CAVITE PTCAO JOINS DTI AND DOLE IN THE INSPECTION OF RESTAURANTS AND SALONS

Ensuring the health and safety of the public is the top priority of the provincial government in this time of the COVID-19 pandemic as some businesses reopen during the General Community Quarantine in Cavite. On June 24, 2020, the Provincial Tourism and Cultural Affairs Office (PTCAO) participated in the initial joint monitoring of establishments on their compliance with the mandatory minimum requirements for operations of restaurants and some hair salons/barbershops, pursuant to Memorandum Circular No.20-28 & 37, which sets the minimum health protocols for salon and dine-in services of restaurants.

Together with the Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) Cavite, the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE), the Provincial Health Office (PHO), and the Business Processing and Licensing Office (BPLO) of LGU-Dasmariñas City, PTCAO took part in

conducting the post-audit monitoring of 27 tenants in SM City Dasmariñas. The monitoring team was welcomed by mall manager, Ms. Edith Tayco and DTI-Cavite OIC-PD Reveleyn Cortez.

According to Ms. Tayco, around 40 food establishments have reopened recently—which they regularly monitor if set health protocols are being strictly-observed for the safety of both employees and customers. Likewise, the mall management expressed appreciation to the team for the helpful suggestions on how to further improve the mall services, hoping that the COVID-19 pandemic will soon end to give way to the economy.

An electronic questionnaire on safety protocols answerable by a Yes or No was utilized by the team as they inspect each establishment. Among those safety protocols being checked include use of health declaration form/checklist, thermal



scanner, alcohol, foot bath, 1-meter social distancing, display of safety signages, proper queuing, sanitation and ventilation.

The monitoring team

targets to visit all malls in Cavite and other stand-alone establishments. DTI has set the next schedule on June 26, 2020 at SM City Bacoor. — (PTCAO)

run of their delivery system aboard their respective motorcycles. The modules will be delivered to students two to three weeks before the school year starts.

The volunteer teachers will also be swab tested to avoid coronavirus transmission. "Gagawin namin ang lahat to see to it na 'yung safety ng mga modules ay

okay kasi we're talking about the health condition of our learners plus itong ating mga module transporter so mag-sasagawa po kami ng disinfection," Schools Division Superintendent Rose Marie Torres said.

Aside from delivery by the volunteer teachers, "modular hubs" where the learning materials will be delivered and picked up have also been identified.

"Meron po silang schedule ng pagkuha. Hindi po sabay-sabay," Torres said.

The teachers will not re-

ceive any added income or allowance for delivering the modules but said they volunteered to do it out of dedication to the job and care for their students.

"May estudyante po akong wala sila kahit smartphone. Ang meron lang sila ay basic phone kaya alam ko po na para maihatid ko sa kaniya ang mga karunungan na dapat hindi nila mamiss sa isang buong taon ay through module po," Grade 3 teacher Mielyn Caunan said. -Julia Mari Ornedo/MDM, GMA News

As the demand for food services arise in the time of pandemic, the Department of Science and Technology Region 02 (DOST-RO2) conducted an online webinar on Food Fraud and Food Defense Prevention part 1 for Women Micro-Entrepreneurs (WMEs) in the region.

Resource Speaker DOST-RO2 SRS II Aileen C. Gonzales in her presentation explained the food defense which is the effort to protect food from intentional adulteration from acts intended to cause wide-scale harm to public health.

According to Ms. Gonzales, the firm must establish a food defense team that shall put in place appropriate control measures to reduce intentional threats to assure the protection of the food from intentional adulterations.

The focal person of the Cagayan Valley Food Safety Team (CVFST) also introduced the Threat Assessment Critical Control Point (TACCP) which is the systematic management of risk through the evaluation of threats, identification of vulnerabilities, and implementation of controls to materials and products, purchasing, processes, premises, people, distribution networks and business systems by a knowledgeable and trusted team with the authority to implement changes in the procedures.

The online webinar was joined by 89 WMEs from the different parts of the region and two participants from the Cotabato and professor from UP Diliman on June 25, 2020.

Overwhelmed with the number of the participants, DOST-RO2 Director Sancho A. Maborang encouraged the participants by saying that this situation might be difficult, but it is not hopeless.

“Ang importante ay mag-survive, hindi ang kumita. ako ay naniniwala na ang inyong presensya signifies your interest in recovering, ‘wag mawalan ng pag-asa.”, Director Maborang said as he uplifts the morale of the WMEs.

For her part, Assistant Regional Director for Technical Operation Dr. Teresita A. Tabaog said that this webinar series dubbed #DOSTRO2WEEmpower was opened not just for WMEs under the DOST-RO2-PCW Women Economic Empowerment (WEE) project but also to all MSMEs and other interested individuals not only locally but nationwide.

Furthermore, the Regional Coordinator of the DOST-RO2-PCW WEE project, Mr. Porfirio Bajo emphasized that the WMEs must increase the level of positivity in running their firms, particularly in these trying times.

