President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. is set to leave the country tonight to participate in the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN)-European Union (EU) Commemorative Summit Commemorative Summit in Brussels, Belgium.

In a pre-departure briefing on Friday, Department of Foreign Affairs (DFA) Assistant Secretary Daniel Espiritu said, the President will meet with the business community and have oneon-one meetings with corporations looking to expand their presence in the Philippines.

Espiritu said, apart from one-on-one meetings, there will also be a meeting with the business sector within the framework of the ASEAN-EU dialogue partnership relations.

The President is expected to participate at the C-Suite or CEO Suite Luncheon for the EU-ASEAN Business Summit and

"Our pursuit of reform-oriented service towards public trust is also evident in the 2023 proposed national budget which was crafted to ensure that no one will be left behind - from our public servants including our uniformed personnel to the public we are sworn to protect," she said. She also expressed her full support to the PNPA's Cadetship Program to develop professional, morally upright and dedicated public safety officers imbued with the values of justice, integrity, and service.

Under the proposed national budget, the DBM has allocated a total of P191.85 billion for the PNP.

A total of P27.79 billion was allocated the Bureau of Fire Protection while P22.34 billion was allotted for the Bureau of Jail Management and Penology.

"This will be a very busy trip for the President, and we hope that this will redound to a lot of benefits for the Filipino people, not only for ASEAN," Espiritu said.

He said business meetings on the sidelines of the ASE-AN)-EU Commemorative Summit will yield more investments and jobs for Filipinos as the President will have the opportunity to expand on trade and investment policies during the business roundtable with the EU and European corporations.

Espiritu said there would also be networking among Filipino and European businessmen.

"Hopefully, for this networking, the Filipino businessmen will be able to come up with deals with their European counterparts," he said.

On the President's meeting with multinational consumer goods company, Unilever, the DFA official described it as vital since the firm intends to establish a new state-of-the-art manufacturing facility for personal care products in Cavite province.

"So expansion of investments ito 'no to the tune of P4.7 billion. Now it is expected to generate at least 130 projected employment for the Philippines," Espiritu said.

The chief executive is also expected to meet with a shipbuilding and navigation and logistics company that seeks to develop a shipyard with an investment of P1.5 billion, which will create 500 to 600 direct and indirect jobs.

An infrastructure and renewable energy company, which intends to invest in the renewable energy sector in the Philippines, would also meet one-on-one with the President.

The chief executive is also expected to meet with a wholesale market and international logistics hub management company which intends to establish agrologistics at the New Clark City that will build and operate a wholesale market for fresh products with an organized and efficient food supply and value chain.

participating banks' available ATMs and online & mobile platforms to make their banking transactions apart from having a valid government-issued ID.

"The UMID ATM Pay Card Program aims to promote the accurate and timely payment of SSS benefits and loans to rightful recipients. It is a step towards the national government, the SSS, and its partners' shared goals of greater financial inclusion and payments digitalization," SSS President and CEO Michael G. Regino said.

"Currently, SSS is offering UMID ATM Pay Cards that are linked to a regular savings account, with the Union Bank of the Philippines (UBP) as the first participating bank," he added.

UBP has made ready an initial one million UMID ATM Cards for those who have not been issued the UMID cards.

"The UBP will also allow those with pending generic UMID cards for production to avail of this upgrade for free. To do so, they must give their Data Sharing Consent through the Services Tab of their My.SSS Web Portal account and undergo the electronic Know-Your-Customer (eKYC) process through the online or mobile platform of the UBP," Regino said. Members who will avail of said card this year will also receive a 200 Jollibee e-Gift Certificate and the chance to win a Mitsubishi Xpander from the UBP upon the activation of their account and funding it with 1,000. This UBP promo runs up to February 28, 2023, only.

By the first quarter of 2023, Rizal Commercial Banking Corporation (RCBC) will also be ready to issue UMID ATM Pay Cards to SSS members.

"In the coming months, we will continue to pursue partnerships with other financial institutions to provide our members with more options for this program," Regino said. "As soon as a substantial percentage of the UMID ATM Pay Cards are issued, SSS would start re-carding the rest of the issued 13 million generic UMID cards," he added.

The SSS encourages all members to register to the My.SSS Portal at www.sss. gov.ph, and enroll their updated contact information, including mobile numbers and email addresses, in their account for them to receive important announcements and updates regarding the UMID ATM Pay Card and other SSS information.

For proper coordination, the Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Coordinators in schools must work closely with the school heads for its "planning, implementation and monitoring." "These drills are to ensure that learners are properly guided on what should be done during and after an earthquake or occurrences of fire in schools,"

"All schools in the National Capital Region (NCR), Rizal, Cavite, Laguna, and Bulacan, shall create a separate and specific disaster plan earthquake," it added. DepEd ordered schools to disclose these plans in detail, in case it involves "mass casualties."

"The plan shall specifically lay down the response should there be a scenario involving mass casualties of learners and personnel," it said. House pushes for creation of e-commerce bureau

The House of Representatives on Monday approved on final reading the proposed Internet Transactions Act, which is a priority legislation of President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. in his first State of the Nation Address. During Monday's plenary session, a total of 245 lawmakers voted in favor of House Bill 4, which seeks to create an electronic commerce (e-commerce) bureau to protect consumers and merchants engaged in internet transactions. No lawmaker voted against the measure or abstained from voting. It was authored principally by Speaker Martin Romualdez, Senior Deputy Majority Leader Sandro Marcos and Tingog party-list Reps. Yedda Marie Romualdez and Jude Acidre. In his sponsorship speech, Batangas Rep. Mario Vittorio Mariño said the bill seeks to regulate all business-to-business and business-to-consumer commercial transactions over the internet, including those related to internet retail, online travel services, digital media providers, ride hailing services and digital financial services. The proposed e-commerce bureau will serve as the "central authority" tasked to regulate online trade and


