# FAKE ACCOUNTS SURGE ON FACEBOOK AS SCHOOLS TARGETED

*Thousands of fake accounts that bore the names of University of the Philippines (UP) students, faculty and alumni were created over the weekend on Facebook, reigniting widespread fears over disinformation and privacy that have plagued the social media giant for years.*



Students of De La Salle University (DLSU) in Manila and in Cavite province, as well as those of UP Cebu, University of San Carlos and San Jose Recoletos in Cebu City were also affected.

The UP System said its data protection officer had reached out to the National Privacy Commission (NPC) for help in reporting the dummy accounts, which proliferated mere days after the UP community turned out en masse to protest the proposed antiterrorism law.

"We express our utmost alarm since these accounts are suspected to cause harm or spread false information," the UP Office of the Student Regent (OSR) said in a statement. "It would be best if we all stay informed and vigilant."

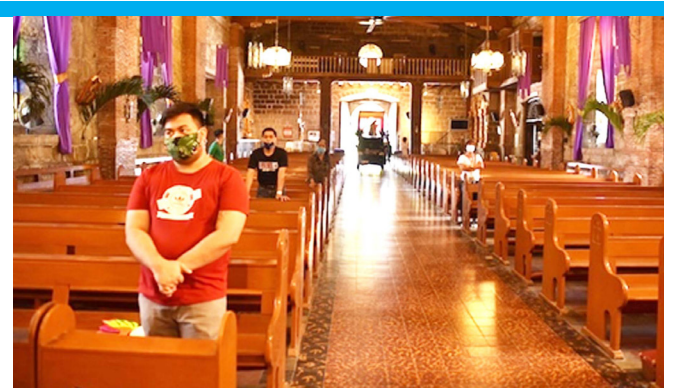

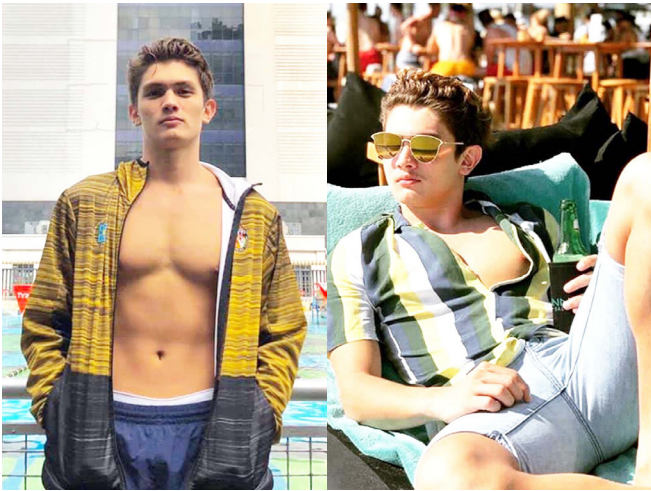

This young athlete is now part of the University of Santo Tomas (UST) swimming team and has already played for UAAP seasons 79 and 80 for NU Bulldogs and won two bronze medals. He won in the Preliminaries Boys 13-17 200-Meter Individual Medley with 2:26:91, and in the 200-Meter Medley Relay with team mates Jay Cabulit, Dan Leyba and Jericho Salas.

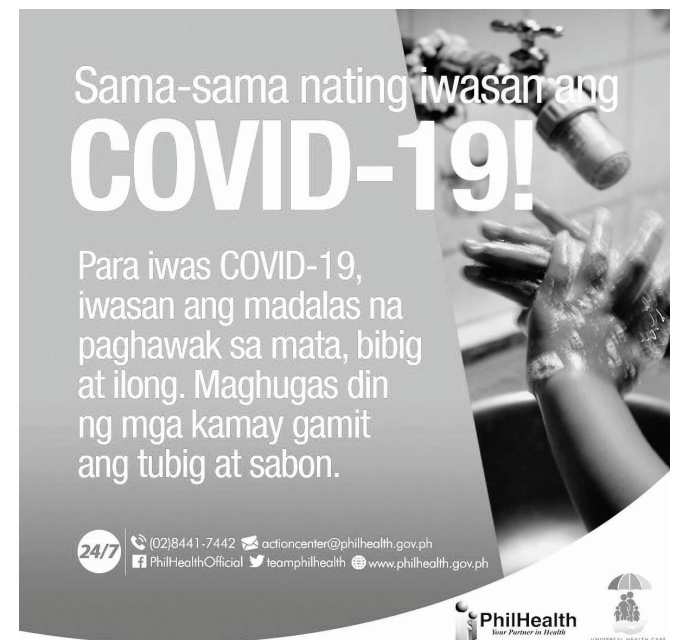
Dyrham "Ham" Raga Palfrey was born on January 21, 2000 to Mr. David Andrew Palfrey and Ms. Aurora Bautista Raga in San Carlos, Pangasinan. He has two younger twin siblings named Anthony and Angela Palfrey. The 5-foot-10 head-turner just finished grade 10 in Saint Columban's College. He became popular and was featured in GMA news when his photo went viral at the Palarong Pambansa 2016 held at Albay and was tagged as 'Pambansang Cutie'. He finished with a silver medal in the annual national sports event.

