Make this Easter a game-changer for you and your family.

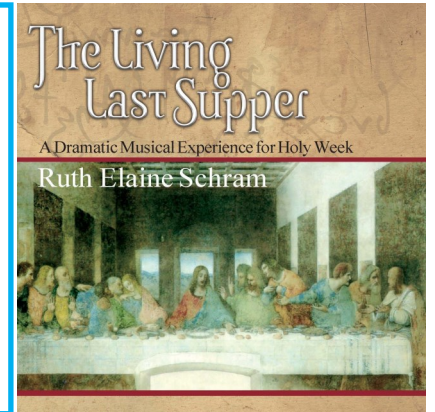

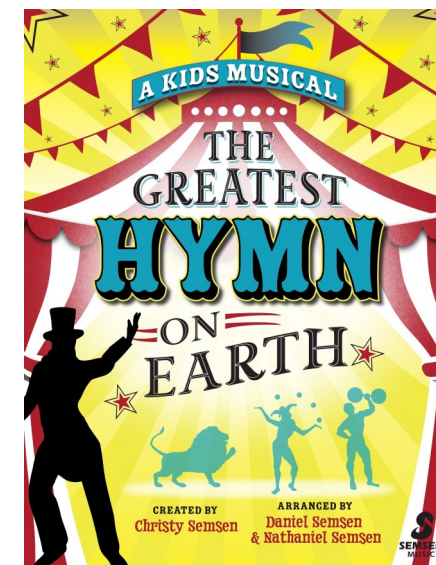
