SSS releases P11.80-B maternity benefits from Jan-Nov 2022

The Social Security System (SSS) disclosed on Thursday that it released a total of P11.80 billion through the 309,189 maternity benefit claims it received from January to November 2022.

SSS President and CEO Michael G. Regino mentioned that maternity benefit claims have accounted for around 5% of the SSS' total benefit disbursements of P236.27 billion for said period. This is the third highest amount of disbursement among the seven benefit programs and the highest among short-term benefits.

"We recognize the important role of women in our society, and it is an honor to be able to assist more of our female members through the Maternity Benefit Program," Regino said. "We hope that with the implemen-

The Communications, Navigation, and Surveillance/Air Traffic Management (CNS/ATM) System was a P10.8-billion project financed by the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) that was completed on October 2017.

The CNS/ATM system provides various computer-aided safety measures in Air Traffic Control (ATC), and enhances safety through reduction of controller/pilot workloads and human errors. The new ATM System introduced Air Traffic Flow Management (ATFM) and Air Space Management (ASM) functions, which optimize the use of airport capacity and the efficient use of airspace, hence minimizing delays and allowing more

CALAMBA CITY, Laguna (PIA) — Minimum wage earners in Calabarzon will get an increase of P23 to P48 in their daily take-home pay following the implementation of the second tranche of a wage order.

The Regional Tripartite Wages and Productivity Board (RTWPB) IV-A announced on Tuesday, January 3 that Wage Order IVA-19 previously signed in May 2022 took effect last Decem-

DPWH heeds PBBM directive to build bridges, farm-to-market roads

The Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) has heeded the directive of President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. to make life easier for common folks as the agency continues to build, upgrade and rehabilitate bridges, flood control structures and school buildings.

Through a budget provided by the Department of Agriculture, the DPWH built some 75 kilometers of farm-to-markets roads from July to November this year

as part of President Marcos' pledge to help farmers transport their harvest to public markets. To ensure the unhampered transport of goods and services in the provinces, the DPWH built, upgraded, and rehabilitated a total of 112 bridges, 650 flood control structures as well as 2,575 school buildings for use of public school students.

The DPWH has also played an active role in disaster response like what it did in the aftermath of the magnitude 7.3 earthquake in Abra where the agency deployed thousands of personnel to help in the search, rescue and relief efforts.

In its report to Malacañang, the DPWH said it deployed more than 7,000 personnel as the government responded to several disaster areas brought about by earthquakes and the successive typhoons that hit the country this year.

Aside from personnel deployment, the DPWH also dispatched 1,711 pieces of equipment and cleared 168 road sections in multiple provinces from Luzon to Mindanao. Responding to

the President's call to build high-quality and efficient infrastructure, the DPWH said in its accomplishment report that it has so far constructed, maintained and rehabilitated 1,105 kilometers of roads from July to November this year.

The DPWH's major infrastructure projects include the Cavite-Laguna Expressway, NLEX-SLEX Connector Road, Central Luzon Link Expressway, Cagayan de Oro River Flood Man-

Also on the DPWH list are road network development projects in conflict-affected areas in Mindanao, Laguna-Lakeshore Network, Bataan-Cavite Interlink Bridge, Panguil Bay Bridge, Samal Island-Davao City Bridge and the Davao City Bypass Construction project. The agency's key priority programs under the administration's 8-point socioeconomic agenda include a traffic decongestion program through the construction of high-standard highways and expressways, bypasses, diversion roads, flyovers and interchanges.

The DPWH is also actively involved in the Integrated and Seamless Transport System Program such as improving the Daang Maharlika, construction of inter-island linkages and mega bridges, and connecting gaps along national roads. Through its Rural Roads Convergence Program, the DPWH will construct and upgrade access roads leading to tourism destinations, industry and trade corridors, RORO ports, airports and railway stations.

To support the Agri-infrastructure Support Program, farm-to-market and farm-to-mill roads will be built, based on the DPWH program. The DPWH also has programs on flood management, water management and basic social infrastructure support that will create more livable, sustainable and resilient communities. (PND)

ber 30. Minimum wage earners in the region have already received an additional P3 to P49 daily increase during the first tranche of the wage order last year.

