Kennel Quilts - Stephany Wisecarver

I received a whopping 44 kennel quilts at the March meeting. Hooray! That's 44 pets having a cozier stay waiting for a forever home. Many, many thanks!

A note regarding kennel quilts for disasters. I was able to get in touch with the official Kennel Quilts program coordinator. (That is the program that posts the requirements for the kennel quilts that are sent to shelters housing pets from disaster areas and also posts addresses for quilters to send their quilts to.) She sent me a very nice email praising us for our efforts to help local shelters. But, she said, they are unable to use our quilts since they are not 100% cotton on advice from their veterinarian. If anyone would like to make 100% cotton kennel quilts for disasters pets please visit the kennel quilts website—kennel quilts.com. As a result of this communication our guild will just distribute our kennel pet products to local shelters.

Quick reminder- kennel quilts are 12" x 18", no binding, sewn and quilted with small (2mm) stitches , made from any washable fabric with no loosely wove thread for animals to catch their claws on. Fleecies are fringed approximately 20" square. Flannels are enveloped, same finished dimensions and also stitched about 2" from each side.

Evening Escapes: Wine, Dine, and Stitch. The April gathering is sold out. Watch for the next one at www.vaquiltmuseum.org.









- Cotton Clothesline...7/32" or 1/4"
