As the end of the year approaches and we enter the holidays, it is a good time to reflect on the past 11 months, anticipate the promises of the coming year, and be grateful for all the blessings we have as a community and neighbors.

The year started with a rare 8" snow storm followed by a week of extreme cold. Eventually the weather warmed, kids went back to school, and the first signs of spring began to bloom.

The annual Easter Egg Hunt in late March brought out more than 100 children and their families.

In April WHCA marked its 60th anniversary with the inaugural Spring Celebration. The Dogwood Arts Festival joined the festivities. The Grand Opening of the West Hills Dogwood Trail was declared and there was even a mini sidewalk chalk art event for the kids.

The occasion included the dedication of the first five dogwood trees honoring five amazing West Hills volunteers and their families who have shared their time, talents, and energy over the years to the benefit of everyone living in West Hills.

As this new tradition grows in the coming years, the greenway will become lined with dogwoods and will not only be a beautiful addition to the park but also be a reminder of how volunteering enriches the lives of everyone.

The Summer Picnic was held in June. Everyone enjoyed the return of the covered dish dinner with WHCA offering the main course from M&M Barbecue and Chick-Fil-A.

Summer vacations were taken, baseball teams filled the fields, walkers and bike riders enjoyed the greenways, sidewalks, and favorite routes.

Everyone's attention turned to the elections in late summer/early fall. The ballot for West Hills voters included how future City Council members

would be elected to who would be the next president. Turnout was excellent. Would be wonderful to see that level of interest and turnout continue in 2025 for the City elections which have the biggest political impact on our daily lives.

West Hills continues to attract not only families and individuals looking for a highly desirable neighborhood to call home, but also land developers who discover the few remaining undeveloped parcels of land in the neighborhood.

In late spring a developer announced plans to build 28 townhouses at the corner of Broome and Middlebrook. In early fall the same developer began efforts to build 24 townhouses close to the corner of Gallaher View and Middlebrook, and then in midautumn the president of St. Andrews' HOA and the WHCA president met with the attorney of a developer interested in building a 60-unit mixed residential (detached single-family and duplexes) development between I-40/75 and St. Andrews.

The only development moving forward is the Broome Road project. Gallaher View has been abandoned and no news since the meeting with the attorney.

Looking ahead to the new year many of the same events will happen, there will likely be more developers trying to capitalize on the concerns about housing, and WHCA and all West Hills residents will volunteer towork together to preserve and improve our community.

And life will go on in one of Knoxville's greatest neighborhoods with neighbors helping neighbors.

City Leaf Pick Up

The leaf collection season runs from November through February. During this period, the normal two-week brush schedule is suspended (outside of requests) and all Public Service Department resources concentrate on collecting leaves throughout our community. To find the schedule for your home, go to *leafpickup.knoxvilletn.*

For safety, rake leaves to the street as close as possible to and along your curb without brush/branches.

Last season the City of Knoxville collected over 7,000 tons of leaves that were processed for mulch and diverted from the landfill.


