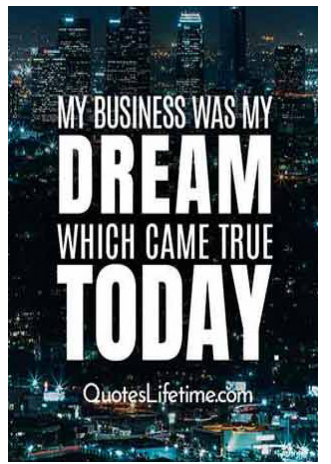

CALAMBA CITY, Laguna (PIA) — The National Economic and Development Authority (NEDA) Region 4-A is optimistic that the region will fully recover its losses from the Covid-19 pandemic if it stays consistent with the 10-point policy agenda that promotes the safe reopening of key sectors.

## Senate 2022: Who leaves, who stays, who wants a comeback

Twelve Senate seats will be contested by 64 neophytes and reelectionists in the May 9 elections to join the remaining 12 in the 19th Congress.

Senators Sonny Angara, Nancy Binay, Pia Cayetano, Ronald dela Rosa, Bong Go, Lito Lapid, Imee Marcos, Koko Pimentel, Grace Poe, Bong Revilla, Francis Tolentino, and Cynthia Villar will end their six-year terms in 2025.

The other 12, who were elected in 2016, are composed of last-termers Senate President Vicente Sotto III, and Senators Ralph Recto and Franklin Drilon who are not eligible for reelection as they conclude their second consecutive six-year term; Senators Panfilo Lacson, Manny Pacquiao, and Francis Pangilinan who are eligible for reelection but chose to target higher positions; and reelectionists Senators Joel Villanueva, >> P3

Duterte signed Republic Act No. (RA) 11682 on April 11 but a copy of the law was released to reporters on Tuesday.

porate Affairs Dr. Shirley Domingo noted their regional offices are coordinating with the hospitals for their claim's payment. "They are doing reconciliation meetings. Nagbayad po tayo ng tinatawag na DCPM [Debit-Credit Payment Method]. So, naka-DCPM releases na tayo, siguro mga tatlong types of DCPM – DCPM 1, ini-extend natin iyong one, and then, two and three (We have paid through DCPM. So, we had DCPM releases, like three types of DCPM – DCPM 1, we have extended one, and then, two and three)," Domingo said.

In its Circular 2021-0004, PhilHealth uses the DCPM to facilitate the settlement of accounts payable to healthcare facilities during the State of Public Health Emergency brought about by

the Covid-19 pandemic.

PhilHealth initially applied DCPM only to areas identified by the Inter Agency Task Force for the Management of Infectious Diseases and National Task Force Against Covid-19, particularly in the National Capital Region, Batangas, Bulacan, Cavite, Laguna, Pampanga, and Rizal.

As for the investigation of hospitals in Northern Mindanao, Domingo clarified that none like it happened recently or is ongoing.

"That statement or that news came out, when actually nagkaroon ng MOA [memorandum of agreement] signing ang ating regional office noon at saka NBI [National Bureau of Investigation] para i-train ng NBI iyong ating regional personnel on fraud management

or investigation. So iyong potalaga, MOA signing po iyong (there was a MOA signing between our regional office and the NBI for the NBI to train our regional personnel on fraud management or investigation)," she said.

She emphasized the suspension of the hospitals happened years ago when the corporation started with its investigations. "Iyong mga hospitals na-suspend iyong

dati pa at saka iyong sinasabing revoked ay actually, isa lang ang galing doon sa region na iyan, the rest were mga five iyon nationwide. Pero ever since, matagal na po iyong, hindi iyan current (Those hospitals were suspended a long time ago and the hospitals said to be revoked is just one, the rest were five nationwide. That was before, that is not current)," she said. (PNA)

the fastest economic growth among all regions in the country, posting a 7.6-percent Gross Regional Domestic Product (GRDP) growth rate and GRDP amounting to P2.73 trillion.

According to NEDA 4-A, the accelerated economic figures reflects a big bounce back from a contraction of 10.5-percent in 2020 and was well above the lower end of the 2021 growth rate target of 5.9-percent.

NEDA 4-A Regional Director Engr. Luis Banua said during the 2021 Report on the Calabarzon Economic Performance News Conference that the industry and services sectors in the Cal-

abarzon region contributed the largest economic shares in 2021.

