Minutes for June 9, 2020 CCL-KC General Membership Meeting

1. The June 9, 2020 CCL-KC General Membership Meeting was held by Go To Meeting and convened at 6:30 PM. In attendance were Stephen Melton, Paula Leppert, Theresa Noble, Dave Mitchell, Dennis Hilger, Kurt Kloster, Emily Hurley, and Lia and Karen Uhlenhuth. Thanks to all who attended to the meeting!

2. Announcements. Steve briefly discussed two recent positive articles: Renewables Topple Coal! <u>https://www.greentechmedia.com/articles/read/renewables-toppled-coal-in-us-energy-consumption-in-2019-eia-says</u> and the Forbes article, <u>https://www.forbes.com/sites/energyinnovation/2020/06/09/plunging-renewable-energy-prices-mean-us-can-hit-90-clean-electricity-by-2035at-no-extra-cost/#25e09102f9b1</u>. We also discussed the dismal performance of Missouri by comparison. Missouri in 2019 got 73% of its electricity from coal and only 4% from wind, despite having great wind energy potential. (Iowa now gets 42% from wind and Kansas 36%) Missouri mines none of the coal it burns, so coal provides no jobs, save for the 320 or so in Peabody Coal's headquarters in Saint Louis. Missouri has 56,000 clean energy jobs, and could have many more if the state government weren't so wedded to coal. Pease ask your Missouri representatives why we are so out of step with the rest of the nation.

3. June CCL Conference and Lobby Day-on line-this weekend!.

Dave gave details on the conference. On Sat., June 13, the conference is from 12 Noon-3:30 p.m. CDT, with featured speakers Sen. Braun, Rep. from Indiana, and Sen. Coons, Dem. from Del., co-founders of the Senate Climate Solutions Caucus. Additionally, former Representative Carlos Curbelo, Republican from Florida and cofounder of the. House Climate Solutions Caucus will speak. There are a wide variety of breakout sessions available, something for everyone.

On Sunday, June 14, from 12 Noon-2 p.m. (or a little later), four in-depth seminars will be offered, including one on diversity.

5. CCL and Racial Justice

Paula led a powerful 25-minute discussion regarding CCL's policy on racial equality using some of the CCL provided slides. 6. KC Climate Action Plan Update.

Dave reported that on May 15, the KC City Council passed resolution 200005 (<u>http://cityclerk.kcmo.org/liveweb/Documents/Document.aspx?</u> <u>q=Ehj5P3N4QcabwTp1kpqcBjEU6DTzPXkgil300sRfRVb1pQp21dePmdMDZC2vw3a2</u>) to update the city's environmental protection plan. The goal is for city operations to have 75% reduction in emissions by 2025 and be carbon neutral by 2030. The goal for city-wide carbon neutrality is 2040. The City manager will conduct hearings and

present the details of the plan to the city council by March 31, 2021. If you live in KCMO, please provide your input during this planning process. CCL-KC will provide updates on participating in the stakeholder process.
