We commit to:

- Reviewing and expanding our collection of works that discuss race and promote anti-racism.
- Evaluating our collections to ensure that the cultures, histories, and lived experiences of our BIPOC students are represented in the literature we offer.
- Revising our employee training materials to place greater emphasis on equity and inclusion.
- Examining our recruitment and hiring process to ensure that the diversity of our staff reflects the diversity of our community.
- Creating future programs and events that promote discussions of race and racism.
- Actively exploring how our library can provide a safe, comfortable, and welcoming space and services for all students in reaching their academic goals.
- Using our positions as educators and LTCC employees to advocate for the needs of BIPOC students and to work against racism on our campus.