The new minimum wage rate in the non-agricultural sector is set to P470 in the extended metropolitan area which includes the cities of Bacoor, Imus, and Dasmarinas in Cavite; Binan and San Pedro in Laguna; Antipolo City, Cainta, and Taytay in Rizal.

Component cities and first class municipalities will receive a P28 wage increase or P429 daily rate.

Wage rate in the second and third class municipalities workers was set to P390 while the rate in the fourth to 6th class municipalities was set to P350.

Meanwhile, agricultural workers in the extended metropolitan area and component cities will now receive P429 daily; workers in first class municipalities will get P390 daily; those in second to sixth class municipalities will receive P350 daily.

Those in the retail and service establishments with not more than 10 workers will receive an across-theboard increase of P23 giving them a P350 daily wage rate.

The minimum wage rate is given to employees who work for not exceeding eight hours a day.

According to the RTWPB IV-A, the wage hike is the government's response to the lower purchasing power of the peso, two-tiered wage system, poverty threshold, impact of the COVID-19 pandemic, comparability of wages vis-a-vis benchmark regions, and the dispersal of industries across the region. Communications (CPDLC), the CNS/ATM is able to cover 100% of the remaining oceanic airspace, hence increasing air traffic safety and capacity in the oceanic region of the Manila FIR.

The system was inaugurated on 16 January 2018 and commenced comprehensive operations on 26 July 2019.

The incident that resulted in the loss of power in the system was due to a problem in the system's electrical network, with its uninterruptible power supply (UPS), which is to be used as backup power supply, also failing. The main cause of the power supply problem is still being determined and is subject for investigation. The CAAP's Aerodrome and Air Navigation Safety Oversight Office (AANSOO) will be tasked to investigate the incident.

CAAP recognizes that the system is already behind when it was first used in 2019 and has made recommendations to the President on improving the country's air traffic management system.

Despite the circumstances, CAAP, alongside concerned authorities, has ensured that no aircraft or passengers were harmed. CAAP is grateful to its air traffic management officers, air navigation system officers, and other staff involved in ensuring that the country's air traffic maintained its safety in spite of the power failure encountered by the system.

As we continue to work

to guarantee the safe return of normal flight operations, the Authority would also like to apologize and thank affected passengers for their patience in this unfortunate event.

The Philippine Air Traffic Management Center (ATMC), which houses the equipment to the system, resumed partial operations with limited capacity at 4:00PM and normal operations have resumed as of 5:50PM on 1 January 2022.

Philippine Airlines flight 222 (4:55PM) and Cathay Pacific flight 930 (5:33PM) were the first flights to respectively land and take off at NAIA after the airport resumed normal operations. (CAAP)

tation of Republic Act Nos. 11199 and 11210 last 2019, they will feel more supported by getting enough time and financial assistance as they care of their children, while they start to regain their health and overall wellness before resuming paid work."

The provisions of the Republic Act No. 11199 or the Social Security Act of 2018 included the increase in the maximum monthly salary credit (MSC) considered in the computation of benefits under the regular SSS program from P16,000 to P20,000, and an increase in the minimum MSC for the computation of benefits every other year from 2019 to 2025, among others.

In addition, Republic Act No. 11210 or the 105-day Expanded Maternity Leave Law (EMLL), extended the

number of compensable days of maternity leave from 60 days for normal delivery and 78 days for caesarian section delivery to 105 days for live childbirth, regardless of the type of delivery - with an additional 15 days if the female worker qualifies as a solo parent. The law also extended the maternity benefit to every instance of pregnancy, miscarriage, or emergency termination of pregnancy, regardless of frequency, from the previous limit of only the first four deliveries or miscarriages. Contingencies covered by the EMLL are those from March 11, 2019

As a result of said enhancements, the SSS has recorded higher maternity benefit disbursements in the succeeding years. Currently, the maximum maternity

benefit a qualified female member may receive is P70,000 (or P80,000 for solo parents). Prior to said laws, the maximum was P32,000 for normal deliveries and P41,600 for caesarian section deliveries. Moreover, from January to November 2022, the SSS has disbursed a monthly average of P1.07 billion maternity benefits, with 28,108 claims processed, which is 82.1% higher than its corresponding monthly average in 2018 of P588.84 million with 27,193 claims.

