Anti-Cybercrime Unit (RACU) Region 4-A (Calabarzon) sued Noveleta Mayor Dino Reyes Chua for violation of Section 6f of Republic Act (RA) 11469 (Bayanihan to Heal As One Act), Article 154 of RA 10175 (Anti-Cybercrime Law), Section 9b of RA 11332 (Manda-

tory Reporting of Notifiable Diseases and Health Events of Public Health Concern Act), Presidential Proclamations 922 and 929 and Section 25b of RA 10173 (Data Privacy Act).

Citing reports of the RACU-4A, the charges against Chua stemmed from a complaint of the city government

The Social Security System (SSS) announced the temporary suspension of its Annual Confirmation of Pensioners Program (ACOP) until the end of April 2020 amid the threat of coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19).

"In this time of crisis, the importance of providing our pensioners with the SSS pension they can rely on and ensuring their health and safety overshadows the need for their timely compliance with

the ACOP requirement," SSS President and CEO Aurora C. Ignacio said.

Ignacio added that for humanitarian consideration, SSS would continue to release the monthly pensions of pensioners who failed to comply with the ACOP requirements since January 2020.

The ACOP ensures that SSS pensions are given to the rightful beneficiaries. It requires all survivor and to-

TRECE MARTIRES CITY, Cavite, Mar. 27 (PIA) -- Several cities and municipalities in the province have been placed on the extreme enhanced community quarantine (EECQ) due to reports of increasing number of coronavirus disease (COVID)-19 confirmed cases.

To effectively implement the EECQ, every household in a barangay was issued with only one home quarantine pass (HQP) with corresponding control number.

HQPs are non-transferable. It allows the passage of only one household member in or out of the barangay. Senior citizens considered as high risk and minors are not qualified for this authorization.

The HQPs use is limited for the purchase of essentials

like food in public markets, groceries, and supermarkets, buy medicines or prescription drugs from drugstores and pharmacies, transact with banks or other financial establishments, and to seek treatment in hospitals or medical and dental clinics.

Entry to these places is also warranted by the presentation of HQPs only within window hours specified to go out of the barangay premises.

EDITORIAL

Ang pagtitipid at pag-iipon na di pinahalagahan, ngayong lockdown, siya palang maaasahan

Ngayong panahong ito na Enhanced Community Quarantine sa buong bansa lahat ay nagkapantay-pantay. Walang mahirap, walang mayaman. Sa bawat mamayan ay kailangang sumunod. Hindi basta makalabas ng bahay. Hindi makapaghanapbuhay ang mga arawan ang kita, yung mga regular na "work from home", mga binigyan ng konsiderasyon na paswelduhin pa rin, partial ng kanilang mga 13th month pay, pinautang ng calamity loan, mga binigyan ng cash incentives at iba pa. Lahat ng ito, suma total na sa mga darating na araw ay mararamdaman rin ang epekto. Sa pagsapit ng Pasko ang dati nang kapos na 13th month pay na inadvance pa ang anu mang bahagi ay lalo pang-iindain di lamang ng mga empleyado kundi ng bawat miyembro ng pamilya. Makahulagpos lang tayo sa krisis na dulot ng ganap na lockdown/enhanced community quarantine o ano man gustong itawag dito, walang mintis na dadalhin na mga nagtamasa ng katakot takot na kaltas sa regular na sahod. Kabi-kabila, lalo na kung lahat ng inalok na kunwari incentive sa oras ng kagipitan ay sunod-sunod naman ibabawas kapag balik na sa normal. Sana kung natutong nagtipid at nag-iipon sa mga nagdaang taon o kaya "mula nang matutong kumita o humawak ng pera", anuman ang mangyari eh patuloy na makaka survive o makatatawid sa hirap na dinaranas. Duon sa mga natutong sumunod sa aral ng matatanda sa pagsisinop di lamang sa pera, gamit pati na sa pagkain, walang mahirap o tag kapos/hikahos na sitwasyon. Subalit sa mga nanghawak sa kasabihan, na "Life is short, so lets make the best of it!" ay walang kaduda duda, ramdam na ramdam at namnam na namnam ang mga ginawang pagpapasarap sa mga nagdaang panahon. Hindi lamang ito tutoo duon sa mga nagwaldas ng pera sa goodtime, madalas na paglililiwaliw, paglalakbay na di naman kumita, bisyo gaya ng sugal, labis na paglalasing, paninigarilyo at kung anu ano pa. Tiyak ngayon ay alam na nila kung ano ang impact ng kanilang mga ginawa. Sino ngayon ang nasa magandang kalalagayan? Yung mga sinasabihan ng "kuripot" "makunat pa sa belekoy na luma" at kung anu ano pang pamimintas at pagaglali. Di alam ng mga sa kanila ay bumabatikos na darating pala ang araw na mababaligtad ang mundo? Gugulong pala ang gulong ng kapalaran? Na sila na inuna ang sarap ay sa dakong huli naman ang hirap? Sinasabi ng mga pilosopo at tinatamaan na "tama na, hindi ito ang panahon ng paninisi at ng pangungunsensya". Yan ay tutoo, nangyari na nga lahat ng di inaasahan. Ngunit sana habang may panahon at kaya pa, sa pagbabalik nating lahat sa normal ay gumising na ang lahat ng kinaaukulan. Para ang kasabihang "huli man ay naihabol pa rin ang mga pagbabagong dapat gawin na gawin!" Mahigit nang 104 na milyon ang kabuuang populasyon ng bansang Pilipinas. Sa datos na ito, lumalabas na 80 porsiyento ang "walang mga savings o naiipon". Hindi kakayanin pa ng pambansa at lokal na mga pamahalasan at ibang mga ahensiya at organisasyong nakikipagtulungan na patuloy na tangkilikin ang napakalaking bilang ng mamamayan na sa panahon na walang kalamidad ay mga hayahay o nagpapahiyang lamang sa buhay. Tsssk.. tutoo ito na ang tamaan ay OK lang na magalit kung ang tunay na pagbabago naman ang kapalit! -DrDLR-

