MARICOPA COUNTY PROPOSITION

PROP 413 JAIL FACILITIES EXCISE TAX EXTENSION: a YES vote reestablishes a jail facilities excise tax of one-fifth of one cent (\$0.002) on transactions, the same rate as the tax in place since 1998 and set to expire in March 2027 ☐ YES

STATEWIDE PROPOSITIONS

PROP 141 PROHIBIT THE GOVERNMENT from imposing taxes or fees based on vehicle miles traveled and enacting rules to monitor or limit vehicle miles traveled without the person's consent ☐ YES

PROP 142 STOP GOVERNMENT DISCRIMINATION by ending DEI from requiring an individual to endorse preferential treatment toward or discrimination against an individual on the basis of race or ethnicity ☐ YES

PROP 144 ONLY U.S. CITIZENS may register & vote in Arizona elections; bans foreign money in Arizona races; requires government-issued photo Voter ID to cast a ballot; votes tabulated at voting location ☐ YES

PROP 316 PROHIBIT LOCAL GOVERNMENTS from imposing or increasing a tax on the sale of food items without voter approval and cap the tax rate at 2% ☐ YES

PROP 317 DECLARE DRUG CARTELS to be terrorist organizations ☐ YES

PROP 318 PROHIBIT SCHOOLS AND ATHLETIC ASSOCIATIONS from allowing a student, athlete, employee, or other individual to use a restroom, locker room, shower room, or other private space that is not designated for their biological sex ☐ YES

PROP 319 PROHIBIT THE GOVERNMENT from using traffic photo enforcement systems without voter approval ☐ YES

PROP 320 REQUIRE SCHOOL DISTRICTS with 7,500+ students or districts in counties with a population greater than 500,000 to spend at least 60% of their budget on direct instructional expenses ☐ YES
