data showed that all of these projects are in the renewable energy (RE) sector.

Eight out of the 13 projects are onshore wind, with investments amounting to PHP110.73 billion, will be located in Nueva Ecija, Zambales, Rizal, Guimaras, Negros Oriental, Agusan del Norte, and South Cotabato. Two of these projects will be located in Agusan del Norte.

Four are solar projects with combined investments of PHP88.33 billion will be built in Pangasinan, Zambales, Tarlac, and Cebu.

One offshore wind project was also endorsed for faster processing of documentary requirements which has an investment of PHP11.4 billion. It will be put up in Iloilo.

BOI, through its One-Stop Action Center

for Strategic Investments (OSAC-SI), grants green lane certificates to projects with bigger impact to the economy. The processing of their permits in the national and local government levels shall be expedited.

Meanwhile, the BOI also said it awarded a green lane certificate to A-FLOW Properties I Corp.'s 36-megawatt ML1 Data Center project in Biñan, Laguna.

The company is a joint venture of Singapore-based FLOW Digital Infrastructure and AyalaLand Logistics Holdings Corp. Its Biñan project is expected to support the country's digital infrastructure.

"The green lane certificate awarded to A-FLOW marks a significant milestone in the country's

journey towards enhanced digital connectivity. This project sets a new benchmark with its state-of-the-art ML1 Data Center in Biñan City," Trade Undersecretary and BOI Managing Head Ceferino Rodolfo said in

a statement. "Given the growing need for larger IT (information technology) capacity, A-FLOW's contribution will be vital in positioning the Philippines as a digital leader in the Asia-Pacific region." (PNA)

their sacred duties of raising much-needed resources for the benefit of the Filipino people," the Finance Chief said.

"We owe it to our taxpayers to ensure that there are no inconsistencies in our tax collections and that our tax collectors and administrators provide them with the best service possible, with all honesty and competency," he added.

The PTA is a government-owned and controlled corporation (GOCC) serving as a learning institution for tax collectors and administrators of the government and applicants from the private sector.

It develops and implements curriculums containing technical aspects of tax collection, administration, and compliance, as well as career orientation and development for its applicants.

The PTA currently comprises three institutes-- the Internal Revenue Institute (IRI) to build the employee capacities of the Bureau of Internal Revenue (BIR); the Customs Institute (CI) for the Bureau of Customs (BOC); and the

Local Government Finance Institute (LGFI) for the Bureau of Local Government Finance (BLGF) and local treasurers across the nation.

In an effort to broaden its mandate, the PTA is actively exploring opportunities to extend its services to meet the needs of other DOF-attached agencies and GOCCs, such as the National Tax Research Center (NTRC) and the Bases Conversion and Development Authority (BCDA).

Despite being a small agency, the PTA has accomplished much in 2023, demonstrating its capacity to provide learning and development on the country's tax system. Last year, the PTA trained 7,242 employees and developed an additional 53 courses and modules.

Moreover, it has partnered with six recognized academic and training institutions to capture international best practices in its curriculum.

Among the domestic institutions were the University of the Philippines Los Banos (UPLB) and the Development Academy of the Philippines (DAP).

It has also partnered with

international organizations such as the Korea International Cooperation Service through the Korea International Cooperation Agency (KOICA); the Japan Customs Training Institute through the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA); the National Tax Agency Japan through the National Tax College; and the International Monetary Fund (IMF).

The PTA also developed four good governance manuals specifically on corporate governance, quality management, employees, and merit selection.

Additionally, it has established Competency Management Systems (CMS) each for the BIR, BOC, BLGF, and the PTA, since priority competencies are the basis for the three bureaus' onboarding program.

To extend their services to the private sector and generate income, the PTA attained two Continuing Professional Development (CPD) accreditations from the CPD Council for Accountancy and the CPD Council for Customs Broker.

The Academy was also

accredited by the Philippine Regulation Commission (PRC) as a CPD training provider for the two professions.

Furthermore, five CPD courses have been developed by the PTA, such as the local government unit (LGU) Responsible Financing Seminar with 24 CPD creditable units, and the Tax Exemption Compliance with 4 courses.

On August 15, 2024, the PTA passed the Stage 2 audit conducted by the third-party Certifying Body (TUV Nord) and was recommended for issuance to ISO 9001:2015.

Joining Secretary Recto in the meeting were Chief-of-Staff and Undersecretary Maria Luwalhati Dorotan Tiuseco and Policy Development and Management Service Group OIC-Undersecretary Niño Raymond B. Alvina.

Attendees from the PTA side included President Gil Beltran; Local Government Finance Institute Chancellor Ma. Teresa Habitan; Customs Institute Chancellor Noemi Alcala-Garcia; Customs Institute Vice Chancellor Elizabeth Pableo; and Director Ma. Luisa Notario.

CSC launches nationwide tree-growing initiative for 124th PCSA

The Civil Service Commission (CSC) will lead a nationwide tree-growing initiative from September 15 to 21, 2024 in celebration of the 124th Philippine Civil Service Anniversary (PCSA).

The CSC said participants will get a certificate of participation while a certificate of appreciation will be awarded to partner agencies and stakeholders.

PBBM urges heightened storm preparedness, flood safety measures

President Ferdinand Marcos Jr. has reiterated the importance of storm preparedness and flood warnings to safeguard communities against extreme weather disasters.

The President delivered this message during a situation briefing on Friday at the Ynares Event Center in Antipolo City.

The briefing, attended by cabinet secretaries and local officials led by Rizal Governor Nina Ricci Ynares, focused on assessing the widespread destruction caused by Tropical Storm Enteng and the intensified South-west Monsoon in the province, as well as ongoing emergency response efforts.

President Marcos directed national and local government units to work closely together to ensure swift assistance to those affected by Enteng.

Expressing concern over the gravity of the situation, President Marcos remarked: "The severity of this crisis exceeds our projections. It is imperative that we go above and beyond to address the challenges posed by these calamities."

The President highlighted the necessity for the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) to continue distributing relief goods, while emphasizing the essential roles of the Department of Environ-



ment and Natural Resources (DENR) and the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) in carrying out clearing operations.

In addition, the President emphasized the urgency of enhancing infrastructure to bolster communities against future flooding risks, including the construction of additional dams and the expansion of the Wawa Dam Project.

The Rizal provincial government disclosed plans for an integrated flood mitigation strategy aimed at enhancing structural flood controls, pre-

serving watershed integrity, and implementing robust community planning.

This includes fortifying drainage systems from Teresa to Morong and constructing a spillway to the Morong River.

Governor Ynares acknowledged the situation remains severe as authorities strive to address extensive damage and aid displaced residents.

The flooding and landslides have claimed the lives of 12 individuals, while three persons remain missing and five residents have sustained injuries. Some 10,313 families, totaling 33,480 individuals moved to 171 evacuation centers throughout the province, with 59 centers remaining active. The estimated infrastructure damage is valued at Php314 million while agricultural losses are estimated at Php30 million. (MBL/PIA - Rizal)
