★ MEMBERSHIP: May meeting held in person. The June meeting was held via Zoom due to scheduling conflicts. There were 16 members logged into the Zoom meeting on June 4th.

REPORTS

It has was repaired and has returned after the recent heavy rains. Sandbags were also installed to help with the erosion. Just be mindful of this area when traveling down the road.



★ FIELD REPORT: Andy lent his battery powered backpack sprayer to the club. We are trying to keep the weeds down around buildings and in the ditches so they don't get out of control as they have done in the past. The weed killer seems to be working.

Once again, thank you to Robert Osborne. He took the initiative to finish removing the piles of debris left over from the field work day. He also towed his mower to the field to help cut grass. Volunteers to do extra work are always welcome. Let a council member know if you would like to help.

Dick Cheliras has also volunteered to do some more painting. He could use extra help. Let us know if you could volunteer, if only for a few hours. Thank you.

Charging Station: The main switch to the charging station has been temporarily bypassed. Just flip the smaller switches to power the inverter and other accessories. The combination has been changed to match the gate combos.

Gazebo: You will see a new box in the gazebo. It contains the water suppression sprayer for the turbine guys as well as the fire extinguisher and first aid kit. *The combination is still 911.*

Shed: The shed still needs to be cleaned out. The rotten boards on the shed ramp have been replaced. An oil change, new plug and filters performed on one tractor. The other 2 mowers still need to be done. One John Deer has a broken belt which is on order. Rat poison has been replenished. MEETING TOPICS

From expressed the President: Andy appreciation to all of those that showed up at the last working party. The EC will decide what is brought to the General Membership and what needs to be voted on based on the new bylaws. We will discuss, go to a motion to accept, seconded, and then voted on. Meeting Notes Continued

Hank stated that he has drawn up plans to expand the clubhouse a couple of years ago. Still has them if needed. Hank brought up about putting down plastic/conveyer belt down the runway.

Andy asked the Secretary to read the motion from the EC meeting.

Motion: TRC will move forward with a plan for significant club and field improvements which shall not be impeded by any concern for the potential future loss of the field.

Andy explained the meaning behind the motion. The concern of losing the field always comes up during discussions, and we want to remove this concern as a road block, or accept that it is. It is not known necessarily the odds of losing the lease, but it's always a possibility.

Andy also stated there would be possibly a bigger club house, bigger parking area, rocketry, drones, helicopters, control-line, etc. Lease manager is onboard to double our field size though he would prefer there not be any concrete slabs. Andy: Start drilling down on this plan, how do we create a 1, 3, 5 year plan that we can share with the land manager and say this is our plan this year, next year, etc. This does not mean this is an open checkbook. Big expenditures would still be voted on. Dave Turner asked if these sub activities are going to be other small clubs or are they going to be part of TRC. Andy said AMA covers all of this and these additional activities would be part of TRC. After discussion, the motion was seconded by Roger Young. All were in favor and no against. It was decided to table the discussion of what the reserve funds should be until the next EC meeting and depending on what comes out of the EC meeting, a motion will be brought to the General Meeting for discussion and vote. Andy asked for input for what the club wants. He thought he would have gotten more feedback from the club, but stated maybe some don't have experiences with other clubs and may not know what is or is not better. All of this is pencil to paper discussion and can be changed, but no reason at this time to not shoot for the Moon. If it's simple, people will do it. Things should be easily done and maintained, and they will get used. Andy wants to be better than

Fredericksburg. Alex G. stated that we lack inspiration from club members. He has seen club members' enthusiasm decline in the past couple of decades. Andy's ideas sound fantastic, but if we can't get members enthused to go along with it, it will not matter. Andy agreed with Alex's concern, and realizes how it has become. Andy said he would like to see a Fun-fly that is advertised and have all sorts of people attend such as the fire department, city council, families, etc. Member stated that we should look at current trends in the hobby such as drone races, STEM projects, etc. Andy stated that if someone brings up a good idea, he is not going to hold that person to carrying it through, but at the same time it might not get done if someone doesn't step-up and volunteer. Karl B: What attracted the new members to our club?

Andy says it's about time that he does another round of calls to the club members though it takes about 30 hours to do.
