Kennel Quilts - Stephany Wisecarver

Hi Quilters! As you may recall I put out a call for kennel quilts to be sent to shelters helping pets affected by the California fires. Unfortunately we had no meeting on Feb 13 so I was unable to collect them that day. On the bee days in Jan and Feb ladies brought in 31!! Woohoo! I will still be accepting quilts at the next meeting. Unfortunately we missed the window for the fire emergency need, so I will put them aside for the next emergency.

********REGULATION CHANGE*******

On the official kennel quilt site, the administrators ask that the quilts be 100% cotton so they will be biodegradable. But that seems pretty difficult for us to do since we repurpose unwanted or scrap fabric and batting. And a lot, if not most, batting used now is no longer 100% cotton anyway. Since we cannot meet the all cotton request anyway we decided to allow any woven fabric as long as it washable and doesn't have a loose weave in which pets could catch their claws. Our feeling is that when emergencies arise having some kind of quilt is more important than having an all cotton one. However I will contact the kennel quilt people and see how they feel about non-cotton quilts. If they don't want them we will use them locally

Quick reminder- kennel quilts are $12" \times 18"$, no binding, sewn and quilted with small (2mm) stitches, made from quilting cotton. Fleecies are fringed approximately 20" square. Flannels are enveloped, same finished dimensions and also stitched about 2" from each side.

Colored Pencils on Fabric with Clorinda Fresquez-Tria

In this class, we will paint on fabric using colored pencils. Learn how to layer, blend, and make your artwork permanent on fabric.

SIGN UP REQUIRED. \$25 class fee, including most materials.

AVNT provides all the card making supplies - blank greeting cards and envelopes in white and many

different colors. The fusible for the fabric. And the lightweight card stock to stabilize the fabric.

- Eraser
- Plastic paper sheet protectors (if you have some, you can use your own)