of Cavite, accusing him of spreading fake information on the alleged first Covid-19 case in the city. Using a Facebook account under the name Maggie Bernal, Chua allegedly shared false reports about a Covid-19-positive patient who died at the Cavite Medical Center early this month.

The same account also allegedly posted 10 photos of patients under investigation (PUIs) of Cavite City.

"The account also accused the local government

of Cavite City of not being transparent to the public in sharing the information. But the local government debunked the claims of the account and proved that the information is false based on the fact-checking of the Rural Health Unit of Cavite City," Banac said. Upon verification, Banac said the Covid-19 patient turned out to be a patient from Makati City. Further verification, Banac said, also disclosed that the "troll account" Maggie Bernal was origi-

nally named Angela Mae de Guzman and was created by Chua in 2010.

The photo posted on the alleged fake account was published on an online news website. Aside from Chua, also charged were Mario Bautigas, owner of the Latigo News TV; and Amor Virata, a video blogger, and reporter.

Under Article 154 of the Revised Penal Code, a person who causes the publication of any false news which may endanger the public order, or cause damage to the interest

or credit of the state may be punished.

Violators face imprisonment of one to six months and a fine ranging from PHP40,000 to PHP200,000. They could also be punished under the Cybercrime Prevention Act of 2012.

They can also be held liable for violating Presidential Decree No. 90, which declares Unlawful Rumor-Mongering and Spreading False Information, which may cause or tend to cause panic, divisive effects among the people, and undermine the stability of the government. (PNA)

tal disability pensioners in the Philippines and retiree, survivor, and total disability pensioners residing abroad to annually report at SSS offices on their birth month or of the deceased members'.

The SSS conducts home visits for pensioners who are

85 years old and residing in the Philippines. Home visits are also administered for pensioners who cannot personally report to SSS branches due to medical conditions such as total blindness and amputation of two or more extremities. Pensioners

abroad may also comply with the ACOP via Skype video conference. Under normal circumstances, failure to comply with the program leads to the suspension of the benefit. On the other hand, retirement pensioners who are 85 years old and below

and residing in the Philippines are no longer required to comply with the ACOP since October 2018. Also, SSS is temporarily suspending the applications for the Unified Multi-Purpose Identification (UMID) card since it involves direct contact.

Samantala, nagrereklamo rin ang mga supplier ng itlog, gatas pati na asukal na nagmumula sa iba't ibang mga lalawigan. Hindi raw tumutupad sa direktiba ni Police Lt. Gen. Guillermo Eleazar, Joint Task Force Shield COVID Commander na huwag pipigiling pumasok ang mga delivery truck na naglalaman ng mga kargamentong



para sa produksiyon ng pagkain. Nagaganap ito, ang samahan naman ng mga panadero ay nagpatutoo sa kanilang tinataya na mga isang buwan at kalahati na lamang ang itatagal ng mga asukal, itlog at gatas na kanilang ipinangitimpla sa pagmasa ng ginagawang tinapay. Ang mga paglalahad na ito ng PAFM at ng samahan ng mga panadero ay labis na ikinababaha ng mga consumers lalo na sa mga hirap ng bumili ng bigas at isa o dalawang piraso na lamang ng tinapay ang kinakain na sabi ng mga ito'y higit na matipid kaysa kumain sila ng kanin na nangangailangan pa ng ulam.

