#### **Cooper Monument Restoration**

We celebrated the completion of the cleaning project in August with a welcome tent at the Cemetery and a reception at Christ Church Parish Hall. Local and out-of-town visitors were impressed with the before and after! A weather-proof exhibit label panel has been installed on the Pinegrove Avenue side of the monument for easy access to read it. It includes the history of the monument, biography of the sculptor, and biographical details about James Fenimore Cooper and the Cooper family. The project was featured in the Summer 2024 issue of *The Broadcaster*, news magazine of the New York State Association of Cemeteries.

## Honoring Veterans

Cooperstown's Veterans Clubs have long supported the marking of veterans graves in area cemeteries with military markers and flags. Lakewood Cemetery has compiled an inventory of over 350 military burials. # **Ryerson Lot Project**

Masonry repairs and cleaning in the Ryerson Lot (the Titanic story) have also been completed. We deeply appreciate funding from the Community Foundation of Otsego County and the Ryerson family that has made this work possible. The moss-smeared German slate gravestones are now legible and the sculptured details of the Celtic cross and the memorial tablet are clearly visible. We ask visitors to be respectful when perusing gravestones – de-facing is against Lakewood Cemetery Rules and Regulations.

# Monument Repair 2024

Thirty-eight monuments and gravestones have new 42" foundations and are repaired and cleaned. This program is supported by the NYS Division of Cemeteries Vandalism Fund to address hazardous conditions of eligible monuments. In 4 years, Lakewood Cemetery has addressed the restoration needs of 124 monuments. For 2025 our application will include 36 monuments.
