Lake Tahoe Community College's Teaching and Learning Program promotes the positive values of teaching and learning by encouraging conversations, workshop participation, and onboarding activities among faculty and all interested members of the LTCC community. The activities of the Teaching and Learning Program are coordinated by the FCTL (Faculty Chair of Teaching and Learning) and are aimed at stimulating consideration of topics, activities, and engagements that focus on all aspects of faculty professional life—whether connected to teaching, counseling, library and information services, or other professional areas.




The Teaching and Learning Program focuses on a number of key aspects of faculty professional training and development. The foci, activities, and efforts of the T&L Program adapt with the needs on campus, including those identified in the many T&L surveys that are produced, faculty evaluation of the FCTL, and day-to-day communication with faculty and campus staff. This report details the focus of the program, as well as its evolution.



## CORE VALUES TO THE STATE OF THE


Over the three years in which the Teaching & Learning program has developed, a set of core concerns has emerged. These values help inform the development of workshops, Teaching Talks, video tutorials, and related materials.





The T&L program focuses on adaptability both in terms of the services provided to LTCC faculty and staff and in updates to resources that are made available to the college community. For 2021–2022, major revisions of the One-Pagers were undertaken. Effective organization of professional resources is a concern of the program, and the redesigns made will hopefully allow for clearer communication, and easier understanding, of materials. The One-pagers that were revised include: Canvas, Zoom and Video, Student Topics, and Professional Development.

Additionally, the T&L website was updated to provide clearer and accurate information to faculty. As one example, the Workshops tab was updated with video archives and lists of current workshops and events.







A value of both the program and the FCTL is the idea of adaptability. As was the case in the previous two years of the T&L Program, the emphasis on helping out programs, staff, and offices in need continued in 2021–2022. Some of the assistance provided included:

- Coyote Kickoff (Assistance with Sound and Music for the Event)
- Campus Technology (Continuing Support of Faculty/Staff Technology Needs, Attendance at Statewide Zoom Subaccount and PlayPosit Meetings)
- Canvas Student Suite (the creation of 33 original pages in two modules focused on Resources and Policies for DE students)
- Assistance with ISP Steering Committee and ISP projects



#### **T&L WEEKLY UPDATES**

In 2021-2022, the T&L Weekly e-mail updates were developed and formalized. On every Sunday of an instructional week, an email update is sent out to campus stakeholders. The update includes information about weekly trainings (such as Teaching Talks), presentation of the latest tutorial videos, sharing of relevant articles (including those focused on pedagogy and student-related topics), and other important updates. For this year, the updates have been developed to include a more attractive graphical header that appears at the top of the e-mail. An additional new aspect of the T&L Weekly Updates has been a theme focus. For example, in Fall 2021, a specific part-time faculty theme week and a Zoom theme week, and in Spring 2022, an Accessibility theme week, were offered. Communication with campus staff has indicated that many in the LTCC community appreciate the friendly and informative weekly updates.

#### NEW FOR 2021-2022



In the 2021–2022 academic year, LTCC T&L continued efforts to provide video documentation of workshops that may have been missed by attendees as well as create new content that features tutorials on technology, pedagogy, and other faculty professional topics. Some of the new efforts are detailed in the upcoming pages of this report.

#### **EVERYTHING SHEET**

To help streamline the process of faculty interacting with T&L materials, a new pdf called the Everything Sheet was developed. This one-page resource allows faculty to easily navigate to areas of interest that include pedagogy, technology, and other areas. The sheet will be updated as new resources and T&L series are created.





#### CONVOCATION WELCOME


To better coordinate T&L efforts with Instruction, a new welcome video was created specifically for Convocation. The purpose of the video is to introduce new faculty to the T&L Program and to make a connection with faculty at the start of the new academic year.

#### FALL UPDATES

New for 2021-2022 is a series of technology updates that are designed to give faculty a sense of the updates, changes, and technological shifts in teaching and learning technology. For this year, Zoom Fall Updates and Canvas Fall Updates videos were created.







#### TINY TECH

A new weekly video series for Fall 2021 and Winter 2022 was created. It focused on short bits of technology that can be useful in faculty professional life.



#### **CANVAS STUDENT SUITE**

For Winter 2022, a new set of Canvas pages was created and shared to Canvas Commons. In total, 33 pages were created to allow faculty to shared useful resources and LTCC policies with students. As faculty are busy, providing the preset pages through Canvas Commons results in significant time savings for faculty and increased success for students.



#### T&L TIPS



## SCOTT ANSWERS YOUR TECH & MEDIA QUESTIONS

In response to a full-time faculty member request, a video was developed to assist with recording of class lectures. The video spawned a new series focused on assistance related to technology and media. Additional videos that focus on pressing faculty needs in these areas will be developed.