PRELUDE TO BAD SLEEP

Statement of Senator Risa Hontiveros on the President's Late-Night Address to the Nation re COVID-19

The President's late-night talk show last night was the prelude to a night of bad sleep, to the detriment of the Filipino people's regular sleeping hours and overall health. After almost 8 hours of delay, the public was presented with neither a sound assessment nor a concrete plan to address the novel coronavirus disease or COVID-19 crisis.

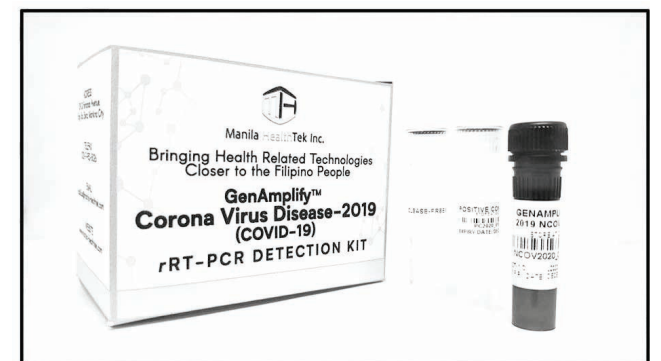
The President failed to assess how the Enhanced Community Quarantine has addressed our nation's fight to contain the spread of the novel coronavirus or COVID-19. The public has the right to know of the government's progress since the start of the Quarantine, a virtual lockdown.

The Quarantine is essential at this time to slow the spread of the novel coronavirus. But it cannot stand alone. For the lockdown to be effective, it should be backed up by intensified actions to increase the capacity of our health system, conduct mass testing, and protect our health workers at the frontlines. But the President's address last night was lacking in all those terms. The usual threats and incoherence do not a report make.

With all the funds and special powers at his disposal since last week's signing of the Bayanihan to Heal as One Act, the President should act with a sense of urgency. What are the steps being taken by the government to enhance our capacity for mass testing? How do we ensure that there are enough personal protective equipment [PPE] in every hospital? How do we get the cash assistance to the most vulnerable as soon as possible? So far, the President provided no clear answers to these questions. It is alarming.

Kailangan na ng taumbayan ang tulong na dapat sa kanila. Time is of the essence. For us to effectively defeat COVID-19, the government must act with a sense of urgency.

STATUS UPDATE ON LOCALLY-DEVELOPED COVID-19 TEST KITS



The field validation for the COVID-19 testing kits is ongoing and is expected to be finished by Wednesday, April 1.

The issuance of the Certificate of Product Registration (CPR) from the Food and Drug Administration Philippines (FDA) is expected on Friday, April 3. We have informed the FDA that requirements for CPR Certification will be submitted on Wednesday, April 1 at the latest. A total of 120,000 test kits will be manufactured by the The Manila HealthTek Inc. The company has also reported that the first batch of reagents arrived, which will enable them to start the manufacturing process. From April 4 to 25, there will be a field implementation for the 26,000 testing kits funded under the Department of Science and Technology (DOST) and the University of the Philippines-National Institutes of Health (UP-NIH) Project.

The DOST will prioritize production of 26,000 test kits for field implementation and distribution to the Philippine General Hospital, Makati Medical Center, The Medical City, Vicente Sotto Memorial Medical Center, Southern Philippines Medical Center, and Baguio General Hospital.

The remaining 94,000 testing kits will be sold commercially by Manila HealthTek at around P1,300 per kit which is cheaper than the units currently being used in hospitals which cost about P8,000. The Manila HealthTek said they have enough orders from the private sector who intend to donate them in turn to the Department of Health (Philippines) and hospitals.

PhilHealth To All Health Workers: We've Got Your Back!

...and all other Covid 19 patients as well



The Philippine Health Insurance Corporation or PhilHealth, in line with the desire of President Rodrigo Roa Duterte to protect the welfare and uphold the morale of all health workers both in public and private health facilities, wishes to announce that it will shoulder all medical expenses of all health workers should they fall ill during the period of the Covid 19 pandemic.

This assurance is made in light of the recent Law passed by Congress and signed by the President known as the Bayanihan to Heal As One Act or R. A. 11469.

Health care workers shall include those volunteers who have been asked to augment or reinforce the health workforce and those non-medical personnel necessary for the operation of a health facility like janitors, security guards and maintenance personnel.