To further increase the understanding of the food handler-WMEs, DOST-RO2 will conduct another webinar on Food Fraud on July, 2020.

ty quarantine imposed on March 15, 2020. The Kabisig Cooperative Terminal in Molino 3 (Bacoor City) to Alabang Terminal (Muntinlupa City), Springville (Molino) to Alabang via Daanghari, Molino to Ayala Center (Makati City) via Skyway and Golden City (Dasmariñas City) to Ayala Center routes are on the list of those that the Land Transportation Franchising

and Regulatory Board authorized on Sunday.

Each terminal needs to comply with guidelines set by the national Inter-Agency Task Force for the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases, namely the wearing of face masks, keeping seating capacity at 50 percent and performing temperature scans. The fares are as follows: Springville to

Alabang via Daanghari, P35; Molino (Kabisig Terminal) to Alabang via Daanghari, P35; Molino to Ayala Center via Skyway, P60; and Golden City, Salawag to Ayala Center, P70. One UV Express unit driver, who requested that his name be withheld, said: “Di po kaya kung susundin namin ang P29 na pamasaha, kasi po kalahati na lang po ng capacity ng van ang laman,

then the price of diesel ay tumataas pa po, then nagbabayad pa kami ng toll.”

Vehicles under the UV Express ride-sharing service that have been allowed to ply their respective routes can unload passengers only at designated areas and are not allowed to pick up passengers along the road for proper contact-tracing of all riding passengers.

Veteran Marine unit returns for more training in Cavite

The Philippine Marine Corps' 9th Marine Battalion returned to Cavite City on Thursday to undergo training that will allow them to be capable of performing mission-essential tasks to the "full range of military operations".

In a message to the Philippine News Agency, Lt. Commander Maria Christina Roxas, Philippine Navy public affairs office chief, said the training is essential as the 9th Marine Battalion is being envisioned "as the first Marine Amphibious Ready Unit to be attached to the Fleet-Marine Ready Force".

She added that the unit was placed under the non-operational status by PMC commandant, Major Gen. Nathaniel Casem, for this purpose upon arrival at Sangley Point, Cavite City aboard BRP Bacolod City (LS-550) on Thursday.

The 9th Marine Battalion, which is commanded by Lt. Col. Mark Anthony Arabe, has seen action in Tawi-Tawi, Sulu, and Zamboanga since 2010.

These provinces are under the operational jurisdiction of the Western Mindanao Command.

Roxas said the unit has been instrumental in a wide array of operations such as security, combat, support to law enforcement, humanitarian assistance, and disaster relief, and numerous undertakings in support of other government agencies in their area of deployment.

Among the notable accomplishments of the 9th Marine Battalion were the neutralization of several Abu Sayyaf Group members, interception of smuggled lumbers, illegal drugs, human trafficking victims and illegal immigrants, and rescue of more than a hundred passengers and crew of an ill-fated vessel in Tawi-Tawi.

PN flag-officer-in-command Vice Admiral Giovanni Carlo Bacordo, who presided the arrival ceremony following the "new normal" scheme adhering to health and biosafety protocols, called the successful deployment of the 9th Marine Battalion a testament to the "capability and competence of our Marines to respond to emerging security challenges".

To sustain these accomplishments, he said the unit needs to level up as a proficient Marine Operating Force due to the "rapidly changing, complex, simultaneous and overlapping security challenges". (PNA)

Healthcare workers with CoViD-19 fully covered by PhilHealth



The Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PhilHealth) reiterated anew that medical frontliners and allied workers are entitled to full hospitalization coverage should they contract Covid-19 for the whole duration of the pandemic.

The Agency made the announcement to remind all hospitals in the country that they should not be charging any co-payment against patients whose job is in the medical frontlines. The call is in support of President Rodrigo Roa Duterte's appeal to afford healthcare workers and frontliners with all possible support in recognition of the risks they endure on a day-to-day basis to help treat patients of the dreaded disease.

The call was also in line with its Circular No. 2020-0011 issued on April 14, 2020 which guaranteed "full financial risk for Filipino health workers and patients against coronavirus disease". The said circular also defined health workers as "persons engaged in health and health-related work, regardless

of employment status, which include doctors, nurses, allied health professionals, administrative and support personnel in health facilities, utility and security personnel working in health facilities, health volunteers deployed in health facilities and staff and personnel working in government health agencies."

Aside from full coverage, these health workers are also entitled to PhilHealth benefits for SARS-CoV-2 testing package ranging from P901 to P3,409 as stipulated in its Circular No. 2020-0017.

PhilHealth reminded that hospitals face sanctions should they be found to have refused admission or charged any co-payment to any health workers exposed and treated for Covid-19. It also asked for broader public support to invoke this privilege granted by law and to immediately report any information of abuse or negligence on the part of health care providers. (END)

LGU Imus pumps up support for New Normal set up in education
