41 Bicolano third year college students qualify as DOST – JLSS Scholars

The successful examinees include forty-one (41) Bicolanos who all took the scholarship examination conducted on 02 June 2019 at designated testing centers nationwide.

DOST-JLSS is an undergraduate scholarship program aimed to provide scholarships that will finance the education of talented and deserving students in their third year of college, as they pursue STEM degree programs, and ensure a steady and adequate supply of qualified human resources who can steer the country towards national progress. the country's S&T education by fast-tracking graduates in STEM who shall teach in secondary schools throughout the country.

2. RA No. 7687 ("S&T Scholarship Program of 1994")

- provides scholarships to talented and deserving students whose families' socio-economic status does not exceed the set cut-off values of certain indicators. Qualifiers must pursue priority fields of study in the basic sciences, engineering, other applied sciences, and science and mathematics teaching.

3. RA No. 2067 (Merit Scholarship)

- awarded to students with high aptitude in science and mathematics and are willing to pursue careers in the fields of S&T.

The forty-one (41) Bi-

colano JLSS qualifiers will have their Scholarship Orientation and Signing of Scholarship Agreement on 31 January 2020 at the DOST V Conference Room, Rawis, Legazpi City in two (2) batches: 8:30 - 11:30 a.m. and 2:00 - 5:00 p.m. (Contact Person: Ms. Ruby A. Asuncion, SRS II/Scholarship Coordinator, DOST V at telephone nos. (052) 742-0911 and cp. nos. 0949-371-6820/ 0927-659-4844). Most of the student-qualifiers are enrolled in state universities and colleges (35), community colleges (3) and private higher education institutions (3), and taking up BSE Biological Science, Mathematics and Biology; and BS Information Technology, Computer Science, Engineering (Civil and Electronics) and Geology.

Scholarship qualifiers must bring with them the following during the said orientation:

1. 2020 Community Tax Certificate or current passport of Parent/Legal Guardian;

2. Notarized Affidavit of Guardianship or Special Power of Attorney (if accompanied by legal guardian);

3. Clear photocopy of Certificate of Enrollment/Registration for 1st and 2nd semesters, AY 2019-2020;

Fire safety education... from P1

It provided not just timely fire safety information but also a form of psycho-social support for the young in the aftermath of Taal volcano eruption. Led by SINSP. Alma Cassandra Gardose,

the team of firefighters from BFP-TMC setup the House of Berong in coordination with BFP-Alfonso and the local government and taught the children some basic first aid lessons during emergency, the common fire hazards

at home, safety tips, how to extinguish fire from burning pan while cooking, and the proper way to respond in case of fire by crawling down below the smoke. They also had the chance to experience being little firefighters for a day as the team from BFP demonstrated the use of firehose and let them try us-

ing the equipment firsthand. First stop of the fire safety caravan was at Matagbak Elementary School followed by Marahan Elementary School both in the town of Alfonso. The team from BFP-TMC are also targeting to visit evacuation centers in other LGUs to conduct more education campaign for children.

Cavite Purple Hearts Club Chapter President Ms. Mira Ordoñez immediately responded to the call for donations and brought various relief goods to evacuation areas in Alfonso, Mendez and the City of Dasmariñas for the displaced families from Batangas.

The team from Metrobank, as accompanied and

assisted by the representatives of PGC distributed relief goods such as food supplies, clothes, hygiene kits, blankets and mats to the 257 evacuee families in Mendez. Afterwards, they proceeded to Alfonso and distributed mats and blankets to 375 families in Alfonso Central School, 55 families in Alfonso Covered Court, 48 families in Matagbak Elementary School and 98 families in

Marahan Elementary School, with a total of 576 families as recipients. Finally, in Barangay San isidro Labrador 2 and Barangay San Manuel 2, City of Dasmariñas, there were still 67 sets of blankets and mats distributed to the evacuees. Metrobank Foundation Incorporated, the corporate social responsibility arm of Metrobank has been undertaking a wide array of social development programs in key sectors such as education, visual arts and health care. Furthermore, the Purple Hearts Club also known

as Gintong Puso ng mga Carerubins, with its various chapters in different areas, has compassionately reached out to indigent communities and provided social welfare assistance for the people.

In behalf of the evacuees, the representatives of the Provincial Government of Cavite as well as the local officials of Mendez, Alfonso and the City of Dasmariñas expressed their gratefulness to the Metrobankers led by its Foundation's Executive Director, Mr. Torres for this very noble activity.

the city and municipal nutrition councils. Dr. Nelson Soriano, head of the Provincial Epidemiology and Surveillance Unit reported the immediate response conducted by the Provincial Health Office through rapid health assessment and needs analysis in evacuation sites and in communities where evacuees are fostered by their relatives.

They have provided Vitamin A supplementation and immunization among children aged 0 – 59 months, deworming, onsite health checkup, conducted medical and dental missions, anti-dengue misting, among others. Dr. Soriano stressed some vital provisions that need to be established in evacuation areas including breastfeeding area, isolation

room and quarantine area to prevent any possible transmission of communicable disease, availability of onsite medical services for early diagnosis and treatment of medical conditions, couple's room, adequate comfort rooms, clean water facility and the likes. He also noted several cases observed during surveillance like hypertension, diabetes and respiratory health problems and continuously monitoring to provide the necessary interventions.

Nutrition action officers of the different cities and municipalities also reported on the situation of evacuees in their localities and the actions that have been undertaken by the LGUs.