Dyrham have started swimming at the age of six. "Swimming helps me maintain a healthy body" quipped Ham as he is fondly called. Aside from swimming sports, he also knows how to play basketball, chess and badminton.

His most unforgettable competition was in 2012 held in Dagupan Pangasinan. He and his team mates won gold medals in their relay. He was barely 12 years old during that time. Asked about his popularity today, tagged as Pambansang Cutie, "I want to thank whoever posted the pictures because of that I was recognized in public news. I feel great being one of the Palarong Pambansa cuties" said Ham.

His idol in swimming is American Olympian Michael Phelps. "I like him because he has become the only swimmer to have 23 gold medals in the Olympic Games and has established many world records" added Dyrham. province be placed under modified general community quarantine (MGCQ) starting June 16.

Bishop Reynaldo Evangelista of the Diocese of Imus said in an interview that parish priests in Cavite cities and towns have put in place precautionary measures in place following the guidelines set by the government's coronavirus task force.

"All the parish priests in 82 parish in 7 cities and 16 towns of Cavite are putting markings on all benches, sanitizers, alcohol, foot bath at the entrance of the church, thermal scanners – same as

other gadgets used in IATF protocols," Evangelista said.

Cavite has a population of 3.67 million based on the 2015 census. In 2010, it had the second largest Catholic population in the country, after Cebu. (MAP: Catholicism in the Philippines)

Churches in areas under MGCQ are allowed to hold mass services at 50% seating capacity.

Ushers and lay people will help ensure that mass attendees observe social distancing and other rules inside and outside the church.

The Catholic Bishops Conference of the Philip-

pines (CBCP) has suggested to add more mass schedules to keep churches from getting too crowded. Anticipated masses will start at 12:00 noon of Saturdays for this purpose.

Aside from physical distancing and mandatory wearing of masks, communion will be given to a mass attendees' hand instead of placing it in the latter's mouth.

Each church in the province has a different way of applying the physical distancing requirement on the pews. Some have seats are numbered to match the

number of people who would be allowed in, while other churches are putting up barriers between seats.

Churches will impose one-way movement of people heading to the entrance and the exit to avoid people bumping into each other.

In a message to Caviteños, Evangelista said what he had observed since the coronavirus lockdown in mid-March was that "the people are praying more often, many families pray together, attending mass via social media livestream during the past 13 Sundays of lockdown." – Rappler.com

beginning June 7. In a Facebook post, Remulla noted that in the modified system, a quarantine pass will be "transferable" within the household.

"Ibig sabihin, kapag qualified and of age ang kasama sa bahay ay puwede na ipagamit sa kasama sa bahay. Magdala na lang ng ID na patunay na magkasama sa isang

bahay," Remulla said. Remulla told Cavite residents that travel restriction within the province is now eased as a travel pass is no longer needed. If one needs to go to Metro Manila for work purposes, he or she must always possess his or her employment ID.

"Ang pag-biyahe sa ibang lalawigan ay kailangan pa rin ng travel pass. Kung

trabaho naman ay magpakita lamang ng employment ID," Remulla said.

"Ang inter-province returning resident ay tatanggapin naman sa Cavite, pakita lang ng valid ID of Cavite residence. Ang age limit (18-20 years old) sa travel travel pass ay lifted na pag MGCQ na tayo," he added.

Remulla said curfew is

still imposed from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m. He added that there is still no change as regards mall policies.

The governor also reminded residents to continue practicing health and safety protocols such as wearing face masks and staying at their homes if travel is not essential. —Anna Felicia Bajo/LBG, GMA News

measures against the coronavirus disease (COVID)-19 pandemic.

The center composed of the newly renovated Cavite Mayors League Building, a newly-constructed covered court, and newly-installed container vans was inaugurated to serve as the city's additional isolation and quarantine facilities.