Banua reported that the industry sector contributed 51.0-percent share, while the services sector provided 44.1-percent share.

Meanwhile, the remaining 4.8-percent share can be attributed to the continuous activities of the agriculture, forestry, and fishery sectors. Aside from the restricted trade flow for agriculture and fishery products caused by the pandemic, the African Swine Fever (ASF) that devastated the hog-raising industry further pulled the agriculture sector.

NEDA 4-A is hopeful

that the agriculture sector will post an accelerated growth this year with the implementation of the Mandanas-Garcia Ruling and the recovery programs launched by the Department of Agriculture.

Banua stressed that local government units would be empowered to assist local farmers and help them recover under the full devolution policy shift.

The regional socioeconomic planning chief added said relaxed quarantine restrictions increased the mobility among goods and consumers and paved the way for businesses and industries to recover from their losses at

the height of the pandemic.

As the region implements economic recovery strategies, Banua advised its partners that actions must be prioritized in the area to sustain the financial gains it currently enjoys.

It includes ensuring the safe reopening of the economy, supporting the recovery of the tourism sector, maintaining a stable inflation rate, and preventing contraction in key sectors.

"The region will be able to sustain its economic and social recovery with all sectors of society working together to implement this key policy agenda," Banua said. — PB, PIA 4A

## DILG monitoring five poll << P1

In a report of the Cavite News Today, DILG Cavite Provincial Director Lionel Dalope revealed that the cities of Trece Martires and Cavite and the municipalities of Kawit, Rosario, and Amadeo are considered election hotspots in the province.

Dalope clarified that these localities fall under the yellow category, which is a much lighter classification. These areas have at least one election-related incident of intense political rivalry, presence of armed groups, or

imminent insurgency threat, according to Dalope.

"Iba-iba ang dahilan upang ma-classify na 'hotspot', kabilang na dito ay ang mga nagdaang karanasan o mga pangyayari sa mga lugar nila na maituturing na nagsasapanganib o kailangan bantayan para maiwasan ang anumang kaguluhan sa panahon ng eleksyon," Dalope explained.

Despite being tagged under the lowest category of election hotspots, these areas are being strictly monitored

by the security forces of the PNP to ensure the safety of both the public and the candidates throughout the election period.

Asked about the alleged vote-buying in Silang town, Dalope said that the incident is being confirmed by concerned authorities to make a formal investigation on the matter.

According to the provincial DILG chief, remaining 'apolitical' does not only apply to the PNP personnel but to all those who work for the

civil service. He reiterated that one of the duties and responsibilities of the PNP personnel is to maintain peace and order and to keep themselves unbiased from any political personality or party.

"As a whole, it requires the concerted efforts of the DILG, the COMELEC, and the local government units (LGUs) to maintain and ensure the public's trust for a clean, fair, peaceful, and orderly elections this coming May 9, 2022," Dalope stated. — RBF, PIA Cavite

goods, and property by air, both domestic and international...”

Air transport services include the maintenance and operation of hangers and aircraft service stations and facilities and other services of similar nature which may be necessary, convenient, or useful as an auxiliary to aircraft transportation.

Air Philippines will have the right at its terminal and landing fields, as well as in its aircraft, to construct, operate, and maintain stations or transmitting sets for wireless telegraphy and direction findings, and other radio aids to air navigation, using wavelengths in accordance with the rules and regulations made from time to time by the proper agencies of the government. The wireless communication facilities will be used solely for receiving and transmitting weather forecasts and other matters in connection with its services.

Under PAL Holdings Inc., Air Philippines Corp. operates as PAL Express and is the third largest airline in the country.

Aside from RA 11682, Duterte also signed RA 11694 or the Revised Batangas State University Charter which declares the Batangas State University as the national engineering university and RA 11695 which strengthens the Tarlac State University.

He also inked RA 11683, which amends section 450 of Republic Act No. 7160 or the Local Government Code of 1991 as amended by RA 9009 by providing for the requisites for the conversion of a

municipality into a component city.

Among others, a municipality or a cluster of barangays may be converted into a component city if it has a locally generated average annual income, as certified by the Department of Finance, of at least PHP100 million for the last two consecutive years based on 2,000 constant prices.

