he Executive Board traveled to Kansas City on January 27-




## New chapter advisor Cord Harper



s my term as President comes to an end, I have made several observations of Theta Chapter that I wanted to share.



## **Advisor Report**

## **Purposeful Huddles**

I love football to the extent that during fall weekends I can spend the entirety of any remaining "free time" watching nearly any game that might be on TV (during desperate times I will in fact succumb and watch Pac-12 football). On Sundays, a rematch of the Chiefs and Chargers or Eagles and Cowboys provide great entertainment. A lifelong Chiefs fan- the second "Golden Age" of Kansas City Chiefs football brings boundless joy!

The game of football continues to evolve, and new architects emerge nearly every season. The run dominate game was revolutionized with the forward page and since then minds like Mike Leoch. Chin Kelly, and Leoch

forward pass and since then minds like Mike Leech, Chip Kelly, and Lane Kiffin have engineered high octane offenses wowing audiences and opposing teams. However, as I watched games last fall-I noticed several teams exclusively used the hurry-up offensive strategy. Hurry-up with its lack of pre-snap huddles, once seen exclusively at the end of a game in a sense of desperation, has become a common full-game strategy across all of football. Here's the thing: without practice, a unified plan, and good communication the strategy quickly backfires.

Bill Snyder in my opinion is a football wizard. His offenses were scripted and boring, but his teams were often the fewest penalized squads in the country. They did not put themselves behind the sticks so to speak. The Wildcats dominated the time of possession because they would stay in the huddle until the final seconds of the play clock, utilizing the full time for thought and consideration. I think there is a lesson here. The huddle provides everyone the opportunity to get on the same page and run through the game plan. Then once everyone understands, the team goes out and performs what they learned with minimal error. But as mentioned earlier, without practice, strong communication, and a unified vision, performance errors stack up, players get discouraged, recruits lose interest, and fingers get pointed.

There is an old saying that one must learn to walk before starting to run. Not every team needs a huddle to be successful, but all teams need to be made up of players who understand the same game plan and that includes Alpha Gamma Rho.

In 2022, the undergraduate chapter spent some huddle time learning about what binds us all together (the AGR Covenant), building a unified plan (established chapter and officer goals), practicing (frequently reciting opening ceremonies and initiations) and developing communication channels (brotherhood time, alumni relations, and philanthropic community outreach).

I am proud of their commitment and dedication to intentional development. It is my hope the entire Theta Chapter can work together on a Chapter-wide strategic plan in the next year, and I ask each brother near and far to consider the value of some good old fashioned huddle time and commit to participate.

Lamar Hunt often used this famous Henry Ford quote, "Coming together is being, staying together is progress, and working together is success." I remain confident that if we work together, we can build something free of error and exciting that might just even revolutionize the game.
