- Understanding Contextual Meaning Students determine for themselves if a word is correctly being used in a full sentence, rewriting it correctly if it is not.

- Word Studies: Analogies Students are given a pair of words and must find more that closely resemble that relationship, much like those found on the SAT.
- Images of Words Students select a sentence that best suggest what a particular word might mean, or that is a good example of its meaning.
- Vocabulary in Context Students read a passage and answer questions, demonstrating how these new words can be used in an organic sentence.
