

Every year, the Georgia Department of Education identifies and honors high school seniors who have achieved excellence in school and community life through the Georgia Scholar program. Each honoree receives a seal for their diploma. The Georgia Scholar designation is a recognition of their leadership and diligence. In 2024, only 177 students will receive this honor. One of those students was a CHS senior - Marissa Copeland.
