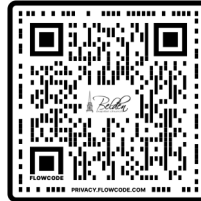

From the Pastor's Desk

Greetings Faith Family,

As we step into a new year together, I'm thankful for what God has done in our church family—and I'm expectant for what He wants to do next. January always invites us to refocus: not just on routines and resolutions, but on our purpose. At Belden Baptist Church, our mission is clear: **Building relationships that lead people to become passionate followers of Christ.** This year, that mission calls us to lift our eyes beyond ourselves and look with compassion toward our community.

Here's the challenge I want to put in front of every member of BBC as we begin 2026:

1) Pray for gospel opportunities—daily.