Located in front of the Southern Tagalog Regional Hospital (STRH), container vans were converted to temporary shelter modular houses equipped with 20 hospital beds and common bathrooms that will cater to mild and asymptomatic COVID-19 positive patients in the city and a provision for

nurses' station and doctors' lounge.

The facility was completed thru the efforts of the city government and donations from Future Home Co. Ltd., Almextech Inc., and the Jesus V. Del Rosario Foundation, Inc. who worked together to build the air-conditioned container rooms in just over a month.

Meanwhile, the newly renovated Cavite Mayors League Building can accommodate 20 patients while the renovation of the STRH has allowed for an additional 50-bed capacity rooms for asymptomatic, mild to severe positive COVID-19 patients.

Bacoor City Mayor Lani-Mercado Revilla led

the blessing and turnover ceremony along with Department of Health Regional Director Dr. Eduardo Janairo and STRH Director Dr. Ephraim Rubiano and other DOH and STRH officials.

According to the latest data from the Bacoor Covid-19 Task Force and the City Epidemiology and Surveillance Unit (CESU), the city recorded a total of 127 COVID-19 positive cases, 71 recoveries, 45 are active cases, and 11 fatalities from the disease.

Mayor Revilla said "Targeted mass testing of our frontliners are now being conducted, thus there will always be the possibility of an increase in the number of

cases which I pray would not happen. If this happens, early detection of the new cases would be the answer followed by the immediate isolation and proper treatment until they fully recover."

"After the strict implementation of social distancing in the city, we are now focusing on increasing our capacity for health concerns and addressing them. Beside the temporary isolation and quarantine facilities from the use of the existing hotels, motels, and inns in the city, we are now able to have our own Ligtas COVID-19 Center," the mayor concluded. # Fake accounts surge on Facebook << P1

Surge in dummy accounts

In a statement sent to the Inquirer, Facebook said it was looking into the surge in dummy accounts.

“We understand the concerns raised by our community in the Philippines,” the social media giant said. “We’re investigating reports of suspicious activity on our platform and taking action on any accounts that we find

to be in violation of our policies.”

“[W]here they fail our authenticity checks, the accounts will be removed,” Facebook said.

The top four universities in Metro Manila all released statements on Sunday decrying the surge in dummy accounts among members of their communities.

The University Data Protection Office at Ateneo

de Manila University said it was coordinating with data protection units at other educational institutions, the National Privacy Commission and Facebook to “pursue any or all necessary interventions.”

The University of Santo Tomas urged caution with “suspicious accounts.”

De La Salle University called on students, alumni and officials to be vigilant.

“Postings from these accounts are unauthorized and do not reflect the views and position of the institution,” it said.

News of the dummy accounts first emerged on Saturday night. By Sunday morning, the site was flooded with pleas for help as more users fell victim.

Protests, petitions Common to the duplicates were the absence of a

profile photo or any recent posts, suggesting they had been newly created and likely in bulk. Several users reported finding not just one but several accounts using their names.

The UP OSR said it was first notified about the issue by UP Cebu, where students peacefully protesting the passage of the antiterrorism bill were arrested on Friday on its campus.

Tug-ani, the school’s official student publication, said it identified dozens of empty duplicate accounts.

“Victims speculate that this might involve identity theft or targeted attacks against UP students,” Tug-ani said. It later added that even non-UP students in Cebu found dummies using their name.

30 duplicate accounts

In the week leading up to the protests on Friday, hundreds of thousands of Filipinos signed online petitions that called for the junking of House Bill No. 6875, or the terrorism bill, warning that free speech would be imperiled. The full name of signatories could be viewed by the public.

Two of those arrested—Bern Cañedo and Nar Porlas—were found to have at least 30 duplicate accounts on Facebook, sowing fear that this might involve identity theft or targeted attacks against UP Cebu students.

UP Cebu Chancellor Liza Corro said she, too, discovered a fake Facebook account claiming to be her. It had no posts except for pictures of just two of her friends and one picture of herself taken a long time ago.

Corro said she reported it right away to Facebook as a fake account and was immediately deleted. But soon thereafter, not even a minute had passed, another fake Facebook account under her name was created.

“It still had no profile picture of myself but had a picture of another different friend of mine. However, this time, my birth date can be publicly seen,” she said.