It must also be a contiguous territory of at least 100 square kilometers as certified by the Land Management Bureau and a population of not less than 150,000 inhabitants as certified by the Philippine Statistics Authority.

He also signed RA 11689 which revises the charter of the city of Baguio and RA 11690 which renames Barangay San Isidro in the municipality of Lupon, province of Davao Oriental as barangay Ernesto D. Violan.

The renaming of Barangay San Isidro as Barangay Ernesto D. Violan will be effective upon ratification of the majority of the votes cast by qualified voters in a plebiscite to be conducted and supervised by the Commission on Elections (Comelec) in the present Barangay San Isidro, Municipality of Lupon, Province of Davao Oriental in compliance with Section 13(g) of RA 7160.

The expenses for such a plebiscite must be borne by the Municipality of Lupon, Province of Davao Oriental.

Duterte signed RA 11683 on April 10 while RAs 11694, 11695, 11689, and 11690 were signed on April 11. All laws were released to reporters on Tuesday. (PNA)

Risa Hontiveros, Richard Gordon, Leila de Lima, Sherwin Gatchalian, and Miguel Zubiri.

Lacson and Pacquiao are running for president while Sotto and Pangilinan are aiming for the vice presidency.

Meanwhile, Recto is eyeing the Batangas 6th District congressional post while Drilon has decided to retire.

"I'm not running for any position, I have served enough, I think I have contributed. Let's give others a chance," Drilon said in a recent online forum.

Meanwhile, former senators eyeing a return to the Upper Chamber are Sorso-gon Governor Francis Escudero, Antique Lone District Representative Loren Legarda, Taguig-Pateros Representative Allan Peter Cayetano, former Department of Information and Communications Secretary Gregorio Honasan, siblings Jinggoy Estrada and JV Ejercito, and Antonio Trillanes IV.

Villanueva, Zubiri, Escudero, Legarda, Cayetano, Honasan, Estrada, and Ejercito are among the 17 senatorial candidates endorsed by President Rodrigo Duterte.

Duterte had repeatedly urged voters not to re-elect "opportunist" senators.

"Ang hinihingi ko sa taumbayan, 'yung lahat na senador -- ito kung pagbigyan lang ninyo ako -- 'yung lahat ng senador tumatakbo talunin ninyo. Huwag ninyong ibalik sa Senado kasi magdaldal nang magdaldal na rin 'yan at mag-show off, parang magyabang (My advice to the public, if they want to heed my advice, is don't let some of the reelectionist senators win. Don't reelect them to the Senate because they would just keep talking and showing off. It's like boasting)," he said in one episode of "Talk to the People".

Duterte himself opted to run as senator but withdrew later on, saying he would just retire from politics after his term ends in June. (PNA)

## Calabarzon joins Duterte Legacy caravans, Labor Day celebration

CALAMBA CITY, Laguna (PIA) — Various government agencies in the Calabarzon region join the nation in celebrating the wins and milestones of the Duterte Administration through the Duterte Legacy caravans held simultaneously today, May 1, in time for the Labor Day celebration.

The caravans dubbed as "Pamana ng Pagbabago Tungo sa Ganap na Kapayapaan" seeks to inform Filipinos about government programs, projects and activities on peace and order, infrastructure and development, and poverty alleviation.

In Batangas province, the caravan kicks off with an interfaith rally and unity walk at the SM City Lipa grounds, joined by the members of the Batangas Provincial Police Office, religious groups, and representatives from the provincial government agencies. The services provided include free issuance of police clearance and free haircuts. A bloodletting activity spearheaded by the Philippine Red Cross - Batangas Chapter was also held as part of the caravan.

Meanwhile, the Labor Day job and business fairs organized by the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE) Region 4-A at the Police Regional Office 4-A's headquarters in Calamba City highlights the Duterte Legacy Caravan in Laguna. More than 4,500 jobs from

In Rizal, the Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP), Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG, Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP), Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency (PDEA), and TESDA joined the Rizal Provincial Police Office at the Taytay Public Market to promote and offer various services to Rizaleños such as free health check-ups, free haircut, and issuance of police clearance. According to PIA Rizal, they also distributed food packs and footwear to residents.

The police provincial offices of Cavite and Quezon, together with their respective provincial governments, also spearheaded various activities for the joint Duterte Legacy caravan and Labor Day celebration. — FC, PIA Laguna
