In light of the feedback we received through our recent online poll, we held a Special General Meeting on Feb 20 that passed changes to our bylaws to reflect a new vision for the RSCA's role in the community and with that a slight realignment in the Board roles and responsibilities.

The new purpose and objectives of the RSCA are to:

- Protect and enhance the quality of life throughout the community;
- Promote organized community endeavours; and
- Keep residents informed of actions which could affect the community.

# Riverside South Diversity Mural

For a third time, the RSCA has coordinated with the art program at St FX Catholic High School to create a piece of public art for display in our community. The RSCA provides the funds to cover

the cost of materials and the students do the rest!

The "Riverside South Diversity" mural was installed March 6th in Councillor Meehan's Ward 22 office located in the Rideauview Community Centre. Twelve grade 9-12 visual art students from three different high schools, with mentorship from St FX teacher and Artists of Stonebridge member Roy Ketchum, worked on this complex and challenging mural (6' x 4') for nearly four months. More than eighty per cent of the students involved in the painting were from St. Francis Xavier: Rebecca Saunders Shahad Baobaid, Sophia Fornarolo, Morgan Pleet, Vittoria Pantano, Nevada Hasbani, Rebecca Anderson, Julia Krajic, Tara Morin, Jenson Clarke, Alex Reyes-Brunhuber (John McCrae high school), and Madison Ketcheson (Elmwood school).

## Ward Boundary Review 2020

The City of Ottawa is reviewing its ward boundaries. The last major review was completed in 2005 and established the city's 23 wards.



Since that time, Ottawa has seen considerable population growth, especially in suburban wards outside the Greenbelt. Some wards are growing twice as fast as others, creating population imbalances. Barrhaven (Ward 3)'s population is now 43 per cent above the average ward population of 44,000, and Gloucester-South Nepean (Ward 22)'s population is 23 per cent above average.