"While we look forward to providing a more meaningful social security protection for our members, especially during their maternity leaves and other contingencies that result in loss of income, it is also part of our duty to ensure the sustainability of our funds," Regino explained. The scheduled increases in the contribution rate as well as the adjustments in the minimum and maximum MSCs every other year from 2019 to 2025, as specified under RA No. 11199, form part of the measures to strengthen the SSS

In January 2023, the SSS will increase its contribution rate by 1%, making it 14% from the previous 13%. The employer's share of the contribution will then go up to 9.5%, while the employee's share will remain at 4.5%. Self-employed, voluntary, and land-based Overseas Filipino Worker members, on the other hand, will shoulder the 1% increase. The minimum and maximum MSCs will also increase from P3,000 to P4,000 and P25,000 to P30,000, respectively.

DSWD showcases social technologies in expo

The Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), through its Social Technology Bureau (STB), launched this month an exposition showcasing its developed social technologies that address issues on child labor, children in conflict with the law, mental health and psychosocial support, sectors in street situations and reintegration of recovering persons and children who used drugs (RPWUDS)

Entitled "2022 Social Technology (ST) Expo", the activity carried the theme "STB Goes Digital: Improving Lives of the Filipinos through Social Technologies," which emphasized the DSWD's commitment to innovate and make programs and services relevant to the current needs of the department's target sectors.

The STB is DSWD's program development arm and is responsible for the research to study current social welfare and development issues and trends and identify possible interventions by developing

appropriate and responsive programs and policies.

The programs that were showcased in the expo were the pilot-tested programs such as the Wireless Mental Health and Psychosocial Support for Individuals and Families Affected by Covid-19 and other Crisis Situations (WiSUPPORT Program), Yakap Bayan Program (YBP), Buklod Paglaom para sa Children in Conflict with the Law, Strategic Helpdesk for Education, Information and other Developmental Interventions Against Child Labor (SHIELD Against Child Labor Program) and Comprehensive Program for Children, Families and Indigenous Peoples in Street Situations (COMPRE Program).

In his message delivered by the Municipal Social Welfare and Development Officer Arnold Enriquez, San Juan, Batangas Mayor Ildebrando Salud thanked the DSWD for the YBP model building in the

He said through the YBP, the town provided the neces-



sary interventions to ensure the reintegration of the RPWUDs.

Salud said YBP has transformed the lives of 43 RP-WUDs.

He also added that in their town, they embrace RPWUDs with the goal of transforming them into volunteers, then advocates and eventually leaders in the community.

Meanwhile, Zamboanga City Social Welfare and Development Officer, Ma. Soccoro Roxas also thanked the DSWD for the COMPRE Program.

Based on the LGU's expe-

rience, she said the program is responsive to the needs of the individuals and families living on the streets, especially the Sama Bajau.

Through the program, the Sama Bajau are provided with appropriate skills training to help them in their livelihood while their children are guided in their studies.

Roxas highlighted the significance of using the whole of nation approach as the best way to help the indigenous peoples (IPs), saying it takes a village to rear a child, but it will take the entire government to help the IPs for them to be away from street situations.

As part of the expo, the DSWD also recognized the partner-agencies and organizations which contributed to the success of the whole process of developing social technologies from conceptualization and design to adoption and replication.

In her message, Standards and Capacity Building Group Undersecretary Denisse Bragas said: "We are honored and pleased to share that all throughout this social technology process, you, our partners, have continuously provided technical assistance and resource augmentation, manifested strong support and adopted/replicated social technologies in your respective localities. Hence, it is right and just for you to be recognized for your untiring commitment and contribution along social technology development."

In accepting the recognition, Michelle Lang-Alli, US-AID Director for Health Programs, thanked the DSWD.

"I think this is an incredible innovation," Lang-Alli said, referring to the DSWD programs and services that are available online.

Also highlighting the event was the introduction of the website which showcases all the social technologies developed by the DSWD-STB that can be accessed 24/7 by all intermediaries. Another project that can be looked forward to by stakeholders in 2023 is the Learning Management Sys-