PhilHealth reiterates that it is in the midst of releasing P30 billion worth of financial assistance to health facilities through its Interim Reimbursement Mechanism (IRM) to help hospitals respond to the Covid 19 threat. This will include even those hospitals and clinics with existing issues or under sanctions with the national health insurer. Hospitals wishing to use this facility are advised to contact the PhilHealth personnel assigned to their area and accomplish a memorandum of agreement reflecting the amount applied for. This procedure should be completed in not more than five working days.

As of March 25, 2020 PhilHealth has paid out a total of P 1.617 billion under the IRM program. Likewise, for the month of March 2020 it has paid out P 6.856 billion as part of its regular benefits payment and P 2.96 billion under its accelerated Return To Hospital (RTH) program.

PhilHealth stands solidly behind all health workers and all other front liners leading the fight against the Covid 19 pandemic.

Cavite mayor tests positive for COVID-19

The number of people infected with the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) has gone up to 70, while at least eight people had died of it in Calabarzon (Cavite, Laguna, Batangas, Rizal and Quezon), the Department of Health (DOH) said.

Among those infected with the fast-spreading disease is Junio Dualan, mayor of Naic, Cavite.

Dualan, in a Facebook post, said he is "in good condition" but on a strict self-quarantine. Dualan said he was tested last Mar.18.

In Cavite, 14 others also tested positive for the virus, five of them traced to Bacoor City (1 dead). Aside from Dualan, another Naic resident was also infected. Two cases were recorded in Dasmariñas

City, and one each in Imus City (patient recovered), Gen. Trias City and in the towns of Silang, Tanza, and Rosario.

Authorities are still determining the residence of one more Cavite patient.

DOH records as of 5 p.m. on Tuesday, showed new cases recorded in Rizal, bringing the province's total number of infection to 28.

Cainta town has the highest number of cases at 14 (3 dead, 1 recovered); followed by Antipolo City with 9; Taytay

with 3 (1 dead); and one case each in San Mateo and Rodriguez.

In Laguna, 11 people tested positive. Seven (1 dead) were traced to Sta. Rosa City, while one in the adjacent Cabuyao City (patient also died). Two persons in Biñan City and one in Calamba City tested positive.

In Batangas, the number rose to 13, six of which in Batangas City (1 dead, 1 recovered). Two cases were recorded in Nasugbu and one each in the cities of Lipa, Tanauan, Sto. Tomas, and Lemery. Health authorities were still determining the residence of another Batangas patient.

In Quezon, two people were infected in Lucena City and one in Sariaya town.

Boost senior citizen's health amid COVID-19 outbreak, Hontiveros urges

As cases of the 2019 novel coronavirus (COVID-19) rise across the country, those most vulnerable to getting infected - and even dying from the disease - are the country's elderly population.

That is why communities should take more steps to boost the health of senior citizens and help protect them from the COVID-19 outbreak, according to Senator Risa Hontiveros.

"Our senior citizens need to take extra care during this outbreak, just like pregnant women and children, or those with existing medical conditions like hypertension, diabetes and asthma. Let us not forget them in this time

of crisis," she said. Hontiveros said that following government protocols, senior citizens should, as much as possible, stay at home during the Enhanced Community Quarantine (ECQ) to minimize their potential exposure to COVID-19.

Likewise, she said, families should also comply with guidelines by health experts on how to take care of the elderly amid the outbreak. Foremost among these "tips,"



Hontiveros noted, is ensuring that older family members continue to take their prescribed medication, and that they eat nutritious meals

which follow their prescribed diet, if any. Despite the quarantine, Hontiveros said that families should make sure that their elderly loved ones get ample sunlight for "Vitamin D," which experts say can improve resistance against diseases. She added that the entire house should be kept clean, and proper

disinfection procedures must be followed whenever any member of the household goes out for groceries or errands.

Families should also not forget to talk with their older family members, and address their mental health needs, such as anxieties or fears in relation to the crisis. "We have to make our beloved grandparents feel that we are here for them amid these trying times," she said. Hontiveros then reminded poor families or those whose income have been severely affected by the ongoing quarantine to avail of cash assistance programs under the expanded Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program to be implemented by local offices of the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), so that they will be able to buy food, medicine and other basic necessities.

The emergency cash assistance program was made possible by an amendment introduced by Hontiveros to the "Bayanihan to Heal as One Act" or Republic Act 11469. The senator also encouraged everyone to participate in "Protect Lolo't Lola" campaign, a nationwide campaign she is spearheading to help better protect the health of elderly Filipinos. The campaign focuses on sending "immunopacks" to elderly Filipinos, especially those living in poor communities and homes for the elderly. Each immunopack, Hontiveros explained, contains vitamins, milk, canned goods, a facemask, rice and other basic necessities. "By providing their basic needs, we provide much needed protection to our senior citizens, and help keep the threat of COVID-19 as far away as possible," she said.
