Broome Road and Middlebrook Land Rezoned RN-5 for Townhouses

At the July City Council meeting the property bounded by Broome Road, Middlebrook Pike, Bennett Place, and Parkview Senior Living was rezoned from RN-2, low density residential to RN-5 medium density residential.

The developer Homestead Land Holdings, LLC, requested the change to allow construction of 24 to 30 townhouses on the site.

Prior to the City Council hearing the developer met with neighbors at a WHCA hosted special community meeting that lasted a approximately 90 minutes.

Neighbors primarily from Bennett Place, Ashland Keepe, and

Broome Road area attended and heard the developer's general plan and reasons for seeking RN-5.

With the understanding the plans will not directly impact their property but with reservations about traffic, neighbors in attendance and others did not object to the rezoning to build townhouses at the site.

Developer Ask For Another RN-5 Rezoning

Developer Homestead Land Holdings, LLC, requested the change from current RN-1 to RN-5 to allow construction of 24 townhouses.

WHCA has hosted both a special community meeting and onsite meeting with the developer. At this writing neighbors are in discussions with the developer and met with Councilman Andrew Roberto to resolve differences and arrive at a mutually beneficial plan.

When to call the non-emergency line instead of 911:

- Reporting non-violent crime with no suspect (Examples: theft of property, vehicle burglary)
- Reporting non-violent crime with suspect, but suspect is not on scene (Example: fraud, vandalism)
- · Panhandling
- Non-emergency or non-urgent matter in progress (Example: suspicious person)
- On-going issues or crimes that are not in progress (Examples: graffiti, ongoing drug dealing with suspect not on scene, speeding drivers)

Neighbors

- Non-emergency order maintenance issue (Example: noise complaint)
- Property damage crash that is not blocking roadway
- Suspicious circumstances that might indicate ongoing criminal activity (Example: suspected drug house)

Responsible Dog-Owner Safety

Knoxville has several dog ordinances, including:

Vaccinations and licenses

 All dogs must be vaccinated and licensed, and have a current rabies vaccination tag and license on their collar. Tags must be purchased annually from most veterinarians or the Young-Williams Animal Center.

Tethering

• Dogs cannot be tethered outside without someone present with them at all times.

Weather

 Dogs must be brought inside during extreme weather, such as when temperatures are above 85°F or below 32°F, or when there is snow, ice, sleet, severe lightning, tornadoes, flooding, or fires.

Fenced areas

 Dog owners are responsible for ensuring their dogs do not escape from fenced areas.

Public spaces

 Dogs cannot roam freely on streets, sidewalks, parks, or other people's property. When in public spaces where animals are permitted, dogs must be leashed.

Number of dogs

• Residents living on less than one acre of land can have no more

than five dogs, while residents living on more than 1.5 acres can have five or more dogs.
