More Monument Restoration

Another group of 36 monument and gravestone repairs was completed in October by Humphrey Memorials Inc. of Herkimer. Stones were removed piece by piece, concrete foundations poured 42" deep, stones reassembled, and power washed. Quite a transformation! It is worth a visit along Pinegrove Avenue and up around the south curve to Chestnut Hill Road.

Hawaiian Mission House Group Tour

Members of the Hawaiian Mission Houses Historic Site and Archives visited Cooperstown on October 21 as part of the commemoration of the Second Company Bicentennial in New Haven, CT and Princeton Theological Seminary in Princeton, NJ. Fourteen members of a Second Company of missionaries left from New Haven in November 1822 on a whaling ship and arrived in the Sandwich Islands (Hawaiian Islands) in April 1823. Included in the group were the Rev. and Mrs. Charles Stewart, early residents of Cooperstown, and Betsy Stockton, a freed slave, of Princeton.



In Cooperstown, the museum group visited Lakewood Cemetery where the Stewarts and Betsy Stockton are buried. Rev. Stewart retired in 1862 after a distinguished career as a missionary and navy military chaplain and returned to Cooperstown, where he died in 1870.

Military Veterans Buried at Lakewood

During the summer, volunteers compiled an inventory of over 300 military veterans of all wars from the American Revolution to Desert Storm. Information includes birth/death dates, war, branch of service and rank, special notes. By next summer the inventory will be available in print at the Cemetery and the Cooperstown Veterans Club as well as digital. Stone Steps and Stairways

More stone steps in hazardous condition or encroaching on roadways were removed or repaired and cleaned. The largest project was the Field stairway on the south end of Lakeview Avenue which was disassembled and rebuilt.
