# OVP assures Libreng Sakay aid to commuters amid 3-day transport strike

The Office of the Vice President (OVP) on Tuesday assured aid to commuters who will be affected by a planned three-day nationwide transport strike transport groups Manibela and Piston starting Thursday through its Libreng Sakay (free ride) program.

"The Office of the Vice President (OVP) is prepared to augment its 'Libreng Sakay' buses to commuters that will be affected by the three-day nationwide transport strike," the OVP said in a statement.

The Libreng Sakay will be launched at the Parañaque Integrated Exchange Terminal (PITX)-Naic route, in addition to 11 existing bus routes in Metro Manila, Cebu, Bacolod, and Davao.

"The new route will cater to passengers starting from Naic and seven other nearby towns in the province of Cavite all the way to the central terminal in Parañaque City," the OVP added.

To date, there are four OVP libreng sakay buses dispatched in the National Capital Region (NCR) for Quiapo to Commonwealth and EDSA Carousel: PITX to Monumento route, and vice versa; with one bus each for Cebu, Bacolod, and Davao.

For Cebu, existing routes include IT Park to SM Seaside, Brgy. Mepza to Brgy. Opon in Lapu-Lapu City, and Jagobiao

## BFAR: Fish, shells from << P1

The clarification was issued amid the call of fishers' group Pambansang Lakas ng Kilusang Mamamalakaya ng Pilipinas (Pamalakaya) to lift the fishing ban imposed in the eight coastal municipalities of Cavite, saying these were not affected by the oil spill.

In response, BFAR said the "no catch and no-sell zone for all shellfish in the coastal areas of the province of Cavite" based on Executive Order No. 38 issued on July 31 is still in effect.

The BFAR explained that fish samples are regularly collected and analyzed for traces of oil and grease and the presence of harmful contaminants

called polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons (PAH) since the sinking of MTKR Terranova and MTKR Jason Bradley on July 25 and July 27, respectively, and the grounding of the MV Mirola 1 on July 31 in the waters off Bataan.

"These tests are important to ensure that fish caught in the potentially affected areas are free from contamination and safe for public consumption," the agency added.

Moreover, all fishing activities within the four-kilometer radius of the location of MTKR Terranova in Bataan, particularly Limay, and Barangay

Cabcaben in Mariveles remained prohibited, based on Executive Order 32 issued on Aug. 1

Meanwhile, shellfish from the coastal waters off Bataan, Bulacan and Pampanga in Central Luzon, as well as Navotas, Manila, Parañaque and Las Piñas in the National Capital Region are free from oil and grease contamination and are fit for human consumption based on analysis from samples submitted between July 29 and Aug. 12, the BFAR added.

Moreover, sensory evaluation of fish samples from Batangas, particularly

in Nasugbu, Lian, and Calatagan, conducted on Aug. 9, showed that all samples were negative for traces of oil and grease.

The BFAR said the agency will maintain fish sampling and conduct a sensory evaluation to determine the presence of oil and grease in potentially affected areas and ensure the safety of the consuming public.

The agency encouraged fisherfolk and the public to remain calm and monitor the situation through updates issued by relevant authorities. (PNA)

# DA assures food safety as it launches the Rice for All program

By Stephanie Sevellano

The Department of Agriculture (DA) on Thursday assured food safety measures as it launched the Rice for All program, or the sale of cheaper rice for the general public, in four Kadiwa sites in Metro Manila.

Under the program, mixed local and imported commercial well-milled rice will be sold at PHP45 per kilogram at the DA's initial sites in the Food Terminal Inc. in Taguig

City; Bureau of Plant Industry (BPI) in Manila; Pantao Fish-erfolks Consumer Cooperative (PFCC) in Potrero, Malabon; and Llano Road in Calocan.

Its rollout comes alongside the large-scale trial of the DA's P29 program or the sale of the National Food Authority (NFA)'s aging but good quality rice at PHP29/kg to the vulnerable sector, including members of the Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program (4Ps), senior citizens, solo parents, and persons with disabilities (PWDs).

benta sa (Besides the tests of the NFA, the BPI also conducts these procedures to ensure the food safety of our products in) Kadiwa," DA Assistant Secretary Arnel de Mesa said in an ambush interview.

He said teams are being deployed in participating Kadiwa sites to eliminate risks of "pesticide residue, chemical contamination, and microbiological contaminants" on its rice supply.

For the Rice for All program, De Mesa said rice is sourced from cooperatives and associations (FCAs), private traders, and importers.

Its volume, however, varies depending on the demand and supply availability per site, he said.

For the Kadiwa site in BPI, Malate, Manila alone, at least 10 tons arrived for the first day of the Rice for All program.

To avoid abuse, the DA has set a 25-kg daily purchase limit per buyer for the Rice for all; and a 10-kg monthly purchase limit in 5-kilo increments for P29.

DA Assistant Secretary Genevieve Velicaria-Guevarra, meanwhile, mentioned the finalization of P29 booklets for a more organized operation.

"Iyong booklet po ay aming pinapa-approve. Ito ay nag-undo pa ng revisions pero (The booklets are still subject to approval. It currently undergoes revisions but) definitely in the coming weeks, iro-rollout natin iyong ating (we will roll out our) booklets this August," she said.

At present, P29 beneficiaries are required to present valid IDs and list their names on Kadiwa sites. De Mesa said these are all part of the DA's efforts to provide affordable and accessible rice and other agricultural commodities to Filipinos. "Iyon ang konsepto ng Kadiwa na nababawasan iyong layers ng middlemen, traders, kaya iyong porsiyento na iyon, iyong gap na iyon, nawawala. Definitely, mas lower iyong price dito sa Kadiwa (The concept of Kadiwa is to reduce the layers of middlemen, traders. That's why that percentage, that gap, is eliminated. Definitely prices are lower here in Kadiwa)," he added citing other products like vegetables and fish. During the post-State of the Nation Address (SONA) forum, Agriculture Secretary Francisco Tiu Laurel Jr. said they are planning to establish "permanent" Kadiwa sites in 1,500 municipalities nationwide.

