CALAMBA CITY, Laguna - The Calabarzon Region gained 1,990,992 new registered voters from February to Sept. 30 this year, bringing the total voter count to 9,761,170.

The significant increase reinforced Region 4-A's position as the country's top vote-rich region, according to Commission on Elections (Comelec) Assistant

> Cortez said the surge registration makes Calabarzon one of the most influential voting regions in the country.

Cavite has 2,460,981 registered voters across municipalities and Election data for 2022 seven cities, covering eight congressional districts; voters in 24 municipalities and six cities, with six congressional districts; Batangas 1,968,785 registered voters across 31 municipalities and three cities, with six congressional districts; Rizal 1,681,529 registered voters in 13 municipalities and one city, comprising six congressional

and two cities, with four congressional districts.

Cortez said 75 (61 males and 14 females) are competing for seats in 31 congressional districts.

In the race for the five gubernatorial positions, 28 candidates are running, while 22 are contesting for five vice gubernatorial posts.

To ensure transparency and integrity in the upcoming elections, Cortez said Comelec plans to

conduct a voter education caravan. The initiative will introduce voters to the new automated counting machines and provide handson demonstrations.

"We are going to demonstrate the actual voting process using the new machines in every barangay (village) in the region," she said. (PNA)

This will be our early Christmas gift to the residents of the area," Bautista said in a Palace press briefing With the opening of Phase 1, some six kilometers will be added to the transit

line, connecting Baclaran Station in Pasay City to Dr. Santos (formerly Sucat) Station in Parañaque City.

The new segment will feature five new stations under Phase 1 include Redemptorist Aseana Station, MIA Road Station, PITX Station, Ninoy Aquino Avenue Station, and Dr. Santos Station. With this, travel time from Quezon City to Paranague City will now be reduced to less than an hour, Light Rail Manila Corp. president and chief executive officer Enrico Benipayo said.

Once Phase 1 is operational, the extended LRT-1 is projected to add around 80,000 passengers daily during the first year of operations.

Average ridership of LRT-1 now is around 320,000 daily. The second phase of LRT 1 Cavite extension consists of Las Piñas station and Zapote station while the third and last phase is the Niog station. (PNA)

The PCO said the NEDA Board also gave its nod to the change in the scope of work, particularly the widening of diversion channels and additional drainage channels.

Another adjustment was a loan reallocation totaling JPY1.042 billion from consulting services (JPY 384 billion) and contingencies.

"I think maybe the detailed engineering had to compensate for weather changes. And then the housing, wala 'yung housing sa (the housing was not included in the) original estimate," Marcos said during the meeting, as quoted by the

"The cost will be increased. At least the local component will be increased from the original. That's the only thing that sticks out on the financial analysis. But it's still within the guidelines," he added. As of Sept. 30, 2024, the CIA-FRIMP has an overall physical accomplishment of 44.21 percent, with negative slippage of 55.79 percent. It has a fund utilization rate of 35.42 percent, or PHP3.503 billion already disbursed.

The NEDA Board also approved the changes in scope of work, such as the design of the Middle Marikina River, modifications in drainage facilities, and additional work.

A loan reallocation totaling JPY3.373 billion from consulting services billion) (JPY1.728 (JPY1.645 contingencies billion) to the civil works component was also approved by the NEDA Board, including a supplemental loan of JPY45.759 billion.

The PMRCIP aims to mitigate flood damage in Metro Manila caused by channel overflow of the Pasig-Marikina River.

The project is seen to benefit residents of the cities of Pasig, Marikina, and Quezon in Metro Manila and the municipalities of Taytay and Cainta in Rizal.

"Ang concern ko rin (My

other concern) is the design. Does it take into account the new weather? Because ano na 'yan, danger area na 'yang Marikina talaga (The danger area is really in Marikina). The levels of water in the last two big typhoons we had, we came to within half a meter of the limit bago mag spillover," Marcos said.

Public Works and Highways Secretary Manuel Bonoan told Marcos that the design of the project helped in stopping spillover during the recent typhoons.

