

Cavite-Bataan Bridge Project Moves Forward as 8 Firms Bid on First Phase

The race to build the foundation of the nation's most ambitious bridge project is now on, with eight major construction giants submitting financial bids for the first segment of the Bataan-Cavite Interlink Bridge.

In a public bid opening live-streamed on social media last September 30, the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) unveiled the contenders for Contract Package 1. This high-stakes competition underscores the scale of an infrastructure project poised to transform

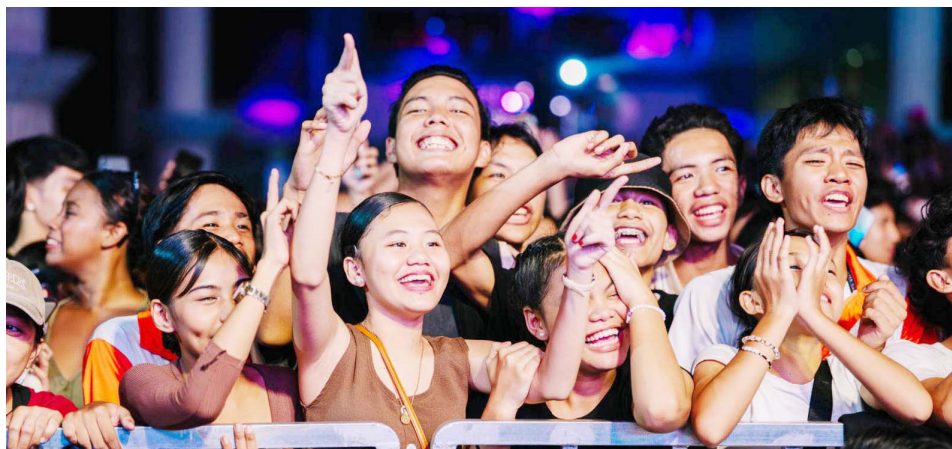

PGC Brings Free Medical and Dental Services to Tanza



Tanza Convention Center, September 13, 2025 – Residents of Tanza received free medical and dental services during a mission organized by the Provincial Government of Cavite (PGC) as part of the nationwide “Handog ng Pangulo: Serbisyong Sapat Para sa Lahat” program.

A total of 346 patients benefited, including 320 who had medical consultations and 26 who received dental care. Health workers from the Office of the Provincial Health Officer provided care, along with free medicines and vitamins for patients.

This initial phase, with an approved agency estimate of PHP 7.25 billion, focuses on constructing the "Bataan Land Approach." This includes a network of interchanges and viaducts that will form the critical connection from the bridge to the road network in Bataan. For Cavite residents, the progress on the Bataan side signals that the entire 32.15-kilometer project is advancing from blueprint

to reality. Once complete, the Bataan-Cavite Interlink Bridge will be the longest water-spanning bridge in the Philippines, turning what is currently a lengthy

journey into a direct and convenient link, unlocking new economic opportunities for the province. (Source: Philippine News Agency)
