Ah the off season. Time to make plans for next year, fix equipment, order parts and wonder why it takes less time every year until that first show.

Currently I am rebuilding the scale sawmill, a bearing failed after only 65 years of use. I'd write the company that built it but they are no longer in business. Our scale water wagon is also getting a new tank built when we can get up to do a day or two of work at our resident metal wizards place.

I was dismayed to see our full-size Keck Gonnerman's gauge had faded out to being nearly unreadable. It is a reproduction gauge as I hated to have the original on at shows where it would possibly come up missing. These gauges are nearly impossible to obtain so I purchased a very good look alike to use.

I left the engine out one winter when we were building the new steam shed at our club grounds and that winter sun zapped it. I emailed the guy that built it and was stunned to find he would warranty the repair completely. I sent it off and a few weeks later it came back looking better than new. It's surprising to find someone who stands behind their work in this day and age. I was sure it was going to be a case of user error.

We are getting bids for running city water at our local club grounds. It's a pretty good distance from the water meter at the road to where our water lines and well are. There also is a lot of limestone rock on the grounds too so it will be a project. Once we get that done, we plan to remodel the bathrooms to be a little nicer. The current ones are open at the top to the weather and in spite of the screens on top it always seems to be dirty inside. We will enclose it fully and close in the eaves and put in a mini split and have heated and air-conditioned bathrooms going forward.

Also on my list of improvements is our stakes I use for roping off exhibits to keep things safe. Right now, I have some built for roping off that I had a local blacksmith make. They are set up for a rope about 40 inches off the ground. When EDGETA President Jeff Fenske came out to our show he noted that we needed a second lower rope to make sure those younger tractors show attendees don't duck under the rope and get into a possible hazardous area. So, in the off season I will modify these for a second rope to make it quicker to rope off in the fashion we need to best keep things safe.

I really wanted to make the Eastern Regional show this year in Charleston SC, but the weather combined with a bug going through our household conspired to keep me home.

Speaking of which, we need clubs to step up and volunteer to host regional shows. Since we are hosting the National Show in Medina Ohio next year, we are good on that for a few years, but we need to have some places host regionals. If you think you are interested, contact me or Jeff Fenske if you have any questions.

And it is never too early to remind people we need those officers updated next spring and your membership lists sent in. Note that Carrie Jo has retired and there will be a new address to send things to.
