Rules for stroking of cards:

No Player should ever have a handicap of more than 27 on the card.

Take each player's handicap and divide by 9. If a player has a hcp of 18, then they get 2 strokes on each hole. If a player has a hcp of 21, then they get 2 strokes on each hole, plus an additional stroke on the 3 most difficult holes. (21 divided by 9 is 2 with 3 remaining) The whole number is the number of strokes the player gets off on each hole. The remaining number is the number of holes in which the player receives an extra stroke.

Example: Game is being played on the back 9 of Port Player 1 has a hcp of 21 – She receives 2 strokes on each hole plus an additional stroke on the 3 most difficult holes (holes 12, 18 and 16)

Player 2 has a hcp of 14 – She receives 1 stroke on each hole plus an additional stroke on the 5 most difficult holes (holes 12,18,16, 14 and 13)

Player 3 has a hcp of 26 - She receives 2 strokes on each hole plus an additional stroke on the 8 most difficult holes (holes, 12, 18, 16, 14, 13, 10, 17 and 15)

Player 4 has a hcp of 30 - She receives 3 strokes on each hole. (Even though her hcp is 30, she cannot have more than 3 strokes on any one hole, and 27 will go on the scorecard in the Hcp box) (see attached card for further example)

The ranking of the holes in order of difficulty can be found at the bottom of the card in the blue line titled "Hcp M/W". Where there are two numbers, you will use the second (for women). Each of the 18 holes on each course is ranked in order of difficulty, with the lowest number being the most difficult.

Following are the holes in order of difficulty for each <u>back nine</u>, with the most difficult being listed first.
