# My God, my God, what hast thou forsaken me?

#### **INTRODUCTION:**

- 1. Through the Eye of inspiration, David was guided to see the crucifixion of Jesus 1,000 before Jesus was ever born.
- 2. David not only saw Jesus being crucified, he also predicted in minute detail the events surrounding Jesus' death.
- 3. There is also no doubt that David, in one sense, is speaking of the trial of his own life.
- 4. We all, I would dare say, have felt that we are alone and forsaken!

#### **DISCUSSION:**

- 1. Neither forsaken, nor forgotten (vs. 1-5).
  - 1. No one can imagine the agony Jesus felt at this moment. He had spent the night in agony, shedding great drops of blood (Luke 22:44). Now, hanging on the cross, He feels that everyone had forsaken Him, even His heavenly Father.
  - 2. In verse three, Jesus appeals to the Father, the One Who lives in the praises of His people. He pleads with Him to hear, as He heard His people in the past.
- 2. But I am a worm, no man (vs. 6-10).
  - 1. Jesus, feeling the weight of being God's sin offering (2 Cor. 5:21), cries out I am a worm, and not a man.
  - 2. Jesus' despair becomes so great so that He remembers that He has trusted His Father from the very moment of His conception.
- 3. Times of trouble and desperation (vs. 11-18).
  - 1. As Jesus hangs on the cross, He is surrounded by an angry mob (Mat. 27).
  - 2. He becomes dehydrated from His former loss of blood in the garden, as well as, from the severe scourging (John 19:1).
  - 3. In a stark fulfillment of prophesy, the ones who crucified Him, gamble for His garments (Mat. 27:35).
- 4. Jesus calls for deliverance (vs. 19-21).
  - 1. He pleads with the Father to remain close to His side.
  - 2. He asks for deliverance from the dogs and lions attacking Him.
- 5. Praise and glory belong to God (vs. 22-24).
  - 1. In all of His anguish, Jesus still sings praises to God. What an example!
  - 2. God heard His pleas (v. 24).
- 6. The faithful remnant will always serve God (vs. 25-31).
