### OPEN CLASS Rules and Regulations

1. No exhibit will be received from anyone unless they hold an exhibitor's ticket. There is no charge for an exhibitor's ticket.

2. All entries must be made by **8:00 p.m.** on Entry Days, except 4-H Building exhibit entries which will be accepted until 5:00 p.m. only on Entry Day. Judging begins at 9:00 o'clock on Thursday morning, unless stated otherwise.

3. Second premium prizes only will be paid where there is no competition, unless otherwise expressly recommended by the judges.

4. Stock and all articles for exhibit must be entered by the bonafide owner, and grain, fruit, vegetables, domestic manufacture, dairy products and works of art have been produced by the exhibitor thereof during the past year and not entered in any previous fair held by this association.

5. The exhibitors will at all times give the necessary attention to whatever he may have on exhibit and at the close of the fair take charge of the same. Diligence will be used by the officers of the association to prevent injury to the articles or animals on exhibition and a night watch will guard the grounds, but the society will not be responsible for any loss that may occur.

6. No article or animal shall compete for more than one premium, except in a cow-calf unit or other group classes.

7. Pedigree statements required for examination should be exhibited to the secretary or judges prior to the date of making awards.

8. No premiums will be allowed on articles not listed. Specials may be entered only by consent of the secretary or the superintendent in charge of the department for the purpose of adding new items for future lists.

9. Feed, hay and straw must be provided by the livestock exhibitor. Feed will be provided for rabbits and poultry.

10. No animal or articles on exhibit can be removed from the grounds until the close of the fair without the consent of the secretary.

11. Superintendents will, subject to the approval of the manager, have charge of their respective departments and afford the awarding committees every facility for examination.

12. The fairgrounds marshal shall execute the orders of the manager of the society, have charge of the police, and see that order is maintained on the grounds.

13. No person shall be permitted to distribute advertising matter on the grounds, except from his place of business or exhibit. Distribution of handbills shall not be permitted. Anyone violating this rule shall be liable to expulsion from the grounds.

14. Kindly report all errors to the secretary at once for adjustment.

15. No articles to be removed from the fair grounds (unless stated otherwise) until 8 o'clock p.m. on the last day of the fair, except livestock and poultry, which may leave at 5 p.m. on the last day of the fair. (Please check Entry, Judging, and Release Schedule.)

16. In the open class dairy, beef, sheep, goats and swine division only, an exhibitor may show two animals per lot. An exhibitor may not receive more than two awards in any individual lot. An exhibitor may show but one herd or group in a lot for herds or groups. In any other division, only one premium per exhibitor per lot.

### **Livestock Department**

1. Exhibitors must furnish hay, straw and feed.

2. Exhibitors must keep their stock stalls and pens in good condition and open for inspection from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m.

3. Exhibitors of livestock must inform themselves when stock will be judged. Stock must be in the show ring promptly after called out for competition.

4. All bulls must have extra neck tie in addition to any halter tie. No cattle to be tied by leather show halters in stalls.

5. Animals in all classes of registered stock, over one year, shall be accompanied by certificate of registry. Purebred animals under one year of age will not be required to show certificate of registry but the exhibitor of such animal will be required to give a certified statement that both dam and sire of such are properly registered.

6. No animal will be allowed stall room if not worthy for exhibit purpose. Final decision to rest with the superintendent of the department.

7. The dates for computing the ages of animals shall be March 1 and September 1.

### Judges

No person can act as judge in a class in which he is an exhibitor. Exhibits deemed unworthy shall not be awarded any premium. **Premium Checks Can Be Picked Up During The Fair** 

### **Animal Health**

**Beef, Dairy, Sheep and Goats** no longer need to be blood tested for Fair entry. However, all livestock must be free from warts, ringworm, diseases and serious bruises or lacerations to be accepted for Fair entry. The decision of the appointed Fair veterinarian is final.

**Poultry.** Chickens and turkeys must have hatchery certificate for Pullorum-typhoid free or be blood tested within 90 days of the Fair.

**Open Class** exhibitors are responsible for arranging testing and payment.

**Horse Testing.** All Horses must have a negative test for Equine Infectious Anemia. Negative test dated within six months of the fair and reported on standard form VS 10-11 T.

4. Try to group items when possible rather than having many small, single items and sheets. Example: A display of beadwork made by the class instead of trying to select three from many which are very similar and equally good.