Aside from the health and nutritional status assessment, they also help setup

mother and baby-friendly spaces, advocated breastfeeding and information dissemination on the ban of infant formula for donations, pre-positioned supplies of ready to use supplementary food and continuously monitors the nutrition status especially of children and pregnant or lactating mothers.

Cluster members from the International Institute for Rural Reconstruction

Ms. Kirstein Itliong and Ms. Camille Valdemoro explored the possibility of setting up community kitchen in evacuation areas and setting up of Mother-Baby-friendly and Mother-Baby spaces in partnership with their organization and other donors that may be tapped.

Ms. Carina Santiago, Regional Nutrition Cluster Head summed up the agreements that were made

during the meeting including the provision of nutrition supplements and nutrition services, daily submission of reports to the province, relaying of needs to the re-

gional office for linkage and provision and information campaign on EO 51 on the ban of infant formula for donation through the Department of Education.

Friendship Hospital in Trece Martires City. The Malasakit Center is a one-stop shop of government services instituted for the purpose of expediting processes in availing services relevant to healthcare like medical and financial assistance in coordination with the Department of Health (DOH), Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PhilHealth), Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office (PCSO) and the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD). It brings government services closer to the poor and marginalized members of society with priority given to senior citizens and persons with disabilities. The Malasakit Center will ensure financial risk protection

and alleviate the burden of indigent families who availed health services in public hospitals.

Also in attendance during the launching were Secretary Michael Lloyd Dino, Presidential Assistant for the Visayas, 6th District Representative Jonjon Ferrer, 3rd District Representative Alex "AA" Advincula, Cavite Board Members Kherby Salazar, Ivy Jayne Reyes, Lito Langit and Virgilio Varias, Trece Martires City Mayor Gemma Lubigan with the city councilors, Dr. Nelson Soriano, Dr. Aldous Angeles and some doctors, nurses and other medical personnel from the Provincial Health Office headed by Dr. Romulo Lua. --(PICAD)

of solid wastes. This is not in any way counted with the other clean-ups initiated by individual LGUs. Moreover, DENR has also funded the involvement of 483 river marshalls or Bantay-Linis Ilog. These marshalls were able to collect a total of 1,051,604 kilograms of solid wastes. Another achievement worth mentioning is the 139,495.37 kilograms of submerged garbage collected from Zapote River and coastal areas of Bacoor and Rosario. And they did not stop with that

because along side the clean-ups, the information drive on Ecological Solid Waste Management in the priority areas, specifically those near water bodies, were intensified. As of now, they have delineated 46 kilometers of easement area along the coast of Cavite and they have installed eight trash traps in the tributaries of Cavite, Laguna, Rizal. Regularly, they conduct water quality monitoring to assure the quality of water in terms of coliform count. Thus, remarkable improvements are visible yet still a long way to go.

All systems go in Cavite for Taal volcanic eruption response operations

Cavite Governor Jonvic Remulla convened an emergency meeting of the Provincial Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council together with the mayors of the different cities and municipalities on January 16, 2020 at The Bayleaf Hotel in the City of Gen. Triasto discuss the impacts of Taal volcanic eruption and the current situation in the different LGUs with evacuees from the heavily affected municipalities of Batangas.

Alert Level 4 is still in effect based on PHIVOLCS Taal Volcano Bulletin and hazardous eruption is imminent. As of the latest situation report from the Provincial Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office, at 8:00 AM of January 17, there are currently 19 LGUs in Cavite providing temporary shelter

tosome 6,472 families totaling to 28,461 individuals and still counting with the continuous waves of evacuees coming in.

Some issues have been identified in the different LGUs which are also affected by the volcanic eruption particularly in Tagaytay City, the municipalities of Alfonso, Amadeo, Silang and Indang including the disruption of water and power supply. Mayor Frederick Vida of Mendez reported that MER-

ALCO has been conducting continuous cleaning operations for the restoration of power supply. Health and sanitation concerns were also raised by Dr. Nelson Soriano, Chief Epidemiologist of the Provincial Office. Some of the observed health conditions of evacuees were hyper-

tension, common colds, the status of pregnant and lactating mothers, among others. The PHO conducts medical missions, measles and polio vaccination, and other health initiatives as well as assisting in partnership with the Provincial Government-Environment and Natural Resources Office.

They also recommend the provision of Portalets, generator sets, potable drinking water and breastfeeding areas at the evacuation sites.

The PNP also provided logistical and manpower support at the onset of the eruption deploying personnel in affected areas in Batangas for rescue and evacuation and at strategic locations in Cavite for disaster response operations.

DTI reported no cases of price increase in prime



commodities but noted a shortage in the supply of face masks in some areas. They are continuously monitoring the prices as well as the implication of the disaster in business establishments in the affected LGUs.

Professor Genaro Cuaresma, Director for Institution Building of the UP Resilience Institute who was invited in the meeting shared

what the University of the Philippines system can share to the province in terms of scientific and technical assistance, psycho-social intervention for the affected individuals, agriculture and livestock concerns, infrastructure assessment as well as call for donation.

Governor Remulla lauded the efforts of the different LGUs in providing for the

victims of the calamity from the province of Batangas and takes pride in the different acts of compassion showed by Caviteños in the face of the calamity.

The Governor likewise leaves the announcement of class suspension or resumption to the local chief executives based on their assessment of the situation in their locality.
