The Great Commission

In Matthew 28:18-20 we read, “**And Jesus came and spake unto them, saying, “All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth. Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world. Amen.”** Jesus makes it crystal clear that Christians have the responsibility to tell the whole world the whole Gospel. We need to tell the world that a Savior came, He died on the cross of Cavalry, and that He was resurrected on the third day. He did this to save sinful man.

The First Century church recognized this obligation and “**they...went everywhere preaching the word**” (Acts 8:4). Because of their great zeal to evangelize the world, Paul was able to write, “**If ye continue in the faith grounded and settled, and be not moved away from the hope of the gospel, which ye have heard, and which was preached to every creature which is under heaven; whereof I Paul am made a minister**” (Col. 1:23). Paul plainly declares the Gospel was preached to every creature under heaven. Some deny this; Paul still says it was done. If it can be done once, it can be done again.

We have been studying evangelism on Sunday evenings and we have mentioned that ultimately it is our responsibility to preach the Gospel to everyone.

Preaching the Gospel to the entire world involves three distinct, but related areas: Evangelism, Edification, and Benevolence. All three should be directed at seeking and saving the lost (Luke 19:10).

Evangelism is actually teaching people about Jesus Christ. As we go, Jesus said we are to teach people the Gospel (Matthew 28:19-20). Everyone is going, so while we are going; we should be teaching.

Edification involves building each other up in the most holy faith (Jude verse 20). This is done by teaching, exhortation, and comforting one another (1 Corinthians 14:3).

The goal of benevolence should always be to help people in their relationship with God. It should not simply be throwing money at people to soothe our conscience. It is designed by God to open doors of communication to bring people closer to God. The word benevolence actually means showing kindness to our fellow man. May God bless us in teaching the world the good news of Jesus Christ.
