

From Michael's Desk

This month, I'm feeling extra reflective. Big shock, right? There has been a lot to process compared to most months as it was a culmination of sorts.

In January, I attended our conference's winter candidacy retreat. That's where we—the candidates—begin to discern our calling and take steps to credentialling. February and March were chock full of paperwork. "The joy." Of course, Lent would start around that time, and it would lead to Holy Week and Resurrection Sunday.

No sooner would Holy Week end than I would start licensing school, supplementing my bachelor's and master's degrees with a lot of specific Wesleyan and United Methodist theology, something which made me feel even more at home in our theology and tradition than I already did.

Then, annual conference. This year's was much less heated than the last two since, as you can imagine, the topics of deepest debate from general conference have been settled. We may not all agree on those points of position, polity, or theology, but that's okay. The takeaway is that the focus is shifting back to where it needs to be: caring for souls, doing justice, spreading the gospel, and making disciples.

Like I said, it was a culmination—not just of my study or work, but of the work of church members and leaders throughout our conference. Beyond raising up over 12 new licensed local pastors (like myself) and 8 deacons and elders, people have been listening to each other and realizing that we all lost sight of the mission. All that talk in our current sermon series of repentance? Beyond any topic we've argued or divided over, it's losing sight of what's most important that we all find ourselves repenting from.

That is the most refreshing thing I've experienced in a long time.

In the power of the resurrection of Jesus Christ, there are new beginnings and hope overflowing. We're living in it now. Stay the course. Follow the direction of the Spirit of God as we become a community prepared to truly live into the calling we've been given
