Could Your Property Be In Codes Violation?

For those few neighbors who may not be able to keep their property in a clean condition, you may not realize that you could be in violation of Neighborhood Code Ordinances.

Violations can include

overgrown lawns (grass taller than 12"), debris in the front yard, in-operable vehicles visible from the street, parking on front lawns, and RVs, campers, trailers parked in front of homes.

Usually, neighbors aren't aware they have a problem including being on a long vacation and the grass has grown, or there may be a health or other issue that other neighbors aren't aware of. Sometimes calling your neighbor can resolve a problem.

If you need additional help or have questions, you can always contact Knoxville's Office of Neighborhood Code Enforcement online at knoxvilletn.gov, call 865-215-4311, or call 311 and request a Neighborhood Codes Enforcement inspector.

Tips for a Great Fruit Smoothie

Liquids such as fruit juices, water, dairy milk, and plantbased milks all work well in smoothies. To ensure even blending, start by adding any lighter fruit you are using, such as berries, then move on to the heavier fruit, such as apples, pears and bananas. Using frozen fruit has many benefits, including cold temperatures and no need to chop the day of.

Fill blender or smoothie cup with fruit (never go beyond the "fill" line on the cup). Add liquid of choice to the fill line of smoothie cup or just enough to cover fruit. Blend until desired

thickness; start slow, then increase speed; don't over-blend.


