Our Hotel in Buenos Aires: The Alvear Palace Hotel

The Alvear Palace is a 5-star hotel located in the stylish La Recoleta neighborhood, surrounded by restaurants, shops, and just five minutes away from the financial district. It is a smoke-free property with free WIFI. The hotel features grand French-inspired public areas and 192 gracious guestrooms and suites, all decorated in a modern French style. A buffet breakfast is available each morning at the property. It also features a luxurious Spa and Fitness Center, which includes a vitality pool, sauna, steam bath, body and face treatments, Kinesis, and high-tech fitness equipment.



Day 1: Thursday, November 5

The flight will depart from the US on November 4, with an early morning arrival in Buenos Aires on November 5. We have arranged accommodations starting from the 4th, allowing us to check in as soon as we arrive. Transportation from the airport will be provided.

Take the morning to relax, explore the charming Recoleta neighborhood, or enjoy the hotel's gym or spa facilities.

We will meet in the lobby at 11:45 am to set off to the Art Fair.

12:00 pm : Guided Tour of Arte BA Art Fair during the VIP opening.

The fair continues its 35+ year legacy as a regional benchmark for contemporary Argentine and Latin American art, bringing together galleries, artistic projects, and thousands of visitors. Here is a [link](#) to the website for your perusal.

1:30 pm: Lunch at the Fair: [Barreto](#) is located in the heart of La Rural, the historic exhibition grounds traditionally known for showcasing Argentina's award-winning cattle. While it continues to serve that purpose, La Rural also hosts major events, including the renowned arteBA art fair. The restaurant's menu highlights Argentina's celebrated beef but also offers a variety of fish, vegetarian, and other options, ensuring that all dietary preferences and restrictions can be accommodated.

3:00 pm: Continue exploring the Art Fair

Two optional times to return to the hotel: 4:30 pm and 5:30 pm.

Since we will all be tired, the evening is free.



Day 2: Friday, November 6 – Historic Center, San Telmo Area

9:30 am: Departure from the hotel

10:00 am: We will visit the Balanz Collection. The Balanz Collection includes more than 450 works by artists from around the world. Founded in 2008 by Isabel Pita and Claudio Porcel, the company began as a personal exploration of collecting and quickly became a key part of its culture, bringing art into the world of finance and investment. Initially focused on Latin American art, the collection has evolved into an international collection without regional or stylistic boundaries.

11:00 am: A guided walking tour of the Historic Center.

12:30: Lunch at Caseros - a Michelin Guide restaurant in San Telmo. This family-run restaurant combines a warm, retro atmosphere with classic Argentine home cooking. The menu features simple, flavorful dishes made with local ingredients, alongside freshly baked breads, pastries, and desserts displayed in its large front windows. Favorites include the warm prawn salad, eggplant Parmesan, and spinach malfatti

2:00 pm: Private curator-led visit of the
[Museo de Arte Moderno de Buenos Aires](#)

3:30 pm: Walk through San Telmo and visit
one or two galleries

5:00 pm. Visit the Colección Brun
Cattaneo. Curated by Andrés Brun and
Juan José Cattaneo, it is a prominent
private contemporary art collection based
in Buenos Aires. It is highly regarded for its
deep focus on Argentine and regional art,
with particular emphasis on contemporary
painting, installation, and performance art.

Day 3: Saturday, November 7 : La Boca, art Foundations and Contemporary Art

9:30 am: Departure from the hotel

10:00 am: walking tour of Caminito and the Historic Neighborhood of La Boca. Founded in 1536, Buenos Aires grew rapidly in the mid-19th century as international trade expanded. The port neighborhood of La Boca became home to thousands of Italian and Spanish immigrants who worked along the Riachuelo River. Using leftover ship paint and salvaged materials, they created the brightly colored buildings that still define the area today. La Boca's most famous attraction is El Caminito, a colorful pedestrian street named after a popular 1926 tango.

11:00 am: tour of the [Fundacion Laviere](#). The Larivière Foundation lies in the neighborhood of La Boca, in the City of Buenos Aires, the repository of a large and highly relevant collection of 20th-century Latin American photography, representing a space for the community to enjoy.

12:00 pm: tour of the [Fundacion Proa](#). The 20-year-old private museum is known for its groundbreaking exhibits from world-famous vanguard artists. The contemporary arts center features installations that use innovative technologies and performance art, while the permanent collection includes works by renowned Latin American artists.

1:00 pm Lunch at Fundacion Proa

3:00 pm: Visit the Tedesco Private Collection. This one of the most significant private holdings of contemporary Argentine art. Assembled by plastic surgeon and collector Esteban Tedesco, it features thousands of works—including paintings, sculptures, and installations—that document the evolution of Argentine artists over recent decades.

Casa Cavia boasts an elegantly classic interior which combines with the contemporary decor, but what is particularly striking here is the delightful terrace to the rear (embellished with a water feature in the middle) that has become a trendy setting where people come to eat but also to be seen. Now with chef Félix Babini behind the stove to provide a more unique perspective, the cuisine is understood as a living territory, a constant reflection of the season, contemporary sensibility and profound expertise.
