Top off P7.5 B immunization budget with funds to fight fake news

Government should "top off" the proposed P7.5 billion national immunization budget for 2020 with funds for an information campaign that will roll back fake news-triggered "vaccine hesitancy" among parents.

The proposal was made by Senate President Pro Tempore Ralph Recto, who said that life-saving vaccinations "should also be inoculated against wrong information."

"Allocating funds for the purchase of vaccines is no longer enough. It should be paired with a creative information drive that will assure parents that vaccines are safe and important," Recto said.

"Kailangan ng gamot laban sa haka-haka at maling impormasyon. We should not lose the info wars against the superstition that vaccines are bad for kids," Recto said.

Recto said the immunization rate for all types of vaccines for children plunged to a low 66% last year, from a target 95% which is the accepted minimum ideal rate.

"If you extrapolate this, hundreds of thousands of children who should be immunized were not,"

The result, he said, is the Philippines landing 3rd in the highest number of measles cases globally. The number of cases had tripled and deaths had quadrupled over the past 7 months.

"Di nakapagtataka kung ang national immunization rate sharply declined to just 40 percent in the early months of this year," Recto said.

Next year's budget for the national immunization program of the Department of Health is P7.543 billion, P5 million lower than this year's.

It aims to provide 2.7 million infants with vaccines against TB, Hepa B, Diptheria, Pertussis, Tetanus, Polio, Measles, Rubella, and Influenza.

Two million infants will also be given pneumonia vaccines.

A payment solution that will make online purchases easier and more convenient for both customers and merchants has been added to OneSTore.ph, the Department of Science and Technology's (DOST) e-commerce platform for all DOST-assisted products.

The DOST signed up online payment solutions provider PayMaya to be its newest payment channel partner. The partnership is expected to enhance One-STore.ph's online market platform to accept payments for credit, debit, and with a prepaid card or e-wallet like PayMaya.

With the partnership, PayMaya will provide endto-end payment solutions for OneSTore through online store gateway checkout.

"PayMaya does the end-to-end acquiring service for DOST—we process the payment, we do fraud management, and we provide the resettlement solution for DOST," said Ma. Rocielo B. Nunez, digital portfolio manager of PayMaya Business.

Another advantage of the PayMaya's integration in OneSTore is that it makes it faster for merchants to receive settlement for their products—just a day after purchase. Currently, it takes about two months to disburse the sales from OneSTore.ph to their over 500 merchants. With PayMaya Checkout, settlement of payment for merchants can be shortened to next day after the transac-

"What we are doing right now is we are providing them with a disbursement solution so that DOST can receive the settlement [for the transaction] and process the settlement for its merchants in real-time the next day so that they do no longer have to wait for two months," added Nunez.

"We have been helping micro, small, and medium enterprises to enable them to adopt technological improvements mainly by improving the technology that they use, by giving them access to new equipment, hardware, and software. This has significantly improved their productivity, remarkably expanded their market, grew their employment figures, and of course, increased their incomes," said DOST Secretary Fortunato T. de la Peña.

The DOST chief further explained that even with well-established marketing platforms, the DOST has decided to put up its own e-commerce platform for the MSMEs that they have been assisting.

"Definitely, the payment system (PayMaya) will help a lot. It will help our clients—the merchants—and even the buyers do their purchases more conveniently," added Sec. de la Peña.

PayMaya's Founder and CEO Orlando B. Vea hailed the partnership with DOST and expressed hope that it will really enable DOST to bring technology to MSMEs.

CAVITE MULTI-SECTORAL HIV COUNCIL AND COORDINATORS MEETING



The Provincial Health Office thru its Provincial HIV Program Coordinator, Haydelisa Maderazo, facilitated the two-day Cavite Multi-sectoral HIV Council and Coordinators Meeting held at The Bayleaf Hotel, City of Gen. Trias on August 22-23, 2019. The meeting with the tagline "Act Against AIDS, End It" sought to build a more cohesive network of offices to work on the probable recommendations, programs and policies towards handling the HIV epidemic.

Issues and challenges encountered in the implementation of HIV programs and policies in cities and municipalities were tackled during the first day of the meeting. Two of the major problems cited were the conflict during the testing and screening and the referral system after the patient was diagnosed reactive. It was attended by the municipal and city

health officers, HIV program coordinator and nurses, members of POZ Cavite Support Group Incorporated (PCSGI) and members of the Provincial HIV Council. Dr. Michael Angelo Marquez, Bacoor City HIV Medical Coordinator suggested to formulate IEC materials on HIV-AIDS programs and policies with complete directories of the treatment hubs in the province. Likewise, Dr. Ferdinand Mina of Imus City Health Office recommended to have a massive HIV awareness campaign tapping the LGBT community through creation of an LGBT organization in Cavite. On the second day, Dr. Nelson Soriano, OIC-Public Health and Technical Services and Head of Provincial Epidemiology Service Unit of the PHO welcomed all the participants and challenged them to improve the HIV prevention and control programs in the province since HIV is

a big health issue. According to him, open networking like social media is big help in solving the challenges encountered. The event was also graced by Sixth District Board Member Kerby Salazar, Chairperson-Committee on Health, Nutrition and Population and expressed his observation that majority of the HIV awareness programs focused on the LGBT community. He suggested that it's time to design a program for everyone. He also stressed that more than increasing awareness, activities and programs that can help end the stigma should be formulated. BM Salazar promised that as chairperson of the committee on health, he will utilize his term to improve the healthcare and nutrition program in the province to achieve a healthy and livable Cavite. Highlight of the meeting was the presentation of the accomplishments of the Provincial HIV Program where Ms. Haydelisa Maderazo reported that they have conducted HIV awareness campaign to senior high school students from different schools in the province, out of school youths and employees of private companies from September 2018 - August 2019. Simultaneous mobile HIV counselling and testing were also done in the entire province. She also cited other HIV programs like candle lighting ceremony, Buntis Congress for both adult and teenage pregnant women and orientation in different private companies. Likewise, status and accomplishments of four treatment hubs namely, Bacoor Social Hygiene Clinic, Imus Reproductive and Wellness Center, Dasmariñas Social Hygiene Clinic and Gen. Emilio Aguinaldo Memorial Hospital Treatment Hub were discussed by their respective city HIV program coordinator. Before the meeting ended, in an open forum, Ms. Julliene Christine Aurellado, Regional HIV Program Coordinator, addressed the questions and queries raised on the first day of the meeting. The issues and challenges tackled were answered and given plausible recommendations.--PICAD