"The other component that we are looking into the Pasig-Marikina River is actually the construction of the three dams in the [watershed]," Bonoan said.

Apart from changes in the two flood control projects, the NEDA Board also approved the implementation of the locally financed Philippine Exhibition International Center Project, and the acquisition of 40 units of fast patrol crafts to be funded through official development assistance (ODA). (PNA)

LEPTOSPIROSIS: A DEADLY DISEASE

WHENEVER there is heavy rain caused by a typhoon in the country accompanied by flow of flood water that plunges everywhere, this is where people start to get the deadly disease called "Leptospirosis" if not immediately preventable through consultation and treatment. At a time when there is a water nature



of catastrophe rainfalls and typhoons that come to the country, it is not really avoidable to go down in the flood water especially when there are things and property that want to be saved from getting wet and drowning.

Leptospirosis is a serious infection of the human body caused by leptospira bacteria. It is usually obtained from flood water contaminated from the stones that animals pass out during their urination.

It is said that it takes a long time for these bacteria to die from the urine of infected animals, especially rats that mix with flood water, especially during the rainy season and typhoons, leptospirosis is really rampant in

Besides mice, other animals such as pigs, cows, goats, horses, dogs and others can also be carriers of leptospira bacteria. So each of us should be careful because it is difficult to get sick.

It is important to be alert and watchful for any symptoms of leptospirosis, it's really different when someone knows how to prevent the harmful bacteria from waiting to lead to complications if rushed into flood water when there is a wound on the leg, foot, knees and any part of the body.

Because human health can be infected by leptospira bacteria when contaminated water gets inside the mouth, nose, eyes, and open wounds on the body's skin. So immediately consult an authorized medical doctor to be given a prescription against leptospirosis.

The said leptospirosis is possibly transmitted from the bite of rats and drinking water contaminated with the urine of rats. This disease can also be acquired by a person from another person with the leptospira bacteria, and it is also possible to get it through sex. Even if the mother breastfeeds her baby if she has leptospira disease it is not far that the baby will also have it.

Following this, victims of leptospirosis need to go to the nearest hospitals and health centers so that those experiencing symptoms of leptospirosis can be given the appropriate medicine to prevent it from getting worse.

For those who are in a hurry to recover immediately, just remember that you need a consultation and prescription from authorized doctors before buying Doxycycline and don't take it lightly, because you need proof of prescribed medicine by the physician/doctor for taking antibiotics to fast recover from the leptospirosis.

When walking is not important, leptospirosis can be avoided if anyone does not willingly step into dirty floodwater that may be contaminated with animal urine. But if wading through the flood is unavoidable, wear protection such as boots to prevent infection.

Anyone who experiences symptoms of leptospirosis, is advised to consult a doctor immediately so that the said illness can be properly treated because it is necessary to protect oneself against the disease of leptospirosis in order to maintain good health.

Upang lubos na pagaanin ang gastos sa gamutan, itinaas kamakailan ng Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PhilHealth) ang pakete nito sa severe o malubhang dengue sa P47,000 mula sa dating P16,000 simula Nobyembre 1, 2024.

Kasunod ito ng naunang pagtataas sa benepisyo para sa dengue na mayroon o walang sintomas sa P13,000 mula sa dating P10,000 noong Pebrero 14, 2024.

"Patuloy na nakasuporta ang PhilHealth sa mga Pilipino lalo na sa mga panahong laganap ang pagkakasakit. Sa halos dobleng pagtaas ng benepisyo para sa malulubhang kaso ng dengue, umaasa kaming mababawasan nang malaki ang pasanin ng mga pasyente at kanilang pamilya," pahayag ni PhilHealth President at CEO Emmanuel R. Ledesma, Jr.

"Kapag may mga sintomas na ng dengue, huwag na po kayong magdalawang-isip. Huwag matakot sa pagpapagamot, sagot kayo ng PhilHealth.", dagdag pa niya.

Ayon sa Department of Health noong Oktubre 4, 2024, umabot na sa 269,467 ang mga kaso ng dengue sa buong bansa, kung saan ang National Capital Region ay dineklara na sa alert level da-