De Mesa, meanwhile, assured further expansion and sustainability of both Rice for All and P29 programs in isolated areas, in line with the directives of President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr.

"Iyong sa mga kabundukan (For those in the mountains), we are coordinating with the different local government units so that they will identify sino talaga iyong magandang mabenepisyuhan (who are best to benefit from these)," he said. "And gusto natin sa buong administrasyon ay maisakatuparan itong dalawang programa na ito (What we in the whole administration want is to implement these two programs)," De Mesa added. As of Thursday, the P29 program operations have also started rolling in Antipolo City and Santa Rosa Laguna.

Guevarra disclosed target areas for expansion including Cebu and Maguindanao, with schedules earlier eyed in August to September.

# PNPA groundbreaks new grandstand named after Marcos Sr.

CAMP CASTAÑEDA, SILANG, Cavite (PIA) – Senator Imee Marcos personally led on Monday, July 29 the ground-breaking and laying of time capsule for the proposed Philippine National Police Academy (PNPA) parade ground named after former President Ferdinand E. Marcos Sr.

The construction of President Ferdinand Edralin Marcos Sr. Field is dedicated and named to the former president who is considered and acknowledged as the 'Father of PNPA'.

The grounds will be equipped with a 2-story grandstand with the size of 30M x 160M. The ground floor will serve as a holding and receiving area with a VIP room and conference rooms.

While the second floor will serve as the stage with a VIP room, an audio-visual room, an office, and bleachers which can accommodate approximately 1, 200 seats. On the other hand, the parade ground will also have a LED wall similar to those located in its old parade ground and an open field with a total area of 30,591 square meters.

Senator Marcos likewise witnessed the successful Incorporation Rites of the PNPA Sandirangan (SANDIgan ng Bayan paRA sa Lupang SinilaNGAN) Class of 2028 wherein the Senator is the guest of honor and speaker.

In her message to the 332 new cadets, the Senator unveiled her proposed Senate Bill 409 for the modernization of the Philippine National Police, as well as another bill that would provide free legal assistance to police, soldiers, BJMP personnel, and Coast Guard to face lawsuits or complaints in court

During the media interview, Senator Marcos pushes for the PNP modernization program because she wants to expand it, adding that "our enemies are not ordinary criminals anymore but it seems like corporations or gigantic syndicates that are very wide and cover the towns



and the whole world as well." The incorporation rites is one of the significant activities of the Cadet Corps wherein it will exhibit the union of Plebes (Fourth Class Cadets) to their Upper-class Corps after surpassing the 45-day "Breaking Period" or New Cadet Orientation Course (NCOC). Villanueva expressed optimism for continued growth throughout the year despite a slight dip in sales in the first quarter, driven by new product formats and sustained demand for legacy products like Knorr Sinigang Mix, which commands a 70-percent market share in its category.



"Growth is very good even in an inflationary period. Knorr grew significantly [and that] comes from the consistency of the dishes prepared," she said, adding that the company has been consistently hitting more than 10-percent growth in the last three years.

Across all categories and product lines, Unilever commands a strong presence with over 50-percent market share.

Villanueva did not disclose specific details about the expansion, but said several new products would be manufactured locally, while other products would be brought in from Unilever global. She also hinted at the possibility of more fortified products in the future.

The LRT-1 Dr. Santos Station, the end terminal for Phase 1, will serve as a transit hub. Passengers will have seamless access to various modes of transportation through the intermodal facility. (PNA)

## Bill on Meralco's franchise renewal hurdles House panel

The bill renewing the franchise of Manila Electric Co. (Meralco) for another 25 years has hurdled committee level at the House of Representatives.

According to a news release on Tuesday, the House Committee on Legislative Franchises approved the consolidation of House Bills (HBs) 9793, 9813 and 10317, all of which propose the renewal of Meralco's legislative franchise, which is set to expire in 2028.

Albay Rep. Joey Salceda, author of HB 9793, said Meralco's franchise renewal is "possibly the single most important private bill" for industrial policy in this country.

He highlighted that the power distribution giant's track record has assisted greatly in the development of the country's key economic growth areas.

"Meralco services an area responsible for about half the country's entire GDP (gross domestic product) and about 26 percent of the population. Meralco is an exemplar of how service reliability can create economic growth and development," Salceda said in a statement.

To support economic development and improve people's quality of life, Salceda said, Meralco invested more than PHP220 billion from 2003 to 2022 for new connections, asset renewals and load growth projects to serve more customers and their expanding electricity needs, while continuing to support government projects.

In compliance with a decision by the Energy Regulatory Commission (ERC) directing the refund of distribution-related charges, he said Meralco completed a PHP48 billion refund to customers.

"Meralco has also fully complied with the ERC's rules and issuances. Some PHP48.3 billion in consumer refunds have also been delivered in full," he added.

Salceda said he expects the bill to "sail smoothly" in the House plenary.

"The role of the franchise review process in Congress is to see whether a grantee has complied with its mandates. In this regard, there can be little question. Meralco has fulfilled its end of the current franchise law," he said.

Under its existing franchise, Meralco is authorized to construct, operate and maintain a distribution system for the conveyance of electric power to consumers in the cities and municipalities and barangays of Metro Manila, Cavite, Rizal, Batangas, Laguna, Quezon and Pampanga. (PNA)
