
City Honors West Hills Neighbor





A Message to West Hills from 50 Years Ago

Below is a copy of the last page of the 1973 West Hills Plan—a comprehensive assessment and vision for the future of West Hills. It was produced by a group of concerned neighbors with diverse backgrounds and a shared love of their community. Both the document they produced and the words below have are as relevant to all of us today as it was a half a century ago. The words speak for themselves. This is why we have the West Hills Community Association and why everyone living in West Hills should be grateful for the foresight our neighbors had fifty years ago.

WEST HILLS COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION PURPOSE: (Adopted: June 1, 1964)

"As residents of West Hills, most of us are pleased with our homes and our community. Not without reason do we feel that we own a piece of what is now, and will remain, perhaps the finest residential area in all of Knox County. Our homes represent to us sound investments, not only from the financial point of view, but also for the physical and emotional well-being of ourselves and our children. This is a great neighborhood in which to live and to grow.

"But - will it stay that way? It is a young neighborhood with much growing of its own to do. How will it mature? Five or ten years from now, will it still seem so fine?

"The growth of any investment requires careful and constant scrutinizing and management.
