About the Director

James Giurleo retired as the K-12 Director of Performing Arts for the Westwood Public Schools. His life-long involvement in music education prompted him to continue providing music learning and performing opportunities through the creation of WestwoodWinds.

As a Westwood resident, he also continues to serve the educational needs of Westwood students as the director of the Prodigy Program, the after school music lesson program of the Westwood Public Schools.

About Ron Della Chiesa

Ron Della Chiesa is the voice of the Boston Symphony Orchestra, the Boston Pops Orchestra on WG-BH-FM (89.7) and hosts "Strictly Sinatra" and "MusicalAmerica" on WPLM-FM, Easy 99.1.

He was born in Quincy, MA, where he developed an early love for radio. When still a child, he created a radio station in his bedroom, consisting of a cardboard

microphone and record turntable. Writing his own commercials and newscasts, he began broadcasting to an imaginary audience.

He developed an early passion for opera and classical music by listening to his father's collection of Caruso records and the radio broadcasts of the Metropolitan Opera and the NBC Symphony.

While at Boston University, he landed his first radio job at WBOS. Hired by Arnie "WOO WOO" Ginsberg, he hosted a series of ethnic radio shows, including the Italian Melody Hour, the Polish Variety Hour, Music of the Near East, the Boston Greek Hour and the Irish Hour.

After serving in the Army in the early 60's, he joined the staff of WBCN, an all-classical music station at that time. He became Program Director and also began working part time at Boston's Public TV and Radio station, WGBH, When WBCN-FM switched their format to Rock and Roll in 1969, he began working full time at WGBH, a relationship that continues to this day. He has been the voice and host for the live performances of the Boston Symphony Orchestra and Boston Pops broadcasts from Symphony Hall and Tanglewood

While at WGBH, he presented the popular Music-America show for over 18 years, giving him the opportunity to interview and play great artists from the world of Opera, Broadway, Film, American Popular Song and Jazz. He shared the airwaves with musical greats such as Luciano Pavarotti, Eileen Farrell, Robert Merrill, Tony Bennett, Dizzy Gillespie, Buddy Rich, Stan

> Getz, Dave McKenna, Wynton Marsalis, John Williams, Keith Lockhart, Sammy Cahn, Carol Channing, Rosemary Clooney, Harry Connick, Jr., and Frank Sinatra, Jr., just to mention a few.

Along with his executive producer, Paul Schlosberg, he inaugurated the Strictly Sinatra and MusicAmerica radio shows In 1997 that still continues Sunday evenings into Monday mornings from 7 PM to 2 AM.

In addition to broadcasting, Mr. Della Chiesa wrote "Radio My Way," a book containing inside stories of his career in radio through his interviews with many

jazz and classical greats including his close friend, musical legend Tony Bennett.

Mr. Della Chiesa is in demand as a narrator for New England orchestras and social functions. He occasionally hosts learning tours and lectures for opera, both on land, and on cruise ships. He also hosts Sinatra Dance parties at various venues on the South Shore. Mr. Della Chiesa's latest project involve hosting his own a show on the Internet as part of "The GMMY Radio Network" featuring golden memories of yesteryear at www. GMMY.com.
