E-MAIL AND CANVAS ACCESS

After you are hired, Human Resources and Information Technology will work to get your e-mail created. To log on, click [here](#). 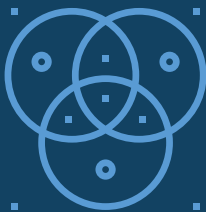
CLASS PREPARATION AND CREATION

You may be asked to work on an SLO (Student Learning Outcome) assessment as part of your teaching duties. The SLO assessment is a quick process that measures how well students are learning in our courses. The system called [eLumen](#) is used to create these assessments. eLumen also has curriculum information that may be valuable.
