Stephen Ministry Information and Upcoming Class

Church's Stephen Ministry or even be a part of this important service to our congregation? We will be offering a 5 class course this coming January that will prepare you to be a Stephen Friend. The course is available to everyone even if you don't plan to be commissioned as a Stephen Friend. Normally the training to be a Stephen Minister is 50 hours but we realize very few of us have time for that. Therefore we have developed a 10 hour course that trains you to be a Stephen Friend. I imagine that most of you know that our congregation has a **Stephen Ministry Program** but that many of you don't fully understand the services we are able to provide.

Of course, we continue to provide our services to this congregation's shut-ins, bringing them communion, praying with them and providing hope and friendship. This is a very important part of our church's ministry. However there is so much more to Stephen Ministry that we would love to be able to share.

Every person at one time or another needs a nonjudgmental person to talk with; someone who will really actively listen and not judge. We all have difficult times, difficult decisions to make, or difficult choices to consider and it could be very helpful to have an objective person sharing these stressful times with you. Stephen Ministers and Stephen Friends are trained in the skills necessary to do that and confidentiality is an extremely important cornerstone of our ministry. We do not provide counseling but we are trained in helping people through difficult times in an uplifting Christian manner. Examples of issues we can assist people with include relationship problems, worries about finances or jobs, pending retirement or other major life changes, loneliness, depression, stress, long term trauma, confusion about life goals and many more.

The **Stephen Ministry** relationship can be an ongoing one but it can also be useful for just one or two visits if that is what is desired.