#### SLACK T&L SPACE

In 2021, a new Slack space was created for LTCC Teaching & Learning. The space is the result of requests to have more offline conversations following Teaching Talks and other workshops. In the future, it is hoped that more alternative spaces of teaching and professional collaboration may be developed.







## COYOTE STUDENT TECHNOLOGY SCHOLARS



In 2022, based on a request made by the Office of Instruction, a \$3525 LTCC Foundation grant was developed. The grant specifically focused on increasing technological literacy among LTCC students. Included in the project deliverables were many workshops that focus on technology and DE learning topics: Canvas Student Skills, Safe LGBTQIA+ Student DE Spaces, Technology Job Skills, among other topics. Additionally, the grant included on-campus speakers, student attendee raffles, and sharing of the workshop videos with LTCC students, faculty, administration, and classified staff. The result of the grant is greater attention on the issue of technological literacy among LTCC students. Some of the workshops are depicted on this page.

With the transformation of the Disability
Resource Center (DRC) into Student
Accessibility Services (SAS) and opening of SAS
in its new remodel location of E106 on campus,
T&L created an accessibility awareness week
that included a framing video and a special
collaborative workshop that brought together
Kellie Greiner, LTCC Student Accessibility
Services faculty and director, Michael Miguel,
LTCC Director of Online Education, and Justin
Daneshmand, Interim Curriculum Specialist, in
order to discuss ways of meeting the needs of
all students in terms of accessibility. A plan is in
place to develop future additional workshops
and resources on these important topics.

# TARGETED ONE-ON-ONE ASSISTANCE

In 2021–2022, a more pronounced focus on one-on-one assistance was developed. While many faculty and staff attend Teaching Talks and workshops, these events are often not the best places to get assistance on very specific teaching or technology matters. As a result, the FCTL took advantage of the useful Calendly resource that allows faculty to sign up for specific days and times at which to meet over Zoom. The one-on-one assistance has included valuable work with faculty on areas of technology and pedagogy, including Zoom FERPA video compliance and the audio quality of DE lecture videos (pictured).



Subject Teaching and Learning Update: Dr. Scott Lukas

Type Report

Dr. Scott A. Lukas, Faculty Chair of Teaching & Learning (FCTL), will update the Board of Trustees (Board) on the last three years of activity around Teaching & Learning at Lake Tahoe Community College (LTCC). The MOU for the Faculty Chair of Teaching & Learning role was approved by the Board of Trustees at the May 14, 2019 meeting.

Dr. Lukas will provide an overview of his work and discuss efforts to assist part- and full-time faculty with workshops, tutorial videos, and other activities related to the improvement of instruction at LTCC. The LTCC Teaching & Learning website, developed by Dr. Lukas, provides a comprehensive site with tools and resources available to faculty. In addition to videos, tutorials, and focused resources for instructional areas including face-to-face courses, distance education (DE), and the Incarcerated Student Program (ISP), the Teaching & Learning website also provides annual reports on FCTL activities (Attachments #2 and #3).



#### ABOUT THE FCTL

Scott A. Lukas serves as LTCC's Faculty Chair of Teaching & Learning. He was the recipient of the national AAA/McGraw-Hill Award for Excellence in Undergraduate Teaching of Anthropology by the American Anthropological Association (2005), the California statewide Hayward Award for Excellence in Education by the California Community Colleges (2003), Lake Lake Tahoe Community College Distinguished Faculty (2013), and Lake Tahoe Community College Associated Student Council Teacher of the Year (2004).



He is the author/editor of numerous books, including, Strategies in Teaching Anthropology, 6th Edition (2010, Pearson Education) and was part of the American Anthropological Association's new faculty teaching academy held at the annual national meetings. He was a participant in the 2005-2006 @ONE Statewide Scholars with his project "An Analysis of Student Success in Reflexive Online Classroom Assignments," co-authored the study "The Actors behind the Curtain: Representation of Women Faculty in Community College Institutional Decision-making," and contributed to multiple chapters of Handbook for Achieving Gender Equity Through Education. Scott is a former Six Flags employee trainer and has worked as a workshop and training consultant for Walt Disney Imagineering, ABC, and Pixar. He has provided interviews for The Wondery, To the Best of Our Knowledge, the Canadian Broadcasting Company, The Independent, The New York Times, The Washington Post, Slate, The Chicago Tribune, The Financial Times (of London), The Daily Beast, Huffington Post UK, Atlas Obscura, Skift, Caravan, and the Angie Coiro Show, and was part of the documentary film and video series, The Nature of Existence (directed by Roger Nygard).

#### **T&L DIRECTIONS FORWARD**

Over the last three years, the LTCC Teaching & Learning program and the FCTL have made notable contributions to campus life. In particular, the program and its activities have provided important professional outreach to the faculty and the wider campus community that is not possible given logistics and time and workload constraints of other faculty, administration, and staff on campus.