Unprecedented surge

Again, Corro reported it right away to Facebook as a fake account that again was also immediately pulled down. “And the next thing I saw, another account was created still with my name, but a profile picture of a dif-

ferent woman was placed.”

The NPC said this was the first time it had received a surge of “impostor” accounts on Facebook.

Privacy Commissioner Raymond Liboro said on Sunday that the agency used to get reports about copycat accounts one by one, but not in this scale.

In previous cases, a copycat account would usually be seen as an unauthorized processing of personal data, which would be punishable under the Data Privacy Act. He said it was too early to say what violations were made in the current case.

Liboro said the reports came from members of academic communities such as UP and DLSU. The reports, according to him, were separate from the breach that San Beda University recently reported.

Liboro said the NPC had immediately brought this to the attention of Facebook.

Justice Secretary Menardo Guevarra said he would direct the justice department’s Office of Cybercrime to coordinate with the National Bureau of Investigation and the Philippine National Police counterpart units to promptly investigate the proliferation of fake Facebook accounts.

“This gives me cause for worry. We don’t need false information at a time when we’re dealing with a serious public health crisis,” he said on Sunday.

‘Keyboard armies’ EngageMedia, a non-profit organization that advocates digital rights, pointed the Inquirer to studies that had shown how “keyboard armies” pushed the present administration’s agenda.

“In this instance, the fake accounts were used for political aims, and this recent use of fake accounts—by targeting those who criticize the President’s priority bill — seem to be no different,” said Red Tani, advocacy and communications senior manager.

“As with the previous use of fake accounts, there’s no way to be sure who is really behind this or what their motivations are,” he added.

“But the effects are clear — advocates and activists, even citizens who don’t identify as such, will now think twice before they publicly criticize the administration’s actions.”

The summons to be published shall be contained in an order of the court with the following data: 1) title of the case; 2) docket number; 3) nature of the petition; 4) principal grounds of the petition and the reliefs prayed for; 5) a directive for the respondent to answer within thirty (30) days from the last issue of publication.<sup>2</sup>

The petitioner is hereby directed to coordinate with the Clerk of Court for the raffle of the publication.

Let this case be set for monitoring of the publication on 03 July 2020 at 8:30 in the morning.

This project is one of the city government's countermeasures in the fight against COVID-19 pandemic was made possible thru the support of the Sangguniang Panlungsod with the passing of the City Ordinance No. 4-145 s. 2020 on April 20, 2020 approving the immediate construction of the facility.

On May 8, 2020, representatives from the Department of Health (DOH), Research Institute for Tropical Medicine (RITM), and the World Health Organization (WHO) visited the facility for its Stage 2 accreditation. Processing for the accreditation before Stage 3 would take more or less 45 days.

Likewise, the facility also passed the Proficiency Test conducted by the DOH and the RITM last May 29, 2020. From this test, the ca-

capacity of a testing facility is measured to produce the correct results on the swab samples undergoing testing. The Real Time-Polymerase Chain Reaction (RT-PCR) technique is used which is considered the 'Golden Standard' for testing.

Under the Public Health sector, the facility therefore will be managed by the City Health Office in partnership with the Ospital ng Imus.

The City Engineering Office supervised the completion of the construction of the two-story building that was finished by the end of May. On June 4, 2020 the City of Imus Molecular Laboratory was officially accredited as a COVID-19 Testing Facility and awarded with a License to Operate by the DOH. "With this accreditation, the city government could now conduct more tests, isolate the positive cases and patients will be given the proper attention and treatment until they fully recover from the disease. Eventually, the economy could start again

safely with employees and workers going back to work cleared from the COVID-19 infection," Mayor Maliksi said. The city government led by Mayor Emmanuel L. Maliksi, Vice-Mayor Ony Cantimbuhan along with

### Soldier from Indang, Cavite tests positive for COVID-19

INDANG, Cavite – Municipal health authorities here reported the fourth confirmed case of coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) of the town on Friday, June 5. The latest patient was a soldier serving in the frontlines of the fight against COVID-19. The patient, whose gender was not disclosed, was assigned at Camp Aguinaldo. The patient underwent a polymerase chain reaction (PCR) test in the morning of June 1 before coming home to Barangay Calumpang Cerca. The patient left Indang to go back to Camp Aguinaldo on the morning of June 2. Two days later, on June 4, the result of the PCR test was released. The patient was asymptomatic and is currently in isolation at V. Luna Memorial Hospital in Quezon City. The local government assured the public that they were currently facilitating contract tracing measures to avoid any community transmission.
